- Personal Interview Evaluates Candidates on Qualities of – Focus, Clarity of Thought, Learnability, Ability to handle pressure, Decision making skills, Discipline and logical deduction,

### Prerequisite

- Form to be Submitted (Interview)
- Resume (not mentioned, good to carry)
- Original Documents along with photocopies

### Insights - Writing Ability Test

- Time Allotted is 10-30 minutes
- When given an abstract topic time allotted is less
- When given a specific topic for in-depth analysis time is given separately for ideation and writing

### Sample WAT Topics -

1. Women empowerment made a bad impression by looking at the question before they started the timer. They warned me not to look at that
2. Traditional way of learning (Rote learning and memorisation) vs modern way of learning (Activity based) and their merits did reasonably well.

### Insights - Interview

- Interview time - 20-30 Minutes. (Sometimes as low as 10 mins)
- Interview Panel Details - Only 3 people (Generally two Professor and One Alumni)
- Interview Type - Stress Interview (like Calcutta) (Detailed Interviews check your through knowledge of subjects and Current Affairs)

### Interview discussion Pointers – (as per IIMB experiences of last five years)

Be completely prepared with anything and everything from SOP and form.

They will go into details of everything you speak about in the interview. (level1- what do you know about Indian Economy level2- what do you think about GST, level3- how has GST affected the sector you work in).

They can ask basic current affairs (Indian economy, president, Kashmir Issue). Might ask about what you write in WAT Assessment

It is absolutely fine to ask for time before you answer (they often expect you to think about a solution when they ask you about a problem at hand).

It is fine if you are anxious and you need not portray a brave face being real with your emotions is better. Be prepared to answer everything about your work experience or about your favourite subjects if you are a fresher.

Morning slot

WAT Topic : a 34 year old man died due to marital harrasment done by his wife. Share your opinions in order to adress the problem and the actions that are beneficial for both the parties.

Interview duration: 30-35 minutes

There were two panelists:

P1: Why PGPBA?

P1: do you think strategy is only for long term?

P1: what is operations research. Why do we do optimization? Can you tell me exactly how to do that?

P1: what is objective function? Can profit as an objective function be maximized?

P1: write an example of a LPP problem

P1: draw the equation of line that you have mentioned in constraints.

P1: do you know what is derivative. If we do a differentiation of the linear function ( line equation) what it will be and what will it show?

P1: draw a parallel line to the line you have plotted.

P1: what will be the equation of the line parallel to it.

P1: will the answer of objective function be the same for all parallel equations.

( P1 stopped here and p2 started asking)

- What is your job role? (Cross questioning on that)
- Why are we running regression model? What is dependent variable? (Again, not accepting my answers but satisfied in end)
- What is western dance? What all dance forms? (I was part of dance society in UG)
- What do you want to do post MBA ? (Was asked twice by different professors in different words)
- What are the 3 challenges faced by women in corporate?
- How will you solve these issues as CEO? (Discussion on that and that most measures are already taken by companies)
- What all subjects I had in UG related to maths and coding? (Because I applied to BA also)
- They said IIM will not teach coding and I added I have worked on R and learnt on job
- They asked me to list subjects in PGPBA (fumbled a bit but was able to tell 3-4 things)
- Asked me which current affairs topic I was following, mentioned tariff war
- They asked to detail impact on India (no cross questions)

Overall, easy going and conversational

IIMB, 11th March, Delhi, Afternoon Slot

9/9/8, BTech CSE, 18months workex as a Financial Market Analyst

WAT: Something along the lines of rise in gig economy, freelance work and people are shifting towards it from traditional, office-work, day jobs. Is this actually sustainable in the long run.

10mins to think and notes and rough work.

20mins to write.

Panel 2, Sr No. 4

M1 - 30ish, M2 - 40ish

TL;DR: completely SOP based in my case, and cross-questioning on my answers.

Futures, Options, what are those?

What is the difference between them?

You deal with US Commodities?

What products? How do you strategize?

What factors do you take account of?

Suppose I'm an investor, what would you suggest my investment plan should be? Try my hands on these commodities FnO or in equity markets?

What else do you follow?

Geopolitical news? Local news?

Why is the Indian market on a downfall?

Why are FIIs pulling out?

Where are they going?

What are other markets?

(Tried to confuse me a lot with recent news, tried to make me believe that I'm going wrong or that I have no idea)

So, how you follow cricket? Before 1983 World Cup, BCCI used to be so poor? Now it's the richest, way too rich. What are the reasons? Don't say IPL.

Why was Champions Trophy started?

Who's your favourite cricketer?

Why Kane Williamson? He's just injured always.

(talked about his qualities, him being a true gentleman of the game)

Ah, you seem to like his philosophies. Why you took CAT? It's just a rat race at the end of the day. You should consider going into somewhere more on spiritual grounds.

(countered this)

Alright, that makes sense.

Okay thank you, you can go.

Wait, one more thing. Your spelling has an extra A, why is that? Is it an error or the actual spelling?(Told them the story)

See I told you, you have spiritual linkings, that's why I suggested going in that direction.

Thank you, you can leave.

(Shall I send the next one in?)

No no, thank you, we will call them.

Overall, I don't know what to make of it, honestly hahahaha. Not my job lol.

15-16 minutes. Conversational, lot of cross-questioning, and grilling. But they were smiling mostly, so I felt okay inside :)

## Interview Experience – 5

### IIM Bangalore transcript

Wat: Despite challenges like visa why do Indian students opt for foreign colleges, what is the problem with Indian education system and how can we work on it ( not exactly by word something in these lines)

P1 how I reached the location.

P1 you come from Batanagar I've not heard about it.

P1 India is a good copycat of things but they don't do anything new. I mentioned about a new research and then they asked say about something that has been in the limelight I said that I couldn't recall any specific tech and accepted that there is some resistance from adoption of new tech due to lack of funds somewhere

P2 I have mentioned about AI in your answer what is the greatest threat AI being, I mentioned about job

P2 don't you think trained AI could be used to wage war against countries, I said I've never thought in that direction but there will be counter measures that could be used which could have some AI in it. These kinds of questions went to and fro

P3 said do you think AI is a threat or an opportunity here I made a big statement

"Every threat comes with its opportunities, we should know how to create that" lots of counter questions as they were trying to change my answers

Some questions on workex regarding what I have done and lastly they asked if I want anything to know.

## Interview Experience – 6

**Date: 24-02-2024**

**City: Mumbai; 09:00am**

**Profile: Chemical Engineer with 3 years experience in Oil and Gas.**

### **WAT**

State the importance of mental health in today's competitive world. Should the importance of mental health be taught to school students at an early stage?

### **Personal Interview**

3 panelists:

P1, P2, P3

P3: What should we call you?

Me: You can call me Prajwal

P3: What does Prajwal mean? What have you done in your life that is enlightening and shining?

P1: You mentioned about getting an income from Cricket. Throw some light on it.

Me: I talked about content writing for Dream11.

P1: So is Dream11 legal or what?

Me: I said it can be considered as legalized gambling.

P1: So what would you do in this case? Would you stop it?

Me: The interviewer went pretty deep, I tried to explain as much as possible

P1: Okay so you're continuing with your engineering domain as a job. Tell me about the oil scenario, imports, exports, what's India planning? What about Reliance?

Me: I explained in detail

P1: Why did we vote against Russia if we're such good friends of theirs? How are India-Ukraine relations?

Me: I explained

P1: Okay. You have quite some experience in Oil and Gas. Why MBA now?

Me: I explained and interviewer seemed very satisfied

P2: What's your work like? What did you do in your 2 roles?

P2: What was the component during Bhopal Gas Tragedy? Name 3 chemicals that are important but dangerous. What about HCFs?

Me: I explained

P2: Does Mr. Mukesh know about everything that's going on in his kingdom? You want to become like him?

Me: I said yes, in terms of vision.

P2: People say he destroys everywhere he goes. Will you do the same?

Me: I explained that it is rather disruptive. I'll not destroy anything

P3: You worked for Reliance for 3 years. What's Reliance's growth strategy? Tell me straight to the point.

Me: I told

P3: Does Reliance work more based on ethical grounds or legal grounds?

Me: I couldn't explain properly but he was okay with the answer

P3: What's backward and forward integration? What's Reliance?

Me: I explained in detail

P3: Do you have any questions for us?

Me: I said no.

P1: We want you to take the cookie but it'll be a testament of your strength if you can open the jar.

Me: Opened before he finished saying.

P1: Great. You may leave.

## **Interview Experience – 7**

### **Profile: Eco Grad, UPSC Gap**

#### **Personal Interview**

P1: Why is there a gap?

Me: Told UPSC

P1: Why only 1 attempt then?

Me: I Mentioned entrepreneurship

P1: What idea do you have?

Me: I told about the agriculture sector

P1: What is the issue?

Me: The conversation then went all about the Indian agriculture sector (issue of productivity, missing middle, comparing it to china, germany, mechanization, land fragmentation, what should be done, etc)

P2: What's the issue with farmer protests? Why not legalize it? How would MSP distort the market?

P2: What about APMC, why not eliminate them? Why are farmers not getting enough money?

P1: Have you read behavior economics?

Me: No

P2: Have you read Development Economics?

Me: Yes

P2: What is the difference between normal economics & development economics?

Me: The interviewer was not satisfied with my answer.

P2: He mentioned 2-3 books in economics, if I have read them or followed any of them?

Me: No

P2: What have you read then?

Me: I told him I'm a UPSC aspirant, I am well read about politics, economy, social issues

P2: But you should have known all of these authors then. Anyways, what are you reading these days?

Me: I told him about the Shiva Trilogy by Amish Tripathi

P2: Why is mythology important? Why do we have to study it?

Me: Lots of cross questioning & conversation about the ill practices in Ramayan & how can they impart values, just read science maths etc. I remained steady with my point that mythology acts as a storyline which helps people impart moral values in children, there are definitely some ill practices which are not relevant today and authors like Amish are doing a great job in re-writing them according to modern times.

P2: Kept arguing his point that it is all irrelevant, but I remained firm that there are benefits & issues can be fixed by re-writing.

P2: Do you have any questions for us? Thank you & all the best!

### **Interview Experience – 8**

**Date:** 1st March, Noon slot, Delhi

**Profile:** IT Engg Fresher, 9/9/9

#### **WAT**

Direct tax base in India has increased more than double from 3.5 Cr to 7.6 Cr in the last 10 years.

Determine its economic significance alongside India's population making the country a global economic powerhouse.

Total Time: 30 mins, 10 for coming up with points and structure, 20 for writing on one ruled page (around 250 words)

#### **Personal Interview**

Summary: went on for about 25 minutes, two panelists, both male, one middle aged, one young (looked almost my age) alumni

No introductions from their side

After the usual greetings

M1: So, football?

Me: I said yes, I am enthusiastic about it, expecting a further question but it never came

M1: Tell me something that is not mentioned in my SOP in 2 minutes.

Me: I started answering and realized I had mentioned this point in my SOP (though just mentioned and not in detail) I changed my point after apologizing. They seemed satisfied with the second answer.

M1: Are you familiar with insurance companies?

Me: Not really, just a general idea.

M1: Explained the basics. You have two identical cars, I'm selling you a premium for 75k for each car while M2 is selling you a premium for 90k for the first car, and 50k for the subsequent second car. Why would M2's firm eat into my business?

Me: I answered only according to the info that was provided for insurance companies that it'll be more economical and I'll be saving 10k

M1: Are you sure? Think about it

Me: Thought about it and said unless I'm missing something, I'm positive.

M1: You're left handed like me, I'm holding a left handed cup, suppose I make 100k left handed cups in my factory out of which only 50% sell, if I get a contract for guaranteed sale of 50k right handed cups each year, would it make sense to invest in infra to start production of right handed cups.

Me: I answered that you don't need to invest in any infrastructure as a right handed cup is identical to a left handed cup, if it were a fridge door or those study arm chairs, we'd need to invest capital.

M1: Alright good, over to you M2.

M2(alumni): Suppose you're in the government and have 10k Cr, you have a choice to invest that in building infrastructure for railways either in the east of india or West india, given cost per km of rail is same, and assume there's no existing infrastructure in place, which one would you pick and why?

Me: I answered East, giving reasons of population, smoother terrain, making it easier to build tracks, west is relatively more developed in road transport and sea routes.

M2: What about the east and west coast?

Me: I answered east coast only as west coast was where the british landed centuries ago, comparatively their sea transport would be relatively more developed as compared to east.

M2: Suppose you own a restaurant here, your peak hours are 7-9 pm, 5 of your dishes are famous and equally in demand, there's always a queue during this time at your place, will you apply surge pricing (like Uber?)

Me: Said Yes, wanted to say stuff on demand and supply but hesitated as I wouldn't feel confident enough if they went too deep into economics. So just said that yeah, limited customers' increased pricing would offset each other, have limited inventory, and should focus on quality over quantity to preserve brand reputation.

M2: Should you increase the price of all the 5 dishes or choose 2 or 3 dishes only?

Me: Answered as they're all equally in demand, increasing prices of all dishes seems logical as people would deviate towards the comparatively cheaper dish in the case of dynamic pricing.

M2: Are you familiar with the concept of happy hours?

Me: Yes

M2: Would you rather have happy hours or Price surging during peak hours?

Me: Answered price surging reiterating limited customers, quality of service over quantity

M2: Alright

M1: Any questions for us?

Me: Asked them about the Software product management summit held last week by CSITM, IIMB they said yes that happened for more info, refer to our linkedin and website articles.

**Note:** Didn't ask anything about academics, why mba, what'd you do in college, current affairs etc. Just an experience of yours not in the SOP and case studies. (2 people with work ex had they interview around it, 1 with work ex had just case studies)

I wasn't really expecting case studies and have almost no experience in such questions too, so I felt like I'm in unexplored territory, but said whatever came to my mind. They weren't overtly expressive, just had a couple of "good"s and nods and when I fumbled initially about an experience not in my SOP, M1 said to not mention it and when I started thinking, he said smiling, can your life be summarized by this piece of paper? I started elaborating on a college POR to which he simply okay alright.

#### Interview Experience – 9

**Location:** Delhi - Habitat

**Date:** 07/03/2024 8AM

#### WAT

India FDI trade

250 words | 20 min

#### Personal Interview (22 Mins)

2 Panelists

It was super chill, conversational, laughing, there were Hindi references from movies and fun. Though extremely intense

P1: Did you have breakfast?

Me: No Sir I'll have it after this

P1: What if it was a 12PM Interview?

Me: I'd have had it. I will be traveling home to Dehradun after this, so will have it after this

P1: You have done so many interesting things, Howcome?

Me: Sir it all naturally came up to me, I grabbed the opportunity which came to me. Talked about my RJ stint, internships in order as he asked in detail. Some basic follow up questions were asked

P1: So you have done an internship at AAP?

Me: Told that I found it on LinkedIn, have been growing up seeing politics at home people talking and being involved. It was a PR Role

P1: Don't you think AAP only does PR & no work?

Me: I threw some data from a school video on an AAP Report card. Modestly wrapped it by saying, they do have a big mouth but have covered 70% of what they promised. Plus I talked about there school narrative etc

P1: What are three things you'd do on the ground if you had power?

Me: Education, talked for very long,

P1: They asked what were the problems and how'd I solve it

Me: Recently I got to know a leader of the center has 32 schools

P1: Stunned and disgusted

Me: I have done a lot of work in education as well, and told them about my experience at NIVH. Healthcare, talked about Scandinavian countries and how they have great healthcare.Obamacare, I told that I am not quite well read on it, but it's definitely better than India

P1: How are Scandinavian countries doing well in healthcare?

Me: Told that I am not quite sure on it, so would not like to comment it

P1: What about culture? Thats something Modiji is doing

Me: I absolutely love him for that. Not much discussion on it

P1: How'd you solve education?

Me: I told that I'd bring schools to a certain minimum standard, Will solve the Teachers to student ratio

P1: How would you arrange for funds?

Me: Will reduce corruption

P1: This was not done in the last 74 years.

Me: Will work on it slowly slowly. I gave reference to how Singapore solved it

P1: It is a very small city, so we can't replicate it?

Me: However we can take inspiration. There was a long discussion on it. I gave diplomatic answers. Cant increase taxes much, the government will collapse.

P2: How can we increase tax?

Me: I said it can be done through direct & indirect. I can explain that in detail if needed.

P2: No no you are an intelligent boy, I know you know that. But you said tax cant be increased, then how will you increase the government's revenue?

Me: Sir we can't take loan because of debt/GDP rising as earned by IMF

P2: No no how about through the tax rate itself?



Me: We also cant increase the population definitely, though fertility rate is below what it should be.

P2: How to calculate tax?

Me:  $\text{Income} * \% \text{tax}$

P2: How do you increase income?

Me: To increase per capita income, we need to increase GDP

$C + i + g + (x - m)$

P2: No no, income tax is  $\text{Income} * \text{tax \%}$

Me: Oh now I get where you were leading me towards. Sorry

P2: No worries, what will you do?

Me: Sir to increase tax payers, we need to increase digitisation across the country, have a cashless economy etc.

P2: No, it'll again come to that corruption loop. Tell me Something else. A lot of people evade tax bcz it is too complex to comply with. Lets put a fix 20% slab then? Think think

Me: Sir a lot of people may think that tax money is not being used properly. Hence they might be avoiding. They both started laughing

P1: You need to become Anil Kapoor like CM one day and convince people.

Me: We all laughed

P1: What's the cultural challenge in India?

Me: Sir the fundamental difference between India & China is the approach. Their system is like, if I may say in Hindi "bhai ne bola karne ka toh karne ka" whereas India mai it's like, kindly pardon my tone, "chal chal, baapko mat sikha" - bottoms up. Here govt knows we can throw them out

They started laughing badly

P1: Can we really throw out the government?

Me: That line is narrowing sadly by day. Sir we can atleast be pretentious & feel good about ourselves. But what you said I'd right for sure

P2: Great, we are done!

## Interview Experience – 10

**Profile: GEM 9/9/8 Mechanical Engineer, 3 years work experience in automotive sector**

P1:

Q1. Do you watch movies? If a movie was made about your life, what would you name it?

Me: I had not mentioned movies anywhere at all

Q2. Have you watched the movie Dunki? How is it relevant and what was it trying to convey?

Me: There was a long discussion on that

Q3. Have you watched 3 idiots? Which character do you aspire to be? Who do you think was more successful, Chatur or Rancho?

Me: No diplomatic answers

P2:

Q1. What macro economic factors are you aware of?

Q2. What is the break up of GDP contribution?

Q3. What was your work role, how do you address the customer needs, what are some improvements you've done?

P3:

Q1. What is the difference between torque and momentum? Give examples.

Q2. Where does momentum contribute in a 4 stroke engine?

**Summary:** Duration was around 25-30mins. Overall a very conversational interview although I was surprised with the starting, but probably because I was last in my panel.

## Interview Experience – 11

**Date:** 20th Feb 2024

**Location:** IIM B Campus

**Profile:** 9/9/8 BSc Chemistry, 14 months work experience

### WAT

IIT placement report for 2023 records highest salary packages of over 1 crore, but given the current slowdown in hiring and the impact it would have on students especially during this placement season, the institute is considering to refrain from disclosing the packages to students. How should the institute handle this situation

### Personal Interview

Panel - 2 male M1 and M2, 1 female F1

M1 and F1 : You're the last in the panel, so tell me what others told you?

Me: They all said it went well

M1: Did you ask what questions they were asked? What exactly did you say to all of them?

Me: No sir, I just asked how the interview went and casually engaged asking which state they belonged to and where they work etc

F1: Why didn't you ask what questions were asked to them?

Me: I preferred not to because that might make me nervous and I wanted to attend the interview without any expectations

M1: Introduce yourself

Me: I gave a well prepared answer, but they didn't catch on to any of the hooks I wanted them to

M1: What is your job role as a chemist, tell me exactly what you do in the industry?

Me: I Answered

M1: You're already doing a job related to what you had studied? Why MBA? We need more people in pure science.

Me: I answered

M1: You can do an MSc to get better roles and profile

Me: I answered, gave stats on how R&D isn't given a lot of priority here.

M1: What if everyone similarly leaves their science subjects and enters management?

Me: I answered saying I believe there will always be a balance, and give an example on how 80 percent of my class are pursuing MSc and very few opted for other options. M1 gave an unsatisfied look

M1: Okay let me give you a small business scenario and tell me how you would go about it.

There is a new 100 percent wheat bread brand that has developed their product and is looking to start selling, what would be the data they must collect. It was cut in between often by F1 and they kept adding conditions like there are no other brands available and that I should think the brand is looking to sell in Bangalore

They kept trying to help, but it was more of like adding conditions and I felt it was made even more difficult

Me: I was confused and answered saying a survey must be done on how many would opt for it over the normal white bread

M1: Good, so tell me how that would be done

Me: I tried but couldn't give a satisfactory right answer

F1: Okay tell me about the venture you would like to start and follow up questions

Me: Answered

F1: How would your knowledge in chemistry help?

Me: Answered

F1: Do you follow any business news?

M: Answered saying Yes ma'am, I know the news about Paytm & ByJu's

F1: I have been tired of hearing those, but anyways pick one you know very well

Me: I chose PAYTM. There were follow up questions on KYC and Axis Bank and then asked for the types of banks I know. Then asked about RBI and role. Tried answering to the best of my knowledge

Me: I answered, but cut off while answering the third

M2: I was asked about a term related to capital which I don't recollect

Me: I said I'm sorry sir, I don't know

M2: Okay I'm done

M1 and F1: thank you , All the best

Overall the panel was chill with everyone who was interviewed. They were smiling throughout and couldn't really gauge whether they were satisfied or not with my answers. But they caught me on words I used and asked me the meanings and checked whether I really knew about them. No questions around my hobbies or achievements mentioned in the SOP/ Tell Me About Yourself or academics and seemed like they wanted to test my knowledge in business.

I wrote it nicely and completed it in 15 min and read again for any grammatical mistakes. After that we were told to collect it and submit that to him and leave the room. The Prof was one of the panelists.

## Interview

It was a very balanced and smooth interview, hardly any grilling (which was strange because the guy just before me came out in the state of shock)

### Panelists: One Prof (P1) and one alumnus (P2)

**P1:** So, you're a science student? (God knows why their sheet said I was from science)

**P1:** So, why finance? Why such a niche course?

<gave my reasons, talked about my family, my Father is a Chartered Accountant and how I developed an interest in the field>

This was followed by some questions about Investment Banking

Now, the real interview starts:

**P1:** Have you been following the recent debate about policy rates?

**Me:** \*Explained the economic and global factors like recession, CPI, Inflation.

**P1:** Do you know what interest rate parity is?

**Me:** <Explained Covered and uncovered interest rate parity>

**P1:** CAPM?

**Me:** <Wrote the equation of the Capital Asset Pricing Model (CAPM)>

Expected return = Risk free rate of return + Beta (Market return – Risk free rate of return)

**P1:** What is Beta in this equation?

**Me:** <Beta is the measure of Systematic risk of the stock, higher the Beta, higher is the risk. Beta is dependent on the Covariance of the security return with the Market return.>

**P1:** Formula for calculating Beta?

**Me:**  $\beta = \frac{\text{Covariance of Stock return with Market return}}{\text{Variance of Market return}}$

**P1:** What factors do you think are used to calculate Beta?

**Me:** I think it is calculated using the market variance and the variance of the stock we are calculating the Beta of. <P1 looked satisfied>

**P1:** Is Beta used anywhere else? Any other application?

**Me:** \*This is what they think of me now </3\*

Yes, sir. It's used in Regression. <Explained single and multiple regression and the relevance of Beta in a desperate attempt to save my interview>

**P2:** Alright, What's the full form of RK Puram? (Cus my school is DPS RK Puram)

**Me:** Rama Krishna Puram

**P2:** Why?

**Me:** Named after Lord Rama and Lord Krishna probably?

Three panelists

1 Male (Alumni, I presume) – **P3**

Myself – **M**

**P3** comes out and calls me in. On the way he tells me “Don’t be nervous and give your best”

I enter (meanwhile I looked at my watch to note the time).

**P1** notices this. Upon entering they ask me to be seated.

**P1** – Jyoti, take a seat. We noticed you looked at your watch. Why?

**M** – Yes mam that was to just make a note of the time.

**P2** – But we told you that the length of the interview doesn’t matter at all, no matter what the coaching institutes say (grinning)

**P2** was all smiles the whole interview which had a calming effect on me. I mean all of them were very calm and weren’t trying to stress me out.

**P2** – Are you following any news? Business developments, economic news? Have you heard about G20? Are you following it? What’s the use of it?

**M** – Yes sir, but not in detail. (Told him a little about G20)

**Overall Experience:** The most stressful of all the IIM Interviews for me. It was a roller coaster ride with highs and lows. After the interview I felt very exhausted and was questioning my chances. But clinged on to the positives. Do have a read to know what actually transpired across the four walls .

**Panel:** There were 3 members ( all Males ). One of the prof in Pyjamas was in his 40s and who **grilled and interrupted** most of the time. Lets call him **G**. Another prof in his 50s was mostly **observing** me closely and asked few questions. Lets call him **O**. Another guy in his 30s, was probably an **alumni of IIM-B** who also asked few questions and was a bit gentle among the three. Lets call him **A**. Myself will be **K**.

Fasten you belts for the myriad of emotions in my head denoted by ().

**O** comes out and call me in. After brief exchange of pleasantries.

**G:** So Karthikeyan when did you reach here.

**K:** Sir, I am based in Mumbai currently.

**O:** But you have mentioned Offshore.

**K:** Yes sir, I had been to offshore last year on May & June for 42 days at Saudi Arabia in Persian Gulf. After which I was allocated to another project which is in Design phase. Since design office is in Mumbai, I am currently in my base location Mumbai.

**O:** Okay

**G:** Okay Karthik, you have been brought up in Tambaram? ( He must have seen it in my mailing address )

**K:** Sir, recently only we moved to Tambaram.

**G:** Okay where have you been brought up during most of your schooling ?

**K:** At K.K.Nagar sir in Chennai.

**G:** You mean the posh areas near Ashok Nagar, right ?

**K:** Yes sir (I guessed he must be a Chennaite)

**G:** Have you ever tried to climb the Ashok Pillar ?

**K:** (Surprised, as the pillar is just a cylinder with Ashoka Chakra at the Top) No sir

**G:** Why ?

**K:** I didn't feel the need to. He quickly moved on.

**G:** Which schools you studied in Chennai ?

**K:** From 9th to 12th it was Maharishi Vidya Mandir Senior Secondary School, CBSE Medium ( Was a bit nervous )

**G:** Medium or Board ?

**K:** Sir, English Medium in CBSE board ( Felt a bit embarrassed for the initial mistake )

**G:** Okay, smiles

**K:** Sir, from 4th to 8th I studied in Velankani Matriculation School at Ashok Nagar.

**G:** He quickly moved on, Okay tell me 3 differences you observed between Mumbai and Chennai ?

**K:** ( Thought to keep it simple and honest )

1. Mumbai is a bit fast paced, I can see that in terms of shopkeepers giving the change swiftly and aspirational people. He asked if in Chennai is it not like that, I told in Chennai also it's there but not as pronounced as here in Mumbai.
2. Green cover in Mumbai is very less when compared to Chennai
3. Population density in Mumbai is more, wherever I go I see a sea of people, He asked if it's good, I told No sir, it isn't considering there are fires happening oftenly. He noted down some points on his evaluation sheet.

**G:** So you have worked in Project Management right, tell me what you do ?

**K:** Sir, it involves planning ( immediately was cut short )

**G:** Okay lets talk about planning, Tell me how do you plan the project ?

**K:** Sir, first the no of activities are listed out which are then mapped against time taken , was cut short

**G:** See, I already had interviewed a guy from L&T, I want a Technical answer, This is what you guys do right ! ( The tone was stern and I was paralyzed )

**K:** Was taken aback as my work didn't directly involve planning, looked down on paper and thought for a moment, then **A** told me, its okay just ensure that you incorporate all the elements. I said, after listing down the activities, they are mapped against the number of days required for completion. But was cut short...

**G:** Work Breakdown structure ?

**K:** Oh yes sir, It is ( Me thinking in the back of my head, hopefully this doesn't get worse )

**G:** Apart from No of days, What else are mapped ?

**K:** Sir, the manpower required.

**G:** In a firmer tone, Okay okay what else?

**K:** ( I felt he was pushing and scaring me too much ) Sir, materials are mapped

**G:** Okay okay, there is one more, You are missing that,Tell me what it is ?

**K:** Thought for a while, couldn't recollect ( Cursing myself for mentioning planning, wanted the work exp part to get over with soon )

**G:** The people assigned to the task ?

**K:** Oh yes sir, A scope spilt matrix is prepared and the responsibilities are allocated.

**G:** Do projects go as per you have planned ?

**K:** No sir, sometimes not

**G:** Oh is your Planning isn't good enough ?

**K:** Sir, not like that, there are Force majeure incidents like for example while working in Oman in December 2017, there were floods for 5 days and whole Yard was shut.

**G:** Oh yeah Force majeure events are there but tell me in General any other reasons or ways to improve Planning ?



**K:** ( Patting myself for mentioning Force Majeure ) Sir, in another case the client's visit was delayed unexpectedly, hence it lead to delays.

**G:** How about Micro planning ?

**K:** Oh yes sir, the more we do planning at the micro level, it leads to better results. ( Meanwhile G was noting down some points )

**G:** Weren't you involved in Planning ?

**K:** No sir, It was done by Project Controls Team, I was a part of the Project Management Team.

**G:** So tell me what is Project Management ?

**K:** Sir, Project Management is the Initiating, Planning, Executing, Controlling and Closing of the whole project. One of the key jobs of a Project Engineer is to ensure the learnings of the previous project are implemented in the current project as a project engineer is involved through the entire cycle of the project. Wanted to continue but he cut short.

**G:** What else did you do ?

**K:** Sir, in my first project, I was the Project Engineer for HVAC (Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning ) systems. I was involved in the Construction, Installation and Commissioning of these systems. Again cut short....

**G:** But before construction you will have to procure right?

**K:** Yes sir, but I was not involved in procurement, I joined during the construction phase.

**G:** Oh okay, continue

**K:** Sir, during the construction phase I was involved in the Monitoring and Execution of HVAC systems for Tie-In Offshore platforms. I also handled independent responsibilities (again cut short )

**G:** What software you used for Monitoring the project?

**K:** I used Excel only sir.

**G:** He asked if I used some specific software

**K:** I said no

**G:** Okay lets talk about academics, You have done a specific course in Automobile Engineering, There is also a automobile lab course you have done. How old is the lab.

**K:** Sir, its actually very old. Its located behind the Mechanical department.

**G:** Looked at **A** and said it must be very Old. Both of them burst out laughing. At this moment I knew this is going to be a serious stress interview, I maintained my calm, occasionally smiled and defended myself.

**K:** Okay, can I ask you about Automobile Engineering?

**K:** Sir, I have studied it 3 years back, but I am willing to give it a try.

**G:** Okay lets start with the basics. What is  $dy/dt$

**K:** Sir, Its the rate of change of variable  $y$  w.r.t variable  $t$ .

**G:** Okay, tell me in Mechanical terms.

**K:** If  $y$  is distance its speed and if  $y$  is displacement its velocity. (Said it quickly)

**G:** ( He smiles and I too) Okay, okay, Leave scalars Lets talk about Vectors, What is  $d^2y/dt^2$  ?

**K:** Sir its acceleration.

**G:** Do you know whats  $d^3y/dt^3$  ?

**K:** (Eureka moment) Sir, I remember studying it in College, but I am not very sure, Can I take an educated guess?

**G:** (Smiling) Yeah yeah, Go on...

**K:** Sir its Jerk

**G:** Okay yes its Jerk, Now tell me which component in automobile is designed using Jerk ?

**K:** (I was totally taken aback, for I had prepared basic automobile Engineering and I considered answering Jerk itself a big thing, to top that now how do I figure out this design component) I asked to excuse myself to use the paper as it becomes easier to think looking at paper rather than the Interviewers.

**G:** Take your time, You are the last person, The 8th guy hasn't come. So we have all day.

**K:** (I knew he was trying to stress me out, Had a smile in my face, **O** looked at me and smiled too) But I had zero clue for the answer, Didn't know where to start, Scribbled something, then **G** gave a clue.

**G:** Think about the graph of  $d^2y/dt^2$ , draw it if you want.

**K:** Immediately assumed a function of  $y$  w.r.t  $t$  and drew the graph. Was actually swift because it was easy. Then **A** clarified its a clue and try to answer the Component. **PI:**

There were three male professors in the panel. I will be referring to them as P1, P2 and P3.

Me: Good afternoon, Sir!

P2: Good afternoon. Show me your id proof.

Me: Showed him.

P2: Ok.

P1: Do you know CAD?

Me: Yes, sir.

P1: What is the full form?

Me: Computer-aided design, sir.

P1: Asks a few more questions on CAD. I was able to answer most of them. The professor offered a few hints when I was unable to answer a question. Then he moved on to the next topic. What is the inverse of a matrix?

Me: Told him

P1: Asks a few follow-up questions. I was able to answer all of them. He seemed satisfied. I'm done, Ashutosh.

Me: Thank you, sir.

P2: Did you sit for placements?

Me: Yes, sir. Told him where I got placed.

## Interview Experience – 19

**Date : 27 February 2023**

**My Profile: Mechanical Engineering (CEG, Anna University) with 2yrs workex (Voltas), 10th - 96.8, 12th - 98.25, BE - 87.5. CAT %ile - 98.31.**

Got calls from all IIMs.

This was my fourth interview after SPJ, Lucknow and XLRI.

**Interview:**

They had my SOP with them. And IIM Bangalore gives a huge weightage to SOP in their PI round.



The female prof saw me waiting outside the hall at 12:30 pm during morning slot. I went a little early to the hall. My interview was in the afternoon slot and I was the seventh one to go. The time was around 4 pm.

**Panel-** Good evening! You should've been waiting for so long. Did you have your lunch?

**Me-** No mam. But I had some juice.

**P-** (they had some snacks on the table and offered me some)

**Me-** I told no thanks and we proceeded to the interview. They really made me feel very comfortable.

**P-** You've started your SOP with a quote. Tell me something about the person who wrote the quote.

The quote was - "Everyone you'll ever meet knows something you don't" by Bill Nye.

**Me-** I told about him. He was an American television show presenter known for his show - "Bill Nye The science guy".

**P-** Did anyone advise you to start your SOP with a quote?

**Me-** Yes, sir. My seniors advised me to do so. Also, I feel that it'd be easier to get an overview about me with just a sentence.

**P-** Tell me about your job. You're into sales, right. It must be an interesting job. How is your average day of work?

**Me-** Yes, sir. It is interesting and also thrilling because everyday you get to win or lose a project. Also, you get to meet different people from various fields.

**P-** You've been working for two years. You must have some sales targets and how are you achieving them?

**Me-** I told them that for the first year since I was working as a GET, I didn't have actual targets but for the last six months I had targets and I managed to achieve them. Also explained them about my location and how I landed on the sales role.

**P-** How's your salary? Is it fixed or variable? What about bonuses?

**Me-** Answered. Fixed salary but bonuses are given at the end of financial year depending on our target achievements.

**P-** Do you think for people working in sales, salary should be dependent only on their performance and not fixed?

**Me-** No, sir. Because there are few months where you can't achieve your targets and few months where you'll over achieve. So, it's better to have a fixed salary every month and a bonus based on the performance calculated quarterly or half yearly.

**P-** What products do you handle? Which part of sales you're in? Products or services? Which contribute more to the revenue?

**Me-** Commercial air conditioning products - VRF and ductables. I told them about the current market and how competitive it is now. So most projects are taken with lesser margins so it is services which contribute more to revenue.

**P-** What are the disadvantages of VRF?

**Me-** Answered.

**P-** Who are your customers?

**Me-** Primarily my dealers and channel partners. Also, consultants and architects are my customers because most of the projects come through them. In some cases, I'll have to deal with the end customer directly.

**P-** What is your organisation structure?

**Me-** Explained them about my company's structure and escalation matrix.

**P-** Consider a situation where there is a project for which you have quoted and another salesman has also quoted for it. How do you handle such a situation?

**Me-** This situation can be easily resolved because each salesman is allocated his own region and customers. If there is an overlap priority will be given to the one who's handling that particular region. But, the problem arises when two dealers quote for a same project. Because, I can't support one dealer and ignore another. I usually handle this by giving priority to the one who has been following up for the project for a longer time.

**P-** Do you think is it okay to over-promise a customer while making a sale? For example, a product has been launched recently and you have made a sale by committing to a delivery time. But you couldn't deliver it on time due to some issues.

(I actually laughed after hearing this question because this exactly happened to me in my job few months back)

**Me-** I told them that in sales you should never over-promise because I've suffered enough once and lost a customer due to this. It is okay to commit to a longer delivery time and delivering them earlier rather than promising a quicker delivery date and not able to deliver on time.

**P-** So after MBA in which field/role do you want to work?

**Me-** I don't have anything particular in my mind. I just want to learn and explore more opportunities. But I really liked working in sales so if to choose a particular field, it'd be marketing.

**P-** Thank you. Have a nice day

**Me-** Greeted them and left.

I was really surprised because there were no questions related to my academics or current affairs. It was just about my job and the statement of purpose.

**Verdict- Converted.**

**P2-** (Looking at P1) If there's something of that sort, why would he tell you?

(Awkward Silence, I was smiling)

**P1-** You have mentioned 3 points of 'inflection' (stresses on it) in your SoP (Statement of Purpose). You must be good at Maths. First being (scrolls on the laptop) Harvard US India Initiative (HUII). Did you go to Harvard University for this?

**Me:** Talked about how most of the learning at the IITs happen outside the classroom and that's how I was able to build my skills in the analytics domain. It's not really necessary for a student to contribute in the same branch that they studied in undergrad.

**P1:** What will happen once you come to an IIM then? Will you ditch the course curriculum for "out-of-classroom" learning?

**Me:** No sir, the courses taught during MBA impart the necessary skills for you to thrive in the corporate world and are very relevant to the industry, unlike the B.Tech curriculum.

**P1:** Ok. Can you talk about some computer vision use cases using ML in finance or manufacturing?

**Me:** Talked about using deep learning for handwritten OCR in financial institutions and automatic detection of product defects in manufacturing.

P1 was satisfied, and P2 took over.

**P2:** Companies like Flipkart and Tesla don't produce huge profits, but they are still very valuable. Why do you think that's the case?

**Me:** (after thinking for some time) They have captured a huge market share and built a solid customer base. Additionally, they have also succeeded in marketing their respective brands. Investors would always value a company based on the return that they get while selling their stake. Maybe they see a lot of potential business growth in these companies, so they are valued highly.

**P2:** Okay. Next, imagine you're a CEO and the previous CEO of your company was fired for corruption. As the next CEO, what would be your first steps?

**Me:** I fumbled big time while answering this. I talked about setting up an internal committee to identify the reasons and audit any future transactions. I know it sounds stupid, but this was the first time I felt just a hint of nervousness in the entire interview.

**P2:** (thankfully, he moved on) How do you keep yourself updated with the latest happenings in the tech world?

**Me:** I don't follow any particular source sir, my Google News feed takes care of it. (P2 smiles) At times, I read AI news, The Verge etc

**P2:** So apart from your project, can you talk about any other application of computer vision in the healthcare domain?

**Me:** Talked about Brain Tumor Segmentation

**P2:** Okay, I'm done.

P3, who was smiling throughout the whole thing, then took over.

**P3:** Most of the questions have already been asked, but I would like you to talk a little more on the CEO question (oops!) Setting up an internal committee? Will that really be your first step?

**Me:** (after half a minute of thinking in vain) Sir, since the image of the company may have been tarnished, I would also put out an official communication to the shareholders to assure them that this wouldn't happen again and all necessary action has been taken.

**P3:** (not satisfied, but still smiling) Can you think of something else?

**Me:** (in a last minute attempt to salvage the whole thing) Sir, I don't know why, but I'm not able to think of anything else right now. (insert cold sweat emoji)

## **Interview Experience – 25**

**Date & Time: 02 March 2023, 02:30 PM**

**Profile: Xth: 94%; XIIth: 97%; Grad: 9 CGPA ; CAT: 99.83 (first attempt)**

**WAT Topic:** A case to evaluate the correctness of a decision taken by the LEGO board to fire the Chief Operations Officer for introducing a product based on the Harry Potter theme, that was not really in line with what the company had been doing all these years.

**Duration:** Approximately 40 minutes

I was second in my panel, meaning that I got just enough time to straighten myself after the WAT when I was called in. There were two panelists—let's say P1 and P2.

**P1:** So, you are a final year IDD student. Surely you must have a project you are working on?

**I:** Yes Sir, I am working on a project that aims to increase the robustness of the Speech Recognition systems that we use in our day to day life.

**P1:** And how do you plan on doing that?

**I:** Most of the systems presently in use, like S-Voice, Siri etc. falter a lot when it comes to recognizing speech in noisy conditions. I, for one, can never get my S-Voice to work on a train. So, we try to incorporate the video component into the audio one so that both can be used to get a better outcome. My research, in particular, is based on reducing the errors that changes in a person's pose bring about to the video component.

**P1:** How much difference do you think it makes? Introducing the video as well? Is it worth the costs involved?

**I:** Sir, it does make a lot of difference, especially when it comes to speech recognition in noisy conditions. Technically speaking, introducing video increases the signal strength by somewhere around 8-10 dB, which is too huge a difference.

**P1:** So, if I am sitting facing my webcam, how will your system recognize what I say? Do you take the whole face?

**I:** No sir, we basically just consider the lip and jaw region to study the spoken word. The first step in the design of any such software is to segregate the lip region and construct a model out of the features. Most of the time, it is a Hidden Markov Model with a probabilistic outcome determination using the Viterbi algorithm.

**P2**(who was just listening all this while) : But, how do you plan on handling that pose thing?

**I:** (frankly, I hadn't done this part of the project yet, so I knew just some theoretical background and nothing else) Sir, most of the research till now has just solved this problem by means of a regression matrix wherein the side pose is interpolated onto the frontal one to normalize the views and cover up on the missing links. (I still don't know why I said "interpolated")

**P2:** Interpolated? (Passing a paper to me) Can you explain the mathematics?

**I:** (should have said I don't know much about it, decided to go ahead with what I knew anyway, probably a low point in my interview) Sir, for instance, if the frontal region of the lip is given and the side pose, we construct two matrices based on the appearance-based models that we draw out of the lips and then we have to find out the regression matrix averaged over a series of subjects. (drew two lips on the paper and wrote the matrix equation)

**P2:** What is in these matrices?

**I:** Sir, it is the pixel values for the seven strategic points on the lips that we use to demarcate the boundaries.

**P2:** I don't get it. Okay, you have a matrix, you have all these equations and models. But, how are you going to get the pixels?

**I:** Sir, we have algorithms to mark the boundaries of the lips, including the crossbow structure and extremities. I have used one of those algorithms itself that use the hue and luminance to get the lip boundaries.

**P2:** But lips are so different across geographies. How do you plan on handling that?

**I:** I agree that people from different ethnicities have different lip structures and colors. But the algorithms that we use focus on the difference in the color of the skin and the lips, which works fine across the different ethnicities.

**P2:** Can it be used commercially? This project of yours?

**I:** Sir, though I am now working on a limited vocabulary based system, but it can of course be scaled up to create a vast database across different phones and consequently, the words as well.

**P2:** You mean if I say "apple", your software would not even recognize it? What good is it then?

**I:** Sir, every research begins with the most basic of problems that need to be solved in order to create a system that is free from every kind of error that an end user may experience. And, in any case, this project, in its present state, can be scaled up to incorporate different phoneme combinations.

**P1:** You know, I still didn't get that equation of yours? Explain again.

**I:** (not this again!! I explained it the same way as before, but I think that he saw through the fact that my knowledge on this part was limited)

**P1:** Have you actually implemented this pose problem?

**I:** No Sir, I still have not. I know the theory and the models on which it works, but I have not implemented it in code form yet.

**P1:** Okay. Tell me what else do you do?

**I:** (Phew!!) Sir, I have been a freelance writer for a US-based virtual assistance firm since 2014.

**P1:** What do you write?

**I:** Initially, I did projects for the firm itself, based on medical virtual assistance, virtual offices etc..But, now, in addition to that, I have also started writing health and lifestyle blogs for a client of theirs.

**P1:** Do they pay you? How much?

**I:** Yes Sir, they do.

**P1:** And what else do you like to do when you are free?

**I:** Sir, I am a very avid reader. And by that I mean, I like to read everything, right from something like "Confessions of a Shopaholic" to something along the lines of "Fortune at the Bottom of the Pyramid". And I am a Kathak dancer as well.

**P1:** Can you tell me how many gharanas are there in Kathak? And who are their major exponents?

**I:** Told

**P1:** What is the difference between these gharanas?

**I:** Told

**P1:** What is the latest book that you have read?

**I:** Sir, I have read ISIS: Inside the Army of Terror by Michael Weiss and Hassan Hassan

It was 5:10PM that I was called in. Me patiently waiting for that moment, entered the room and greeted the panelists P1(I think he is the prof in the age group of 60+) and P2( He was young, might be an alumnus, of age around 35 years).

**P1:** Before we start why don't you just give a brief introduction about yourself?

**Me:** Gave a brief introduction about my acads, extra curriculars, interests and all.

**\*P1** in the meantime goes through my application form\*

**P1:** So Nayan, you come from Telangana. Why was the bifurcation done? Reasons behind it?

**Me:** As I follow current affairs and knew in detail, I gave every reason and sequence of incidents from 1953 to 2014.

**\*Both the panelists were convinced\***

**P1:** So do you support the bifurcation?

**Me:** As such I don't have any opinion, but my father supports it.

**P1:** Then what were you doing during the agitation that was going on in Telangana.

**Me:** Sir I was preparing for JEE.

**\*P2 grins\***

**P2:** You are an electrical engineer?

**Me:** Yes sir, electrical engineer with major in VLSI.

**P2:** What is VLSI?

**Me:** Very Large Scale Integration sir.

\*I was expecting them to shoot questions related to VLSI\*

**P1:** What all other courses you have done other than VLSI?

**Me:** Sir, other than that in our first two years we get exposed to core courses of electrical engineering like communication, power...

\*The instant I said power, both the panelists became active and started rapid fire on me\*

**P2:** Which supply do we get to our homes? AC/DC.

\*Me thinking what a silly question\*

**Me:** AC

**P1:** Is DC used anywhere?

**Me:** Yes sir, for very short distance transmission.

**P1:** What is the total generating capacity of India?

**Me:** Around 230GW.

**P2:** What is the deficit then?

\*Fuck this is not given in wikipedia page anywhere\*

**Me:** Sir, still more than 20k villages are not electrified, so we can't estimate the deficit. (Trying to cover up)

## Interview

Two panellists, say P1 and P2. Both in their 30s. P1's a typical prof, P2 is dressed in a hoodie, seems evil smart, and has a piercing gaze.

I take my seat.

**P1:** Why are you carrying your folder with you?

**Me:** I thought you might want to flip through my certificates

**P1:** No we're more interested in you.

**P2:** So, you studied at DPS RK Puram? Why that school? Why not some other, say DPS Mathura Road?

I was so taken aback by this, simply because I had previously studied at DPS Mathura Road and then switched to RKP.

**Me:** Sir, I've actually studied at both these schools, and switched to RKP later.

**P2:** Why? You think Mathura Road isn't good enough for you?

**Me:** No sir, both schools have shaped me into what I am today. But I thought RKP might be better, and besides my sister also studied there.

**P2:** So what? How does that make a difference?

**Me:** It does a bit. It was a collective decision, I mean my parents, I all of us sat together...

**Experience:**

The reporting time of my interview was 1:15. I reached half an hour before to explore the Hotel 😊. But most of the people were already there. The atmosphere was intense and it was drop dead silence. Nobody was talking and everyone was busy arranging the photocopies of their documents. The hotel was amazing and I was feeling out of place. The only thing going on in my mind was “ I don't belong here”, “This is not for me” etc. This place was making me nervous.

Adding to this nervousness was the fact that I forgot to keep my Aadhar card photocopy ( I am stupid 😂😂). I came back to the hall and found that people have started talking now. There were 7 people in my panel, 3 from ISM Dhanbad, 1 from IIT Kharagpur, 1 from St. Xavier's Kolkata (I don't know about the last one). Being an engineer, ice breaking was easy. Out of the seven, last four were Freshers and the first three were experienced. I was the last one in my panel. ( I knew that something different is going to happen to me)

**AWT:**

The argument was something on the lines of technology destroying creativity among children. (I know it's an easy topic but still couldn't give my best)



**PI:**

The first three guys were called up and taken to the interview rooms. Rest four of us started talking about their previous interviews and why do they want Ahmedabad etc.

The first guy comes out. He tells us that the interview revolved around his work ex and some concepts of mechanical engineering ( I too was a mechanical engineer). He told us that his interview didn't go as planned and that he will not be selected. ( How can somebody be so sure)

The second guy goes in and comes out within 10 minutes. Didn't talk to us and went away.

The third guy was inside the room for 45 minutes. We all were pretty sure that his interview was going good. But when he came out, we saw him teary eyed. He was asking for water, so one of us gave him some. While he was drinking and still trying to calm himself down, the panelist came out and screamed,

“ Get out of here. I don't ever want to see you face in my life!!”

Everyone was stunned.

Pin drop silence.

The guy went crying.

All of us were shaking. How can something like this happen in an IIM Ahmedabad interview? Was he testing us? Or was that for real?

The next guy went in. His interview was short. He came out with tears in his eyes ( 2 out of two). The panelists told him not to talk with other interviewees. But I took him downstairs and talked to him. “ Poora engineering Ka hi pooch rhe hai. Confuse Kar rhe hai fir taane maar rhe hai”.

I came back. The fifth one was already in. We could hear the panelist screaming. “ How can you not know what semi permeable membrane is??” ( Related to osmosis). His interview lasted for about 15 minutes. He came out, the next guy went in and I talked to this guy. “ Core pooch rhe hai. Baaki sab toh theek hai.” He was not crying but was shaking. ( Two out of three)

I was the last guy in the corridor and was very anxious seeing 2 people crying after the interview. It was the first time I was seeing people cry in an IIM interview.

The sixth guy came out, tears again. ( Oo shit I am going to cry too). My shoulders were down. I was scared.

It had been 5 minutes after the last guy and they still haven't called me. Should I knock? Have they forgotten about me? Is this again a test? Why is this happening...

Another 5 minutes and I am biting my nails now. I heard the sound of washroom flush. I relaxed. It was just because he was in the washroom. No test.

The panelist came outside, called me in, asked me to sit.

Two panelists, both of them had an iPad with them with my forms opened.

P2( The bad cop) : You have an excellent graduation GPA. 9.38.

Me: It's 9.41 now. That was upto 6th semester only.

P2: 9.87 in third semester and 9.86 in fourth, who were the teachers who didn't give you an A+ for complete 10.

Me: In third semester, it was two labs in which I got an A and in fourth semester, one subject named “Dynamics of machines”.

P1( the good cop): Amazing. Just two labs with A and A+ in all theory subjects.

Me: yes sir (smiling)

P2: why has your GPA fallen to 9.07 in 5th semester?

After document verification, we were taken to the interview room for the AWT. There were two panelists, **P1** and **P2** (both male), they gave the instructions and we began writing. The question was (non-verbatim) -

“IITians are offered subsidy for their education and it is taxpayers’ money. They end up taking management jobs and hence it is a wasteful expenditure on them. Write the claim of the author, whether you agree or not and why?”

Please note that there’s no correct answer to such questions. So, it’s hard to say how I performed, but I explained my stand and gave logical reasons to back it.

After the AWT, we were asked to wait in the hall for our turn. I was the **7th** person (out of 8) to be interviewed in my panel. When the **6th** person came out, he looked shocked. I asked him how it went and he said, “They’re grilling”.

My turn came at 4:00 PM.

**P2** came out and announced my name. I followed him to the interview room, which was very spacious, so I had a long walk inside, smiling at **P1**.

I greeted them and they asked me to have a seat.

**P2** - So, Shweta, why don’t you introduce yourself first?

**S** - (I had a folder of documents with me along with 2 CVs prepared) Sure Sir. While I do that, would you like to have a look at my CV?

(P1 and P2 together)

**P2** - Sure! **P1** - No, we have your form.

(they looked at each other and P2 said, it's okay, start with your intro)

**S** - (I said something semi-prepared) where I was born and brought up, how I helped my maternal uncle with his general store sales as a child, which lead to my interest in studying customer behavior.

(interrupted)

**P2** - I'm sorry, how old were you then?

**S** - about 11, Sir.

**P2** - (surprised) and how did you help?

**S** - (smiling) It was very primitive, I loved to come up with promotional offers, which attracted customers and since he's a retailer, there's a lot of competition in the market. So, I helped during the festive seasons. (P1 smiling for a reason I find out later)

**P2** - (nodding) Okay, go on.

**S** - then I talked about my choice of commerce, extra-curricular participation in school and how B Com (H) as a subject has given me a holistic view of business.

**P2** - How has B Com (H) given you a holistic view?

**S** - explained how the curriculum introduces all functions of a business - finance, accounting, HR, marketing, etc. and how my internships have offered the opportunity to experience them all.

**P2** - (nodding) Go on.

**S** - talked about my interest in marketing and advertising, how it started, the extent to which I like it.. (was flowing with emotions and ended up saying) Sir, you must have gone through my form, it might have seemed that I want to pursue finance, but that's not the case. I want to learn more about marketing.

**P2** - (some cross-questioning on marketing)

**S** - (answered all the questions with enthusiasm, real life examples and a smile on my face as if I'm living a dream)

[Now, the grilling part begins. P1 takes over]

**P1** - So, you mentioned that your maternal uncle is a retailer and faces competition, what kind of a market does he operate in, in context of economics?

**S** - (thinking) umm, Perfect Competition.

**P1** - (in a calm voice looking at my form) Would you like to change this answer?

**S** - (confused) Sir, given the options I have, monopoly, oligopoly, it fits the best.

**P1** - (still looking at my form) - And, Kirori Mal College didn't teach you about monopolistic competition?

**S** - (facepalm!) Sorry Sir, I forgot to mention it. But, I still think it is PC.

**P1** - (looking at my marksheet) You studied economics in your first semester, right? Is first semester so old a story that you don't remember economics?

**S** - (ouch, it hurt) No Sir, I remember the concepts. Explained what Perfect Competition is. What Monopolistic Competition is. Their differences and how in this case, PC fits better.

**P1** - (not convinced) Then, how did you attract more customers? Didn't you offer discounts?

**S** - explained how goods are sold at MRP in that market and the promotional schemes didn't involve any reduction in the price of the goods.

**P1** - Leave it, do you read newspaper? Or are you just interested in the soft news about marketing and sales offers?

**S** - (feeling insulted) I read newspaper, Sir.

**P1** - Have you read that the method of calculating national income in India has changed recently?

**S** - (in utter surprise, what!?) Sorry, Sir. I haven't read about it. (Later found out that he was referring to some news in between 2012–15)

**P1** - Why are you ignorant about it? Does your marketing not account for the national income?

**S** - (my marketing!?) No Sir, it's not like that. In fact, the marketing industry.. (interrupted)

**P1** - What? Industry? Is Marketing an Industry?

**S** - Shared the stats of Advertising Industry and explained how advertising is a subset of marketing and hence it should be an industry.

**S** - Sir, to further add to this confusion, I think it also contributes through the primary sector, like we have the FABM program at IIM-A, which provides marketing assistance to agriculturists.. (interrupted)

**P1** - “Arey yaar, finally btao na”. (What’s your final say?)

**S** - (smiling) Sir, I’d like to conclude by saying that as an industry (he smiles), it contributes through the tertiary sector, but also contributes indirectly through the other two sectors.

**P1** - (not in a mood to spare my economics) How is national income calculated in India?

**S** - Stated the methods.

**P1** - Explain the product method.

**S** - explained.

**P1** - What is GVA?

**S** - told.

**P1** - How to go from GVA to National Income?

**S** - explained the 3 factors - NFIFA, NIT, Depreciation.

**P1** - So, you mean  $GVA + \text{these 3} = \text{National Income}$ ? What have you studied?

**S** - (Arey yaar!) No, Sir. I meant an addition or subtraction of these depending on whether we wish to calculate domestic income or national income. Explained how the conversions of GDP to NDP, GDP to GNP and MP to FC take place.

**P1** - (gave me the first satisfied nod, dear lord, how I craved for it!) How is FC calculated in the primary sector?

**S** - (nooooo!) I don’t know, Sir. But I can try. I try to explain it using the A2, C2 methods which were in news related to the Budget.

**P1** - (annoyed) Are you trying to tell me the budget?

**S** - (scared) No, Sir. I was trying to connect the dots.

**P1** - Just so that you know, in C2, it’s not imputed rent.

**S** - (another facepalm!) Oh, Sir, can you please share what it is?

(P1 looks at P2) (P2 gives a nod)

As it is suggestive to not take a stand in the beginning and discuss both sides of the coin, I followed the same approach. In WAT, the reasoning behind your opinion matters more than your stand.

After the WAT, we were asked to wait for our turn. I was the **3rd** person (out of 8) to be interviewed in my panel. Since the first one was absent, I was the **2nd** one to go inside the interview room.

**P3** announced my name and I followed her into the room. P1 and P2 were busy going through my form. I wished them all and took a seat with their permission.

**P2** - How are you today, Shweta?

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**S** - I'm doing fine, Sir.

**P3** - (reading my SOP) So, you've mentioned that you are a self-motivated person. Can you share an instance where you motivated yourself in life?

**S** - shared an experience.

**P3** - (quoting from my SOP) Tell me more about this contest you participated in - 'International Space Design Contest'. Were you in the science stream earlier?

**P1** - (joining) Did you switch from science to commerce?

**S** - No, Sir. That was in class 8th.

(P1 and P3 nod)

**P1** - Why did you take it up, were you interested in science?

**S** - I was interested in exploring this opportunity for its international exposure and for working in a team.

**P3** - So, what was the contest about?

**S** - shared the details of the contest, the project that we made, the mission - inhabiting people on Mars and laying out the nutrition plans for them.

**P1** - What all difficulties did you face while achieving the mission?

**S** - talked about the differences b/w Earth and Mars, how the atmospheric and areographic barriers were taken care of, mentioned the shuttle, stay and nutritional requirements and situations of crisis that could have arisen.

**P1** - So, you like Space? Any recent developments in the news?

**S** - talked about Elon Musk's Tesla Roadster in Space.

**P1** - What do you think of Elon Musk?

**S** - talked about his potential, diverse ventures and enthusiastic nature.

**P3** - But, don't you think he's a little too much into everything?

**S** - shared how most of the great people are recognized for one/two avenues, but those achievements are a result of several unrecognized avenues that they touch upon in their lives. Gave the example of Steve Jobs and calligraphy.

**P2** - Shweta, what was your favourite subject during graduation?

**S** - I liked marketing the most.

**P3** - What is branding?

**S** - told.

**P3** - How is it different from advertising?

**S** - told.

**P3** - What is the difference between packing and packaging?

**S** - told.

**P3** - What are the layers of packaging?

**S** - told.

**P3** - Let us say, I am a commoner. What difference does branding, packaging or advertising make in my life? How do these things affect my decisions?

**S** - Ma'am, in a mega-store, where there are tens of detergent brands in a row, the moment you look at an 'orange-blue pack with a splash in the middle', you know it's 'Surf Excel'. The moment you watch an ad on the TV with a 'whitening layer running over the clothes', you know it's 'Tide'. These brands occupy a place in our subconscious mind and become our preferences even before we realize. These subconscious preferences alter our buying decisions as consumers.

**P2** - You've studied accounting, right? How do you account for branding in the books of accounts?

**S** - Sir, as branding is an expense.. (interrupted)

**P2** - No, not as an expense, think of something else.

**S** - Sir, branding leads to an increase in the value of goodwill of a company. So, it would show under the Assets side of the Balance sheet.

**P2** - As?

**S** - As an intangible asset.

**P2** - And when would it show as an intangible asset?

**S** - (confused) Sorry, Sir. I am unable to understand your question.

**P2** - When will the expense get converted into goodwill?

**S** - (unsure) Sir, when the expense leads to a favourable impression in the market.

**P2** - No, think again.

**S** - (guessing) Sir, probably when the valuation of the company gets done.

**P2** - Are you sure?

**S** - No, Sir.

**P2** - (smiling) Then you shouldn't be bluffing.

**S** - I'm sorry, Sir.

**P1** - Have you studied money and banking?

Alumnus to prof - He is a 100 percentiler!

PB - It is not like that sir. I haven't converted any of my calls as of now, and I am just trying to do well in all my interviews.

K1 - But even in the worst case scenario you won't join K. Which one is your top preference? Ahmedabad?

PB - Sir if I was not interested in joining K, I wouldn't have appeared for the process. Like I told you, I am just trying to do well in every call that I have.

K2 - Just tell us your preferences!

PB - If I happen to convert all my calls, I would be interested in A or C.

K2 - And after that? B?

PB - Yes sir.

K2 - And then? L?

PB - K or L, I am not too sure.

Both of them goes into monster mode here onwards.

K2 - Are you good at maths? Tell me differentiation of  $(\sec x \cdot \tan x)^{1/3}$ .

PB - I started off by simplifying in  $\sin x$  and  $\cos x$  terms then applied  $u dv + v du$  and showed it to him.

K2 - It is too lengthy. Simplify it.

PB - I tried to some extent but couldn't.

K2 - You used  $d(uv) = u dv + v du$ . What if I want  $d(u/v)$ ???

PB - Tried to remember the direct formula but couldn't. Told him I can't remember but we can take  $v^{-1}$  and apply the same formula.

K2 - No, tell me the direct formula for  $d(u/v)$ .

PB - Sorry sir, Can't remember.

K2 - Imagine this bottle as a cylinder. Draw SFD (Shear force diagram) and BMD (Bending Moment diagram) of this.

(Here I assumed that by considering it as a cylinder, He meant a solid/hollow cylinder. Coz of what he said, I neglected the water inside.)

PB - If there is no external force on this bottle, there won't be any SF or BM in the bottle.

K2 started smiling - I don't think so.

PB - Yes Sir, SF and BM will be zero. The normal reaction on the bottle coz of the table won't cause any shear or bending.

K2 - What about the water inside?

PB - #facepalm

I started drawing it, and I am sure I drew SFD right, but BMD was wrong.

K2 after seeing it told me both are wrong and said I don't know how XYZ company selected you for their International operations.

Now K1 starts and this was the worst phase of the interview.

K1 - Name all the Mughal emperor in the correct order.

PB - Babur..... Then took all the names I could recall in god knows what order.

K1 - Not only did you miss many names, but you also don't even know the correct order of the names you took. Okay, tell me, Who was the son of Akbar?

PB - Sir, Shah Jahan (History is not my strongest suit, Shah Jahan was his grand Son)

K1 - Then who was Jahangir's father?

PB - I don't know sir.

K1 - and who was Salim?

PB - Shah Jahan is also known as Salim (Actually, Jahangir is Salim)  
(K1 & K2 - facepalm)

(2-3 more questions about "The Great Mughal Empire" For all of them, I said I don't know. Now I was also feeling irritated.)

PB - Sir, I haven't been to Taj Mahal, nor have I seen Mughal-e-Azaam (Yup, I said it.)

K1 - Mughal-e-Azaam has nothing to do with all these questions! It wouldn't have helped you.

PB - Yes sir, Mandav fort. I have been there.

K1 - So tell me, which king and queen are famous for having an affair at the Mandav fort?

(I am like WTH is going on. Kya galti ho gayi mujhse????)

PB - Jhansi ki Raani!! (Apparently, this was too damn wrong which I realised later. K1 went insane after hearing this)



They asked me 5-6 questions all on Jhansi ki Rani! I was too irritated by then and had already made up my mind that I will not say I Don't Know any more, so I tried to say something or the other for all the questions. God knows what I told them about Jhansi ki Raani.)

Both middle aged

Duration : around 15 min

So, it went like :

P1: Tell me something about yourself.

Me : Born and brought up in Delhi. Final year of graduation. NSS Volunteer – social involvement. Learning Bharatnatyam for seven years. Talked about my two internships – Delhi Metro and gas power plant.

(Could have said more about fests and other stuff)

P1 : Ok . so which turbine is used in this power plant?

Me: combined cycle. Two gas and one steam.

P1: what are the capacities?

Me: told

P1: what is the heat ratio?

Me: I don't know. (Never heard the term. I think it is related to mechanical)

P1: cost of generation of electricity?

Me: The bill charges 5 rs per unit. So must be around 3-4 rs per unit.

(Could have talked about transmission and distribution losses and that every plant has a different cost depending on many complex factors.)

P1: which turbine is more efficient? Gas or steam

Me: don't know exactly but In case of gas turbine, the process is faster due to instant combustion. So, probably gas turbine.

P2: So, why did u choose Bharatnatyam Dance and not any other

Me : sir, initially it was closest to my home that why. But then I really liked it and enjoy it a lot. It is really vibrant. That why

P2: Tell me the difference between Freedom of expression , speech and opinion.

Me: Freedom of speech is a subset of expression. It refers to only verbal expression. Expression is a broader term and can be through variety of means like cartoons, dance, paintings. Opinions are thoughts , they may or may not be expressed.

P2: you have not taken a clear stand. If you have to take a clear stand- should there be limits on freedom of expression or not?

Me: no. there should not be limits. But people must be made aware that they should use their rights responsibly.

P2: so, the French gov. didn't do that? That's why Charlie hebdo happened.?

Me: we as a society learn from our mistakes. And I think this message is clear now.

P1: But French gov. did nothing new in this direction.

Me: But many important people including the Pope have criticized the misuse of freedom of expression to offend a community.

P2: So, you are from Delhi. Do u think Delhi should be given full statehood.

Me: no. it is not practical because Delhi is very small geographically and will not be financially sustainable if made a state. Moreover, lot of central government machinery is in Delhi like the MPs and foreign dignitaries visiting. Hence, Centre must have the power to control them. There are two main reasons why Delhi people want statehood. One is law and order i.e the Delhi police is not answerable to Delhi CM. and land issue – state gov. needs permission from center on land usage. DDA is not under state gov.

I think there are better ways to resolve these. Regarding police, one department of police can be made to report to CM. and regarding land- more representation of state in DDA and already some steps have been taken in this direction.

P2: So, is kejiwal mad. Making it an issue.

Me: no sir. There are issues. But full statehood is not practical. A better and middle path solution with devolution of more power to Delhi state would be better.

P1: But, there is even a country which is smaller than Delhi. Which one?

me : Vatican city

P1: how does that work?

Me: It is extremely dependent on its neighbors.

P2: what do u think about CCTV cameras being installed.

Me: I think it is a good step. But it is the second part towards ensuring a safe city. It will help in catching criminals. But we can not always wait for crimes to happen to catch a criminal. It needs to be supplemented with more awareness and gender sensitization and similar moves should be emphasized. (Could have also talked about terrorists and related activities)

P1 : So, what kind of books do you read

Me: it keeps on changing. But recently I have been reading social books about life of people. For instance, the last book I read was

PRINCESS: THE LIFE BEHIND THE VEIL IN SAUDI ARABIA. BY JEAN SASSON.

It is about a girl who is of the Al-Saud's family and talks about her life as a woman in Saudi Arabia.

And before that

NOTHING TO ENVY: ORDINARY LIVES IN NORTH KOREA BY BARBARA DEMICK

It explores the life of common people of North Korea under the dictator during the 1980s and the subsequent famine of 1990s. it is a compilation of interviews of refugees from north Korea by a journalist.

P2: what is Saudi Arabia doing about oil?

Me: It has refused to cut down oil production and because of this, oil prices have fallen

P2: what is the problem in opec?

Me: Saudi Arabia is a rich country with abundant oil and low cost of production. So it can afford to sell at a low price for long. Other countries can't.

**Interview:** I was the 6th member of my panel (Panel 3, total 3 panels). There were 2 male interviewers (M1 and M2) and 1 female member (say F). The 3rd member of my panel was absent. The interview was around 15 min (Though all others were having 20-25 min of interview before me).

Here I would share a little incident. While it was time for the 4th member of my panel, the female interviewer by mistake called me instead of the correct person. When I went M1 and M2 were already discussing that with her. They told me that it happened by mistake and told me to wait outside and called the original member.

M1 called me. As I entered 'F' mentioned the previous incident and it made the environment a bit light.

Me: Greeted them.

F: Take a sit. (Didn't even gave me the chance to sit...). So why you left Infosys in the first 3 months of joining.

Me: Answered

M1: Why is it that you took referrals from your professors only and not your now manager?

Me: Mentioned that I was associated with them for a longer period and my manager knows me only for little time as in between my previous manager has left also.

F: So you should have taken the referral from the previous manager.

Me: (Did a mistake) Actually I was connected with him through office email only, so ...

F: So you don't believe in building personal relation outside work?

Me: (Tried to cover up). Actually due to the pandemic, I was working from home at that time and thought that I will connect with him personally when I get to office.

M1: But don't you think it would be better if you had referral from manager because your professors only know you from one perspective thought you are associated with them for longer period?

Me: Sir as you mention it now, I think I should have done that.

Told

Alumnus: there are lot of cases where they sell products to customer by manipulating them

Agreed with him and accepted that it happens almost in every bank. It depends mainly on the employee.

**They all astonished** on the fact that I accepted that it happens

Told them that the solution will come only if we accept the reality of situation

Alumnus : how can we improve it ?

Told and said it's more about how ethical you are. Gave the example of AT1 bonds issue of Yes Bank.

F1: How do you target and differentiate HNI customers ?

Told

F1: you are doing discrimination by providing different services to different customers.

Explained that how both parties mutually benefit each other and it's not one side game

F1: so selling is completely a manipulative activity. Do you agree ?

Not exactly mam, it depends on how you are selling the thing. Even a good thing can be sold in a manipulative way. So it depends on the seller.

F1: Pointing to the biscuits, isn't consumption of these biscuits lead to diabetes ?

Told that it might lead, but it is not bad selling given the fact that everything is mentioned on the ingredients section. So a person should be aware about whether to take it or not.

F1: pta ni kya ethics and morality bol rhe ho, kch samj ni aarha. What's your long term goals ?

Told about what I want to do

F1: this behaviour of you will not let you survive

F1: you want promotions over work or not ?

Mam I do want but not at the cost of customers.

**Acha vohi illegal, ethical or ek or konsa btaya tha aapne ....**

Alumnus: Pallav you are working in foreign and suppose you get a project to increase the sales of marijuana. Will you do that if it's in company's interests ?

Took a pause

And said that I will do it if it's in company's interests and I may not involve in selling or consuming it

Till now I was feeling so much stress, due to dim light and big hall, I wanted to run from that moment

M1: Pallav what's your weakness tell some ?

I don't know why I spoke but I told that xyz is one and kept on telling how I improved it

M1: No tell us something more personal

Told and fumbled here

Okay Thanks.

Came out, discussed with people about how it was for them. They all were happy.

**Post interview scenes :**

Lunch was there as it was 1:20 pm. Didn't want to eat but still took it in the plate. My panel came out for lunch too, and I had no interest left after that. So left the plate there and came back home with a hopeless face.

I had good number of interview experience, basis on this I was expecting a direct reject or a long waitlist incase of bleak chance.

**Verdict:** Converted ✨

**Tips :**

Be moral and ethical

Don't sound like irrational person

Don't change your decisions too often

Don't let them see that you are nervous or stressed

Most of the interviews don't revolve around your preparation, so be prepared for on the spot thinking.

Don't judge your interviews - bas interview can select you, good can reject you.

Take proper sleep and diet before the interview.

## Interview Experience – 42

**Profile 10th/12th/Grad: 90+/90+/70+**

**Undergrad: B Com(H) + CA**

**Work Experience: 10 months as per CAT form; 16 months as on interview date in Transactions Advisory Space**

**Date : 22/02/2022**

The entire WAT and interview process for the IIMs were held online for the 2021–2023 admissions which brought its own unique set of challenges. My WAT and PI for IIM B were scheduled one month apart. (WAT in March and PI in April)

**WAT Topic:** How does attention from international celebrities on the ongoing farmer protest affect the centrality of the issue and the union government's response to it. (Online WAT:30 minutes to type the answer. The word limit was about 200 words. It was a hard-stop limit, once 200 words are written you cannot write more.)

I briefly described the tweets made by Greta Thunberg and Rihanna, and how the media and government reacted to them. Followed it up with my views on the issue, which mainly revolved around freedom to express opinions, especially in a modern globalized economy. Gave recent examples of government criticism by foreign countries - people all over the world (including Indians) were ridiculing American polity on the storming of the capitol building incident, in 2020 people were criticizing Australian PM for his inefficient handling of bush fires, and Brazil for destroying the Amazon rainforest. Concluded with saying that the tweets actually brought the issue (which is pivotal for the country) to the forefront and gave it more exposure.



**PI:**

PI was conducted over Zoom. There were 3 panelists - 1 Female professor (F) and 2 male professors (M1 and M2). My thoughts which were racing through my mind during the interview are enclosed in parentheses().

**F1:** Can we see some ID?

**Me:** (In all the nervousness, I had forgotten to keep my ID handy) I apologized, and asked for permission to take out my ID from a nearby drawer (Not an ideal start).

**M1:** Ok Devashish, you are probably the 8th or 9th CA we are interviewing, what makes you special?

**Me:** (Typical Icebreaker, variation of Tell me about yourself question) I listed all the achievements that distinguish me from other CAs: Ranks in multiple levels, my work profile, my responsibilities and achievements at work, and my hobbies which included chess.

**F1:** So you like playing chess, have you watched the latest Netflix series Queen's Gambit?

**Me:** Yes, of course, I binge-watched it within a couple of days.

**F1:** So do you like playing the Queen's Gambit. (For the uninitiated, Queen's Gambit is a name of a sequence of opening moves in chess)

**Me:** I used to play it, however now I have switched to the Italian Opening. Queen's Gambit leads to a very aggressive and open game, which did not suit my style. Hence, I switched to Italian which is more solid and leads to a more strategic game.

**F1:** Have you read about the recent controversial comments made by the Chief Justice of India?

**Me:** Yes. (I was hoping the conversation would not go in this direction as the issue was a very sensitive one, and I would have to be very careful with my words)

**F1:** What is your opinion on it?

**Me:** (I am not liking where it is going, I should keep it short and try to end the discussion). Ma'am during a hearing of the rape case of a minor, he apparently asked the perpetrator whether he would marry the victim, insinuating that marrying the victim would resolve the issue. I believe the comment was insensitive and uncalled for.

**F1:** But he is the Chief Justice of India. Can we question the Chief Justice of India? He is at the helm of the judiciary. Are you saying he was wrong in his conduct?

**Me:** (This is a tricky situation. They are trying to put me under pressure, I will need to smartly dodge the situation. Just keep a smiling face, don't let the panic show in your face) Ma'am, even though he is the CJI, he is a human after all and humans are prone to mistakes. He later clarified his stance as well and said the media twisted his words.

**F1:** You are changing your viewpoint. You first said he was insensitive, now you are saying he clarified his stance and media misreported.

**Me:** (This is not going well, can we please discuss something else) No ma'am, his remarks were insensitive no doubt, but the media also blew it a little out of proportion. (Please move to the next topic)

**M2:** Ok you said you like chess, what do you think are the difference in qualities of a blitz chess player and a classical chess player.

**Me:** (Back to chess that's more like it) Blitz gameplay requires players to rely a lot more on intuition, you also need to have the ability to keep your nerves under time pressure. Creative although unsound openings are also comparatively more effective in blitz games. Classical gameplay requires concentration for long periods of time, so it is a lot more taxing both mentally and physically. Classical play also requires you to memorize a lot more lines.

**M2:** Ok, if given a choice, would you like the qualities of a blitz player or a classical player.

**Me:** I would personally like the qualities of a blitz player. I think managing pressure and developing your intuition are skills that I value highly.

**M1:** The share price of US tech companies are rising exponentially in the past few days. What do you think is so special about Apple that its shares are valued so highly?

**Me:** Apple is the hub of innovation, especially when it keeps to mobile phones. All functionality of touch screens such as finger gestures to scroll, to zoom in and out, were invented by Apple. Apart from this their financial management is immaculate. They have negative working capital days, which is unheard of for a company engaged in a manufacturing business, that too for a company of Apple's size. (I also quoted some figures about their working capital, inventory management, and sales growth).

**M2:** You must be aware that in the West, coffee is their staple beverage and Starbucks is the biggest coffee chain. But Starbucks failed in Australia despite being a success in US. Do you know the reasons?

**Me:** I was not aware of it and said so to the panel.

**M1:** You know these typical New Yorkers, these suit-wearing educated Investment Bankers and Venture Capitalists, they are so wrong when it comes to valuing startups. Why do you think that is the case?

**Me:** When it comes to valuing a startup, none of the traditional modes works, they typically rely on historical data and for obvious reasons, there is no historical data for startups. So when it comes to valuing startups especially, tech startups, you have to rely a lot on qualitative factors such as what is the reputation of the founding team, what is the initial consumer feedback, can the product be scaled, etc. All these are highly ambiguous and difficult to put a number to.

**F1:** Why did you switch your jobs so early?

**Me:** Explained the reason behind it. (Was expecting this question and had a prepared answer)

**M1:** In your SOP you have mentioned that during your job you realized that while evaluating M&As Private Equity evaluates much more than the balance sheet of the target company. Can you give me an instance from your work experience where you encountered this?

**Me:** I explained in detail how during an M&A deal, the legal due diligence team had flagged a major issue to the Private Equity. This issue would never have been caught by analyzing just the balance sheet. This eventually had a huge bearing on the pricing of the deal as well.

**M2:** Can you tell me why Chartered Accountants are so risk-averse? I think this hinders their progress. Can CAs actually be good CEOs of a company?

**Me:** At the very foundation of principles of accounting is the concept of conservatism. This concept is applied in practically every journal entry. I believe slowly this conservatism also slips in the psyche of a CA which I think makes them risk-averse. However, having said so there are plenty of CAs who are successful CEOs and many CAs have their own successful startups as well. Probably one of the most influential industrialists of India - Kumar Mangalam Birla is a CA. So, we cannot generalize and put a blanket statement that CAs cannot be good CEOs.

**F1:** I think we are done with all the questions. Thank you for being part of the process.

The interview lasted for about 30 minutes. Overall it was a pleasant interview barring the initial hiccup which was entirely my fault. The interviewers were focused more on how I look at things and my viewpoints about different issues.

**Date : 21/02/2022**

#### **Personal interview**

Panel : 1 Alumni male (MA)

1 Male professor (MP) +

1 Female economics professor (FP)

MA: Which name do you go by? Why such a long name?  
(They dissected each part of my name)

MP: So where do you belong to?

Me: Andhra Pradesh, sir

MP: Is it Andhra or Telangana?

Me: Earlier Andhra. My family is now divided sir. Dad's side is in Telangana and mom's is in Andhra.

MA: (Jokingly) So they're not staying together?

Me: \*Giggles\* No sir we all stay in Mumbai. I'm talking about their individual families there.

MP: Where is it exactly in Andhra/ Telangana?

Me: Answered. Questioned a bit more.

(Apparently, MP had studied in Andhra. He asked me if I know the name of his school... I said I'm not aware since I've been in Mumbai all my life.)

MP: Do you know that the Hyderabad airport was earlier at Begumpet?

Me: (Breathed a sigh of relief and promptly answered with full details as one of my friends had told me this issue. Super lucky here. Never anticipated this question.)

MP: What do your father and mother do? Which company do they work in?

Me: Answered

MP: So you've studied so much. BCom MCom CA MBA..What are you going to do ICWA , LLB etc next?

Me: \*with a smile\* Only MBA for now sir.

MP: So tell us why CA's come to do MBA whereas we don't see many MBA going and doing CA. Why is that?

Me: Sir, although ICAI is taking lots of efforts to integrate soft skills and management aspects into its curriculum, it is tilted towards Finance and accounting. There are a few subjects and courses related to General management which have been introduced and I used to actively participate in them. Also, peer learning gives a huge thumbs-up to MBA sir.

MA: IN CA, you are taught to be a skeptic, shower suspicion on every person and transaction. How do you think a person with a doubtful mentality will be able to objectively assess the situation and understand people in the chair of a manager?

Me: Sir, firstly I would like to mention that only one subject-auditing professes such outlook. People who exclusively work in the auditing domain might need to carry that mentality during work. There are very many domains like taxation, strategic management etc which teach different skills. Moreover, I feel that every person inherently carries a personality which can neither be taught nor unlearned. So ultimately it comes down to the person and his/her individual judgement on how to handle a situation.

Looks satisfied.

I also mentioned the Kingston cotton mills case stating "Auditors are watchdogs not bloodhounds" which he immediately picked up and appreciated.

MA: Okay. So which subjects did you read passionately in your studies?

Me: Sir I used to love all my subjects except IT (Luckily didn't get questions here, just a smirk) but to be specific I have worked in Taxation, then Strategic management and Cost accounting.

MA: So define Cost

Me: Sir cost is an accumulation of expenditure directed towards achieving a particular favorable outcome or result.

\*Poker face\*

MP: What is opportunity cost and explicit cost

Me: Answered.

MP: So you're an inspiration to all of us. \*I made a question mark face\*. You've lost 20 kgs?

Me: \*Smiling\* Yes sir. That is something I did absolutely on my own volition without external help or gym etc. So I recognize it as a pride factor.

MA - little overweight: So you've to tell me what to do?

Me: Sure sir. I did yoga, swimming and strict diet control.

MP seemed very interested so kept answering at his questions. Felt like a diet coach!

MA: So in accounting. Assets, losses and expenses come on the debit side. Why is that so considering one is good and others are bad?

Me: Sir accounting, today, is based on the double entry system of book keeping. Considering the purpose is to strike a balance between debit and credit, it can't be said that one is good and another is bad.

FP: What he is asking is why such treatment?

Me: Yes Ma'am that's where I'm getting to. So asset is usually taken up for the long term, beyond the current accounting period. Whereas expenses are revenue in nature. That is why the debit and the difference in perspective.

MA: Some expert says asset is unexpired expense. Is that true?

Me: No sir, all assets don't have an infinite life. If that were the case, depreciation would not exist as a concept

MA: But depreciation is an expense.

Me: Yes sir. But it draws out of the asset's balance. Which has expiry.

MA: So the asset balance is unexpired right?

Me: Till the time it is expensed off, yes. It is unexpired.

All 3 smiled.

MP: What does your current organisation do. Did not ask about my role in the organisation. Checked the firm's website right there and read out some content. I said I was doing the website revamping and some of that content was made and posted by me. \*Straight face\*

MP: So what did you do in articleship?

Me: Answered but he kept cutting off on each point.

FP: So talk to us about the Interim budget from an Economic perspective.

Me: Started to talk about sops and budget allocation figures

FP stopped me and said she wanted to hear a macroeconomic perspective.

Me: Talked about fiscal deficit

FP asked me lot of cross questions on Fiscal deficit and whether it is at appropriate levels currently. I said we should look at it qualitatively than just numbers and stats.

FP: So tell me how would you analyse government expenditure qualitatively?

Me: Told it need to take care of various sections of society and not be skewed. Lot of questions and ultimately led me to her point- She wanted me to say Productive vs. Unproductive government expenditure.

I was part of marketing team at my firm and I am aware of how much effort goes into these activities.

## **Interview Experience – 45**

**Date : 21/02/2022**

**Background - 10 CGPA / 96.4 / 8.79 (Mechanical Engineering, NIT); 32 months Work Experience (Design - Oil & Gas)**

**WAT (Online)** - 12 February 2021, 08:30 AM (First Day, First Slot)

Fortunately, the topic was comparatively easier for the first slot.

Topic: The pandemic has caused a shift to remote teaching and learning. How can digital technologies be used to improve the quality and accessibility of higher education, including professional and executive programs.

We got 30 mins to structure our essay in 250 words. As per the instructions, a 10+20 approach had to be followed for thinking and typing in the essay, but it was flexible. (There was a word counter and a timer to keep track)

**PI (Online)** - 17 February 2021, Scheduled for 12:00 PM, but got a call from the admissions office at 10:40 AM that I will be receiving the link to join in 5–10 mins. The interview started at 11:30 AM.

There were three panelists - 2 Professors and 1 Alumni. For ease of understanding, I will denote them as **P1** - Professor 1 (In his 40s), **P2** - Professor 2 (In his 50s), **A1** - Alumni (In his 30s).

It started off with the panel asking me to show my identity proof. After verification, P1 opened the interview.

**P1:** So, Ayush. Where are you from? Where are you right now?

**Candidate (C):** Sir, I am basically from ABC, but I am in XYZ right now.

**P1:** So, your father is a doctor?

**C:** Mentioned that he's a Professor of Biotechnology.

**P1:** Okay! So how do you think Biotechnology and Mechanical Engineering are related?

**C:** (wasn't prepared for this question; started off with something, but realised I don't really have an idea; accepted that I am not very sure about it.) (Didn't want the interview to start off this way :\ )

**P1:** Not a problem. So, what does your company do?

**C:** Explained the main domain in which the organisation functions and the department I work for. Also, mentioned the Entertainment Services vertical and its association with NASA.

**P1:** "Entertainment Services?!!"

**C:** Explained how it makes rides for amusement parks like Disney World and Universal Studios.

**P1:** Okay, so what kind of company is it? Is it an MNC?

**C:** Answered (Public Company, Based in XXXXX)

**P1:** How many engineers does it have? Including the R&D engineers in the United States.

**C:** Mentioned the engineer count and number of offices in India. Also, told him the number of employees and how they function from various business units across the world.

**P1:** Okay. So what is your role in the organisation?

**C:** Mentioned how I lead projects for clients and head a team of 3–5 engineers during the design and validation stages of subsea hardware.

**P1:** So you work with pipes, valves, etc?

**C:** Clarified the work that I primarily do and how it does not involve the piping/valves part.

**P1:** In a span of two years, you have led a team of 3–5 engineers. You must have learned a lot through your experiences till now. Mention 2 key learnings.

**C:** Gave a detailed answer.

**P1:** So, I see you had a subject named Metallurgy in your curriculum, and considering you are working in a domain that is related to materials. Do you mind if I ask you a question from Metallurgy?

**C:** (was cursing myself because I skipped the Fe-C diagram and heat treatment processes during my preparation). No sir.

**P1:** What is the difference between Destructive Testing and Non-Destructive Testing.

**C:** Answered. Tried to mention how we don't perform DT because of the expenses involved.

**P1:** One last question from my side. After that my colleagues can carry on with the interview.

Do you know what the Rockwell hardness test is?

**C:** Yes sir.

**P1:** Is it a type of Destructive Testing or Non-Destructive Testing?

**C:** Mentioned how it creates indents on the surface and should be considered as a Destructive Test (\*sobs in SOM\*)

**P1:** Are you sure?

**C:** Yes sir!

**P1:** Are you absolutely sure?

**C:** Yes sir! (\*sobbing intensifies\*)



**P1:** Okay. I'm done with the questions. My colleague can now take over.

**A1:** Hello Ayush! You have mentioned that you have studied Operations Research during your graduation.

**C:** Yes sir.

**A1:** So, I will ask you a rudimentary question from OR. You are aware of Objective Functions and Constraints, right?

**C:** Yes sir.

**A1:** If you have to mention the OF and Constraints for a For-Profit Organisation, can you do that for me?

**C:** (asked for 10 seconds. They didn't bother me to start even though I might have taken a bit over that) Mentioned the Objective Function. Stated 2 constraints. He might have been looking for more constraints though.

**A1:** So, say you have to install Solar Lights in the rural areas of Karnataka. What will your OF and Constraints be now?

**C:** Started mentioning Profit Maximisation as the OF.

**A1:** (cuts me off) So the OF won't change even if you are doing it for the poor people?

**C:** Defended my stance. Mentioned 2–3 Constraints. (He hinted that he wanted something related to the value-based aspects.) Didn't provide a really satisfactory answer to this.

**A1:** Your company got famous because of a particular incident. Do you know about that?

**C:** Mentioned how a scene in 'Titanic' got some attention.

**A1:** That's the entertainment aspect. Something else?

**C:** Mentioned something related to the history of the company.

**A1:** Not the history. A popular event. Something related to Richard Feynman? You might have gone in that direction earlier in the interview.

**C:** (I had no idea.) Mentioned that I know who Richard Feynman was, but I am not really sure of the answer to the question.

(He probably wanted to know something about a space exploration activity that made the company famous in the 90s.)

**A1:** Okay. That's it from my side. Thank you!

**P2:** Hi Ayush! So you know that the Oil And Gas sector hasn't been doing well over the past year. The stocks dipped. The prices fell.

**C:** Yes sir. However, it has picked up in the past couple of months.

**P2:** Let's not consider the past 3 months. As a CEO, what are the 3 steps that you would take?

**C:** Mentioned 3 steps.

**P2:** (Asked a question. Don't really remember what it was, but something related to the previous question.)

**C:** Answered about the shift in focus towards renewables, because the O&G reserves might perish in the near future.

**P2:** That's it from my side. Thank you!

**P1:** Do you have any questions that you would like to ask?

**C:** Asked a question about the student involvement in a CoE at IIMB.

(P1 gave a detailed answer and explained how projects are assigned, how the faculty mentors students and how they execute them.)

**P1:** Any more questions?

**C:** No sir.

**P1:** Okay. Then you can leave the meeting room now.

**C:** Thanked them and left the meeting

Me: Answered how I took a course in sociology and developed interest in it.

M1: You have mentioned about term papers on Sikhism. Briefly mention the crux

Me: Answered, but not fully. He cut me in between.

M1: So, you're from Punjab. Tell me 2 merits and 2 demerits of the farm laws.

Me: Told.

F1: So, is CureFit successful?

Me: We'll have to wait for the results, but presently it's getting investments, so there's a potential.

F1: Does valuation imply profitability? Why are people investing if they aren't yielding profits?

Me: Mentioned about the reputation of the founder and a belief in the idea. Added that I don't have a complete idea, and that's why I want to pursue MBA, in order to learn more 😊. Also, quoted Sapiens, "The whole system of capitalism is based on the trust in future value".

F1: Why are such start-ups not successful from Day 1?

Me: Mentioned about market share and incentivisation, and about the need to balance both. Also, price increase can't be exorbitant, as that would lead to consumer attrition.

F1: Asked quantum computing and edge computing.

Me: Had no clue

F2: So, you have done humanities. How's that relevant to your undergrad?

Me: Mentioned that I had made up my mind about MBA, and they are helpful in that.

F2: Tell me something that you learnt, that can be utilized in consumer behavior.

Me: Mentioned SWOT analysis and AIDAS model.

F2: How will you use these models to promote vaccination drive?

Me: Talked about the marketing of fear. Linked that to insurance companies' ads. Talked about incentivisation, gave an example of how First-time-Voter certificates were given to encourage voting. She seemed impressed. I mentioned that we don't need customer retention, as we don't want the patient to return 😊. \* F2: Chuckles \*

F2: Tell me what you learnt in Professional ethics.

Our panel was the toughest with each PI taking only 20–25 minutes. After each interview, they were taking 5–7 minutes to prepare questions for the next candidate.

As i entered, M1 started questions first after inspecting my SOP which i submitted for IIM-B, M2 and F2 were sitting with laptops (maybe reading my SOP and forming questions)

(No questions on introduce yourself)

What is velocity? difference with speed?

Differentiation of acceleration with time?

(after that he asked F1 to ask questions)

**F1:** So what is brent crude and other standard crudes?

What is its current price?

How changes in crude price affect us?

Inflation?

How is inflation calculated?

CPI (Consumer Price Index)?

**M2:** So what is going on in Assam?

What is Citizenship Amendment bill? and How it impacts Assam?

Why the outrage? What do you think should be the solution?

What should govt. do?

Do you think the illegal immigrants will be taken back by there country?

**M1:** Have you been to Dawki? (a place in meghalaya where from you can see bangladesh clearly)

Bangladeshis can easily walk into the country.

## Interview Experience – 48

**Date : 1<sup>st</sup> March 2021**

After document verification, we were distributed the WAT answer sheets in the waiting hall itself. The instructions were given and we were asked to start. The question was (non-verbatim) -

“Some people consider Nuclear Weapons as a deterrent to war. While others claim that they’re dangerous and hence of no use. What is your opinion?”

Discussed both the sides, backed them up by relevant examples and concluded by taking the side with more pros than cons.

After the WAT, we were asked to wait for our turn. I was the **3rd** person (out of 8) to be interviewed in my panel. When the **2nd** person came out, she said that they’re asking whatever is coming to their mind. Like they asked her what is the capital of Rome? (Yes, Rome, and not Italy!)

My turn came at 11:00 AM.

The 2nd person had described the panelists inside as 3 gentlemen - **P1**, **P2** and **P3**. She had said that **P1** (left) spoke the least, **P2** (middle) asked the technical questions and **P3** (right) was having fun by confusing the candidates.

Just then, **P3** announced my name and asked me to follow him. As I said this was my first interview at IHC, I hadn’t seen the room before. It took me a couple of seconds to realize how big the room was. **P3** lead me to the end of the room, where the other panelists were sitting. I smiled, wished them good morning and took a seat with their permission.

**P2** - Please hand over your file to me, Shweta.

**S** - (handing over the file) Sure, Sir.

**P3** - (looking at my transcript) Commerce! What's your rank in college?

**S** - First, Sir. But, that is up till 4th semester.

**P1** - (going through my 10th and 12th mark sheets) You've consistently performed well in academics. Isn't it?

**S** - (thinking if they're looking for ego issues) I tried to maintain a decent academic profile, Sir. (kicking myself for using the word 'decent', who says it?)

**P1** - (smiles) (signalling P3 to start with the questions)

**P3** - So, Shweta, you have studied accountancy, right? I'll give you a situation. Let us say, you're a dairy farmer and you have 50 cows. One of your cows gives birth to a calf. How would you account for it in the books of accounts?

**S** - (whatt!?) (smiling, almost laughing) Sir, I don't know, but I can try. Since the cows, in this case, are not my goods & services and instead are my fixed assets, the birth of a calf would appreciate the value of my fixed assets.

**P3** - How would it appreciate the value of your fixed assets?

**S** - The calf can be sold in the market, which will be a capital gain and hence its birth has increased the value of my total assets.

**P3** - Can you give me the journal entry for the birth of the calf?

**S** - (thinking) Sir, I'm sure that the Assets a/c will be debited, but I'm not sure what to credit as there's no money involved. So, probably P&L a/c. (Turns out it is the Capital a/c which will get credited)

**P2** - (suddenly) Shweta, who was Kirori Mal?

**S** - (my memory was betraying me) Seth Kirori Mal was the founder of the trust which managed our college after partition.. err, (running out of facts).. umm, Our college was named after him..

(they try to control their laughter and I realize what I had just said, of course our college was named after him, you idiot, isn't it already known to them?)

(damage control) Sir, our college faced staff management issues during partition and his trust really helped the college gain its reputation back. It was shifted from Qutub Road, it's earlier location to North Campus and was also renamed from Nirmala College to KMC in the memory of Seth Kirori Mal.

**P2** - (scribbling something on a piece of paper) What is an Indifference Curve?

**S** - told.

**P2** - (hands over the paper, which has two ICs drawn, intersecting each other with 3 points on them, labelled as A, B and C) Can you rank these points in the order of preference for a rational consumer?

**S** - Sir, it isn't possible to rank them. The intersection of the ICs violates the basic definition of an IC. It is a contradiction.

**P2** - What is a Giffen good?

**S** - told.

**P2** - How is the shape of its demand curve?

**S** - told.

**P2** - Any example?

**S** - told.

**P2** - What is the substitution effect?

**S** - (went blank at this point) Sorry, Sir. I've read it but I'm unable to recall.

**P2** - You've done a module in financial markets, tell me what is SENSEX?

**S** - told.

**P2** - How does it act as a representative?

**S** - Tried to explain. Companies from different industries with high market cap, how its movement is an indicator of investors mood, etc.

**P2** - What are derivatives?

**S** - told.

**P2** - What can be the underlying assets?

**S** - gave examples: shares, indexes, currency, commodity, etc.

**P2** - If price of the commodity doesn't change, will price of the derivative change?

**S** - (not sure) I think it can, Sir.

**P2** - Why do you think so?

**S** - (very unsure) Because the price of the derivative also depends on the buyers and sellers of the derivative. The volume exchanged will impact its price.

**P2** - What is LIBOR?

**S** - Sir, I've heard of it, but I'm not sure.

**P2** - Leave it. What is risk free rate of return?



**S** - told.

**P2** - Do you know the rate prevailing in India, in terms of percentage?

**S** - Sorry, Sir. I am not aware of that.

**P1** - Shweta, what has brought you here, why MBA?

**S** - (excited to mention marketing) start with how I was interested in marketing during undergrad, more about it, the extent to which I like it.. (interrupted)

**P1** - “Ye to prepared lag raha hai”.. (This sounds prepared)

**S** - (face palm) No, Sir, it’s not like that.. (interrupted)

**P3** - Don’t worry, Shweta. We’ll get to that part soon. Do you read newspaper?

**S** - (sad that they didn’t let me talk about marketing) Yes, Sir.

**P3** - As an accountant, how’d you highlight the problem in the Nirav Modi case? Remember, Shweta, just in 2–3 words. Pin-point what was missing.

**S** - (after thinking) Internal Check. That is what was missing.

**P3** - Please explain.

**S** - Internal check ensures that the work of an employee gets checked by another employee which reduces the chances of fraud. In case of PNB, the work of employees issuing LoU was not checked by senior staff members.

**P3** - But, if the work of one gets checked by another, wouldn’t this go infinitely? Any other body to check this?

**S** - There are audit committees to ensure fair audit reporting by the auditors.

**P3** - And what if they also join hands in committing the fraud?

**S** - The company can appoint an independent body to check the auditors.

**P3** - What if they join hands too?

**S** - (I give up) Sir, then the company needs to incorporate moral ethics in its employees’ value system which is again a debatable issue.

**P3** - Have you read the Cadbury Report on Corporate Governance?

**S** - No, Sir.

**P3** - Have you read the Birla Report on Corporate Governance?

**S** - No, Sir.

**P3** - (perplexed) you haven't studied Corporate Governance?

**S** - (Understanding now) Sir, it is a part of my curriculum for this semester as the subject 'Audit and Corporate Governance'. We've covered only till Audit in class.

**P3** - (nodding) Do you know what it is?

**S** - Tried to explain, but wasn't satisfactory.

(P3 looks at P1 and P2, they nod, but P3 still doesn't wanna end the interview)

**P3** - Last question, Shweta. Do you read?

**S** - Yes, Sir.

**P3** - Which was the last book you read?

**S** - (The honest answer) David Ogilvy's 'Ogilvy on Advertising', Sir.

(P1 and P2 smile and P3 gives a look of disbelief)

**P3** - Shweta, are you sure you've read that book?

**S** - (Smiling) Yes, Sir.

**P3** - Tell me one famous line from that book.

**S** - (Instantly) "If it doesn't sell, it isn't creative".

(P3 smiles and so do I, more so because it ended on marketing, the area they didn't let me talk about. Probably that's why P1 and P2 were smiling too)

**Date : 1<sup>st</sup> March 2021**

Two guys.(G1, G2).

G1 comes out and calls me.We get in. He asks me to take a seat.

G1: So you are Jain?(Mentioned on the form)

Me: Yes sir.

G1: You should be getting into business.

Me: It would have worked well if I had a family business but we don't have it.

G1: Where are you from?

Me: Jalgaon. Sir.(It's in Maharashtra)

G1: Any way related to Jain irrigation there?

Me: No sir

G1: Just the same religion?

Me:Yes sir.

G1: How is the company?

Me: It's a huge company. It was established around 1950(wiki says 1989) by around 8 people, Bhavarlal Jain being prominent. I don't know the exact numbers but it is worth around 10000 crore.

G1: It is about drip irrigation na?

Me: yes sir. It is basically into drip irrigation, sprinkler parts and agriculture related things.

G1: So you took a drop?

Me: told them about the problem I had at Career Point. They wanted me to join in April but I had college till May. Then they started delaying the joining. I had interview at Fiitjee on Nov 16 but the date clashed with CAT. I chose CAT. Finally I am joining Fiitjee on Feb 8. Now even Allen wants me.

G2: What do you think of CAT coaching?

Me: Sir I don't think you can teach a graduate student class tenth maths. As far as PC, PJ vocabulary is concerned, I still haven't found out what should be done. The advice I have got is improve your reading. But I haven't found that advice very useful.

Waiter brings tea for the panelists(2 cups). They offer me. I decline politely.

G2: How was your CAT?

Me: This year there was a change in the pattern of the paper. Last year we had 70 min for each section with 30 question each. This year it changed to 170 minutes with 50 questions each. Till last year I was worried a lot about VA section. This year I had 50 questions in QA DI and 16 in LR. I had targeted these questions. I attempted all 66 and just 16 out of 34 in VA. I focused on LR more because it is my bread and butter of section 2.

G2: You think CAT can be gamed?

Me: Sir my job was to strategize the paper.

G2: Seems like you got a good percentile.

Me: It's okay sir. I have actually written an answer for this on Quora.(I had carried a print out of [Chandresh Kakliya's answer to Why don't students make their way to top 3 IIM's inspite of getting 99.5](#)

[percentile and above?](#) in my file.)Most people don't understand CAT is an elimination test and not a selection test. I showed him the answer script.

G1 takes his time and reads it.

G1: So you write on Quora and PagalGuy?

Me: Mostly on Quora. I have written over 500 answers there. This year I have developed a genuine hobby.

G1: What's the difference in both?

Me: PG is a very small niche. It's mostly about MBA, Bank exams. On Quora you can talk about almost anything.

G1: You haven't done the analysis for L.

Me: Sir your cutoff is not as transparent as AC. So I could not make back calculations.

Waiter comes back with samosas(2 plates). Waiter serves them. G2 doesn't eat and offers me. This time I accept the plate and take a bite. We again resume to the interview.

G1: What do you think of Narendra Modi?

The panel was of 3 persons, F (50yrs), M1(55 yrs), M2(35 yrs, alumni).

I greet them, take my seat, M2 asks for my folder and starts reading my certificates.

**F : How do you justify your low percentage in Btech?**

I told them about my various extra-curriculors, my position of responsibilities and my work in the institute's sports fest core team as Finance Head.

**M1 : Why IIM B?**

I had memorised the obvious answer about triple accreditation, alumni base, brand value etc.

But I don't know what happened at that particular moment.

Sir, Can I tell you a story?

M1 : 2 minutes.

And I narrated this complete story.

I request you to go through this, you will realize that this was not a just another interview.

I ended the answer with,

The students were shouting, “Joka is not a place, it's an experience.” And this was personified by me.

Everyone smiled.

This was supposed to be a prepared answer but I don't know why I fumbled. I went back to the first answer and told them about the management skills I acquired during my graduation.

**F : So what kind of movies do you like?**

I do watch every genre, but crime thriller is my favourite.

**Date 26/02/2021**

**WAT Topic: Racial Stereotyping in advertisements**

**Time: 30 Mins**

**Performance:** Excellent. nceled from the selection criteria as online interviews were conducted for few candidates during COVID-19 Lockdown.

I was the first person in my panel. So as soon as WAT was done I have been called for the Interview process. In my Panel, there were Two male Professors(M1 and M2) from IIM Indore.

Once I entered the room, I received a warm welcome from the panelists.

M1: How do you do? Are you comfortable or you just need some time to settle down. (Since I had my interview just 10 mins after my WAT process)

Me: I am fine sir.

M1: What is your role in TCS?

Me: Explained.

M1: You are a chemical engineer right?

Me: Yes sir.

M1: I will give you a chemical reaction and you find what is it.



Me: Ammonia Manufacture process sir.

M1: What is the name of the process?

Me: Habers Process sir.

M1: What are the temperature and pressure requirements for this process?

Me: I am not sure about the range sir. But high temperature and high pressure are required as I remember.

M1: It is a safe answer. What is the principle behind the process?

Me: Le Chatelier Principle sir.

M1: Can you explain it?

Me: I don't remember exactly sir but it is something about maintaining equilibrium in a chemical reaction.

M1: Whether it is an exothermic or endothermic reaction?

Me: Guessing for 10 seconds. It is a reversible reaction and I guess both involve sir.

M1: Then how equilibrium is maintained?

Me: Just blinking my eyes. Don't know sir.

M1: How the product is removed if it is a reversible reaction at such high pressure.

Me: Maybe the volume can be increased to reduce the pressure.

M1: If the pressure is not high then reversible should take place and you don't get the product right.

Me: Yes sir. I have studied these sir. But I cannot recollect it now. Maybe some catalytic poison or external reagent could be added to slow down the reverse reaction. But I am not sure.

(Grilled too deep in academics)

M2: What could be the answer?

Me: Around 2 sir.

M2: Greater than or lesser than 2?

Me: Lesser than 2. it could be 1.999999999.....

M1: You are a football player. do you know banana kick?

Me: No sir. I haven't heard of it.

M1: How do you curl the ball?

Me: Explained.

M1: How to exert maximum force in the kick and how the landing foot should be positioned?

Me: Explained.

M1: I am done.

M2: I will give you an extempore topic. 30 seconds to think and 1–2 mins to speak.

**Date 25/02/2021**

P1 and P2 share pleasantries. Ask me if I had talked to people who had already been interviewed. I said, yes, I asked for an overall view but not specific questions. A few clarifications related to the interview form and then we start.

P1: What is a Six Sigma Process?

Me: It is process in which the difference between the mean and the USL or LSL is at least 6 standard deviations.

P1: No, is it not that the difference between the USL and LSL should be six standard deviations?

Me: Sir, I remember otherwise. Moreover, there can always be a process which might have only USL or only LSL.

P1: Have you heard of a 12 sigma process.

Me: No.

P1: So, should it not be the difference between the USL and LSL.

Me: Sir, you have confused me here (Big disaster 1! I am supposed to be the expert here!)

P2: Question on Work Experience Project.

Me: Answered.

P2: Tell us about your latest work experience?

**Profession Resume Question (For Freshers):** Write about a decision that you made and regret in life. What went wrong? What did you learn from it?

### **Interview Summary**

I was 4th in the sequence. The Panel comprised of two young male interviewers (M1 and M2)

**M1:** Palak, right? What does your name mean?

**Me:** Sir it translates to eyelashes in Hindi and is symbolic for agility.

**M1:** We'll find that out.

**Me:** Sure, sir! (With a warm smile)

**M2:** (Reading my form) Oh, you've graduated in psychology. Well, should we be concerned? Can you hypnotise us? (I was quite accustomed to such reactions by now)

**Me:** Sir, if I would have pursued my masters in psychodynamic therapy, then perhaps. But right now, no I can't.

**M2:** (Visibly relieved) Great! We're safe now.

**Me:** (Glad that a pleasant rapport had been established)

**M1:** Palak, what is schizophrenia?

**Me:** Sir, it is an abnormal psychological disorder which is characterized by a distortion of perception of the physical reality, for example - hallucinations. One may see that which does not really exist. These are visual hallucinations. May hear that which isn't really present. These are auditory hallucinations. May feel sensations in the body in the absence of any real stimulus. These are tactile hallucinations. Schizophrenia is one of the most dreadful abnormality because there isn't a 100% cure for it as of yet. There are drugs and therapies which can limit it, but not fully cure it.

**M1:** Okay.

**M2:** Have you studied consumer psychology?

**Me:** Not as part of my academic curriculum, but yes I am well versed with the applications of psychological theories in the domain of consumer research and marketing.

**M2:** So tell me, from a company's point of view – what is better? Loyalty or variety seeking?

**Me:** A company would want their customers to be loyal to their products and not easily switch to another product/brand. That is why we see companies investing heavily in customer retention programmes or indulging in incentivization of their loyal customers through innovative loyalty programs/offers.

**M2:** But don't you think variety is important too? Isn't it better if the customer can get access to different types of products instead of sticking to one?

**Me:** Yes sir, from a customer point of view, variety is definitely important. And the companies should be quick to adjudge this need of customers. They should be able to predict the changing market trends, adapt quickly and introduce a new version/variety of products based on the new wants. For example, PepsiCo recognized the need for portfolio expansion as they saw a change in health trend, a move

towards a more organic “good for you” products rather than the seemingly unhealthy snacks. The recognition of this change led PepsiCo to venture into acquisitions like Tropicana and Quacker Oats which proved to be a profitable bid for them in the long run.

**M2:** What do you think is the role of Social Exchange theory in this interaction between the market and the consumers?

**Me:**

- Explained the role of reference groups and influencers in decision making during the purchase.
- Linked it to the premise of celebrity endorsements.
- Gave an example of Nike’s controversial Colin Kaepernick campaign to explain the influence that social forces of in-group & out-group rivalry exert in the process of purchase.

**M2:** (Looking at M1) Okay I must say I’m impressed. (M1 nods in approval and gets the cue to lead the question now)

**M1:** Okay so far we have discussed the subjective aspects, but can you elaborate on a practical manner of measuring the market change? Build a case for us.

**Me:** Built a blueprint of a hypothetical case on behalf of an FMCG company aiming to measure the change in dietary habits of a rural population segment, explained the methodology to be used, the standardised tools to be employed, the sample survey questions and the process. (Discussion on this research case went on for good 4-5minutes, with cross questioning in between)

I do not specifically remember how, but the topic of body language came up, perhaps through one of my answers.

**Suddenly M2 stood up with his arms crossed and clenched tightly near his chest.**

**M2:** Tell me what does this posture say about me?

**Me:** It conveys that you are unapproachable or aloof.

**M2 (Puts his arms on his waist and head high):** And, this?

**Me:** The overarching posture of your body gives it connotations of dominance. It makes you seem like a person who is not very flexible in his dealings.

**M2 (Sits down and stretches one of his hand in front of me with the palm facing upwards)** This?

**Interview reporting date and time:- Date 25/02/2021**

**Day 1:** We were supposed to reach on campus the evening before (March 21) for our documents verification, FPM related presentation (slide-show cum short film made by the current FP students) and a discussion session with the Area Seniors.

**288 candidates** had been called for the interviews (all areas combined, the areas being Economics, Finance and Control, Human Resource Management, Management Information Systems, Marketing, Operations Management, Organizational Behaviour, Public Policy and Management, Strategic Management). The shortlisting was done on the basis of **CAT/GRE/GMAT/GATE/JRF Score, Statement of Purpose** (VERY IMPORTANT) and **3 letters of recommendation** (from Professors, preferably, since it's a research based course).

All interview candidates were provided accommodation inside the IIM C hostels and we had a great time taking a tour of the pretty campus.

**Day 2:** We had to report at 8 am in the auditorium of the New Academic Building where we had to wait patiently for our names to be called for the Personal Interviews.

I had been shortlisted for 2 specializations: Operations Management, Finance & Control. I got called for the Finance interview at first. There were 2 panels. My panel had 3 faculty members (1 old male prof P1, 1 young male prof P2, 1 female prof P3). I was the first person in my panel to be interviewed.

Me: Sir, may I come in?

P1: Yes, but you are a Bengali. Why study Hindi as first language? Oh, and please take your seat.

Me: Explained

P1: You've basically an Operations Management candidate. You've done nothing related to finance prior to this. Do you think we should take you? You must be having your OM interview next. Come, let me ask you some OM questions, as a mock interview for your next interview.

Me: Sir, I have no previous finance experience as such but I follow finance news regularly and I hope during the 1st 2 years I'll be able to learn more about the subject in order to undertake research.

P3: You can read books on finance if you're SO inclined towards the subject. Or maybe even apply for a Master's. Why PhD?

P1 (interrupting): So I see that in your SoP you've mentioned that you're interested in Operations Research. That's fine. But why Total Quality Management?

P1 — Agricultural background means your father is a farmer?

Me — Yes sir

P1 — Okay

Me — Apart from studies I like acting and singing. I got first prize in monologue competition held at Delhi University. I also participated in various singing competitions.

P2 — Why you want to do LSM?

Me — LSM is a blend of liberal studies as well as management. In this we get to study both the things together.

P2 — What do you know about liberal studies?

Me — It is people's study like we get to study about psychology, history, etc.

P2 — It is also taught in traditional PGP as well. i only teach it. Then why LSM?

**Panel:** Panel 5. Two professors (both of them were middle aged, around 40 years old)

**WAT:** India should take a protectionist attitude to resolve unemployment.

**Interview:**

One of the interviewers called me inside. Both of them looked at ease and both were smiling. The one who had called me inside started examining my application form. He asked me to sign and then asked for my folder to look at my grade sheets. I unzipped the folder and handed it over.

**Q1.** So Anik, I see that you have studied at VIT University. Where are you working now?

**Ans:** Sir, I'm presently working in ITC Ltd in the packaging and printing division in Chennai.

**Q2.** Okay. I see that you have mentioned in your role that you are in procurement and you procure board in the form of reels...

**Ans:** Yes sir, I procure paperboard. (I explained in a crisp answer that I procure board in the form of reels specifically catering to the cigarette packaging applications.

**Q3.** Cigarettes? Okay. So do you think selling cigarettes is ethical?

**Ans.** Mentioned that it is. Explained that cigarettes are a huge source of employment for the people. Explained how Indian Tobacco division employs people, Packaging employs people and ultimately the paper mills also employ people. Explain how it adds to the Indian economy. Mentioned that the 85% health warning makes people aware about the ill effects of smoking. So it is down to choice.

**Q4.** You talk about choice. Say I put a blanket ban on cigarettes. Then you are forced to not smoke right? Don't you think that would benefit the masses? No more diseases, no cancer.

**Ans:** Sir, assuming that a blanket ban was put, it still wouldn't affect the tobacco trade as a whole. It would seriously affect the legal trade of cigarettes. But that is only 11% of the entire trade. Chewable tobacco like gutkha and beedis would still exist. The illegal, unregulated trade would flourish and it would be more harmful.

**Q5.** Okay. You studied at VIT right? How were your fees? Reasonable? or very high?

**Ans:** Sir, when I studied, it was pretty reasonable.

**Q6.** (The other interviewer interrupted here) Okay, say your teacher gives you a free choice in VIT to use or not use mobiles in class, then the entire class would be disrupted right? People wouldn't pay attention.

**Ans:** Sir, if the class is engaging enough, then people will pay attention irrespective of the choice they have been given.

**Q7.** Okay. But we are not talking about that. Relate this to an ITC perspective regarding what we were discussing now.

**Ans:** Sir, like you had mentioned a blanket ban of cigarettes by the government. Say the teacher puts a ban on mobile phones, students would still use it during some emergency or just hide and use it. I don't think just forcing someone to do something works.

**Q8.** Okay, I see that you have mentioned your role as procurement. Please explain what you do.

**Ans:** Explained how I order paperboards.

**Q9.** (Cutting me off) So you just place orders as and when you have demand? How tough is that?

**Ans:** No sir. (I explained the entire process, the volumes, the complex planning process etc)

**Q10.** So what kind of contracts do you have in place with these suppliers. You are in contact with them right?

**Ans.** Explained

**Q11.** You are saying that there are no contracts?

**Ans:** Explained that most of the time the customer nominates the board and the supplier. Hence we do not have much leeway there. Mentioned that the price agreement was the contract.

**Q12.** So you haven't gone into depth regarding the contracts.

**Ans:** Sir, I may have missed something. But as far as my knowledge is concerned, I'm fairly sure that there are no separate contracts in place.

**Q13.** Okay Anik. Tell me. What other calls do you have?

**Ans:** Mentioned all my other calls

**Q14.** Tell me about your background. What do your parents do?

**Ans:** Mentioned about my father's business of manufacturing industrial adhesives and said that my mother was a housewife.

**Q15.** Industrial adhesives?

**Ans:** Explained how it was used in conveyor belt joining in the industry.

**My view:** I tried to maintain my composure and ensured that I kept a smile throughout and maintained eye contact with both interviewers. I never lost my smile and I noticed that I didn't fumble and rarely used filler words. The only question where I felt I could have done was the Q11. I should have mentioned that a purchase order is a contract. I could have mentioned terms like CIF ( Cost, insurance and freight) and CFR ( Cost and freight) and that payment is generally due 60 days from bill of lading.

Q) What is China doing in the Indian ocean and why India is not happy?

- First thought they were referring to one belt one road. But they said no. Then I said China is building naval bases in the ocean and India doesn't like it.

S: Answered.

M1: Suppose a Company wants to invest Rs. 1,00,000 and needs to raise funds for it. Which out of Equity or Debt should be chosen to finance the investment, provided the Company is not heavily leveraged?

S: Got confused between concepts a little and couldn't answer clearly. ☹

M1: What is Beta?

S: Answered

M1: What is SML and CML?

S: Answered

M1: Suppose workers of a construction company go on a strike. Would that be systematic or unsystematic risk?

S: Unsystematic Risk since this issue doesn't affect the entire construction industry as a whole. Also, it can be eliminated to some extent by sitting down with stakeholders and finding solutions to the grievances of the workers.

S: Talked about reading novels with the themes of Women Empowerment, Feminism, and Powerful female personalities of the past and present.

M2: Okay, so we are giving you a topic to speak on. You will have around 30 seconds to gather your thoughts and then about 1.5 minutes to speak on it.

You don't have to agree with this topic, personally, but you still have to speak in favour of it.



The topic is, **“Technology has done more for the Feminist Movement than women speaking up for the cause.”**

S: Dividing this into two parts:

Women speaking up: There have a few examples where speaking up has had a negative impact on the cause, mainly due to differences in ideologies, race, cultures, incomes, etc. Thus, speaking up has, sometimes, backfired due to intersectionality and diversity.

For e.g.: In 2017, around the time when Donald Trump had his inauguration, women around the country decided to do a Women’s March. However, the overall impact of the movement was diminished due to an internecine disagreement between White women and the minority women, wherein white women were advised to support but leave the raising of important issues to the marginalised sections of Women as they have a much more vivid idea of the oppressions and biases towards the community. This didn’t go down well with the majority of white women who felt they were being side-lined.

Benefit of Technology: The most recent example of Technology giving an impetus to the cause of Women Empowerment is the “#metoo” movement. The MeToo movement was started in 2006 by Tarana Burke. However, with there not being enough technological prowess at the time, the movement couldn’t reach many people. Fast forward to 2017, the Harvey Weinstein misconducts brought the movement back into the limelight and it picked up throughout the world with women coming up with their stories of misconduct and harassment. The reason for this global reach was the internet connectivity which brought stories from around the world to people and gave them the strength to speak up themselves.

(**Note:** I personally don’t agree with the topic because it diminishes the contribution of the amazing womxn and allies who have championed the cause by their sheer bravery and courage to speak up. But, as my panelist put it, I had to behave like a lawyer and agree even when I didn’t! :p)
