Interview discussion Pointers – (as per IIM-I experiences of last five years)

Be completely prepared with anything and everything on the form.

They will go into details of everything you speak about in the interview. (level1- what do you know about Indian Economy, level2- what do you think about GST, level3- how has GST affected the sector you work in).

They can ask about your hobbies and interests.

It is absolutely fine to ask for time before you answer (they often expect you to think about a solution when they ask you about a problem at hand).

It is fine if you are anxious and you need not portray a brave face being real with your emotions is better.

Be prepared to answer everything about your work experience or about your favourite subjects if you are a fresher.

You'll now be given an extempore phrase. You'll have 2 minutes to organise your thoughts on the notepad and then, you'll speak for approximately 2-3 minutes

My topic was 'Keep an eye on...."

Did my best to gather my thoughts and tried my best to speak considering different aspects of interpretation

Both panelists were very actively and patiently listening all throughout the interview. Never interrupted. M was also reassuring, although F maintained an expressionless face but a convinced attitude.

Next were a series of HR questions on my profile, my Master's from abroad, many follow-ups on long term goals and why MBA, etc.

I was then quizzed on some basic Chemistry questions like strength of acids, used of Calcium nitrate, Carbon compounds, etc.

Over to M, he asked me a generic puzzle and then a mathematics problem, which luckily I could solve in a very brief time and he seemed convinced. He then asked me a bunch of questions how I could draw a relation between my Background in Chemistry and my future in Management.

I was also asked to explain in detail the steps and concept behind Hypothesis testing, t test, etc. Although I was not very confident, I tried my best and he was also very helpful in organising my thoughts and seemed convinced with the overall explanation through a research problem example.

Next, he asked me about international laws on fission and fusion reactions which unfortunately I didn't have a lot of command over as he was looking for a very specific law. I mentioned 2-3 laws which I was aware of. However, he was very accommodating and appreciated whatever little I could manage to mention.

Finally, they asked me a few questions about my extra curriculars and my personal background and asked me to take a toffee and wished me well.

Overall, it was a decent experience, and the panelists were very calm and composed. No grilling. However, questions demanded thorough understanding and eloquent explanation.

Interview Experience – 15

Background: I had only one call. It was from IIM Shillong. I honestly did not know whether I should be happy or depressed. I had around 3 months to prepare for the interview but I had decided to start my preparation only in March. So here is my experience in exact words:

CAT Percentile: 97.84

Profile: General Category, Engineer, Male with no work experience.

Academics: Class X → 9.6/10 (approximately 91%), Class XII → 93.7% (Intermediate), B.Tech in Electronics and Computer Engineering (ECM) → 86%

Extracurricular Activities: Marketing Head and Board Member of a student run NGO, NSS Team Lead, Marketing Deputy of The Robotics Club, Mentor in The Robotics Club and passive participant in a few other clubs.

Group Discussion and Interview:

The interview was at Hotel Fortune Park JP Celestial. I had been allotted the morning slot and I was asked to report at 8:30AM. IIM Shillong is the only IIM which has a case based GD. I had my GD along with 6 other candidates.

The case was a really simple case. It was about a cake manufacturing company which was facing losses for the past few months and had a personal brand of cakes. It was given an opportunity to become a subcontractor for another company. So, we were asked to suggest the right course of action. I felt that my personal performance was decent in terms of my ability to come up with new points and also be clear in my communication. I would rate my performance in the GD as 4/5. However, I felt that the performance of the group was below average. The group members were not willing to discuss new concepts or ideas but were coming with a fixed mindset in terms of the conclusion. The entire GD had reached its conclusion in the start itself. My attempts to bring in new points or ideas were greeted coldly or were directly shot down by some of the group members. So, I would rate the group performance as 3/5.

I was the third candidate from my group to be interviewed. The panel consisted of two members. The first member was an old (in my view at least 60), highly experienced male professor and the second was a middle aged professor. Let's call the old professor **P1** and the middle aged professor **P2**. **P1** and **P2** had also been the moderators in the GD. I already had a differentiating point even before being interviewed. I was the person with the A3 sized application form. My application form made me the famous, different guy in the eyes of the professors and also the staff assisting them. I was repeatedly asked about the size of my application form. Now I will cut to the chase and start with the interview experience.

P1 came to the waiting hall and called me inside. I went inside and I was waiting for **P1** to enter so I could close the door. Meanwhile, **P2** asked me to sit twice. I took my seat and then **P1** entered so I got up to close the door. **P2** was surprised by my actions. I was also surprised by my actions. I don't know why I was fixated on the door. I guess it was because I was really excited.

Me (Smiling): Good morning sir (looking towards P1) and Good morning sir (looking towards P2)

P1 and P2: Good morning!

P2: Please give me your folder and also give your application form to P1.

I quickly remove the folded A3 sized paper and give my folder to P2. I unfold my application form and immediately the size of the paper is pointed to me again. I smiled and told them the problem with the photo while printing the form on an A4 sized paper. P1 was looking at my application form while P2 was randomly opening my folder.

P2: Oh so you are from Hyderabad? Where do you stay in Hyderabad?

Me: Yes sir, I am from Hyderabad. I am currently staying in Secunderabad.

P2: How did you come here?

Me (*Sensing danger because I did not prepare anything related to the train*): Sir I traveled by train.

P2: Did you come here today or yesterday? Which train did you board, the overnight one or the morning one?

Me: I came here yesterday. I took the overnight train.

P2: Are you going back today? (*He asked me this because I had taken my huge travel bag to the GD room because of instructions from the Admissions Team about personal property. This was also because I had accidentally knocked over a fellow candidate while taking the lift and P2 was in the lift while this happened*)

Me: No, Sir I am leaving tomorrow.

P2 (*grinning*): Oh that's nice! Have fun in the afternoon and tomorrow

Me (*Thinking is he being sarcastic or making fun of me?*): I calmly smiled and thanked him.

P2: So, tell me the difference between Hyderabad and Secunderabad?

Me (*I had seen a park or some garden before entering the hotel*): Sir, Hyderabad and Secunderabad are twin cities. The only major difference is that Hyderabad has more parks than Secunderabad. Hyderabad also has more places of amusement.

P2 (*Smiling*): I wanted the answer in terms of the difference in culture.

Me: Sir, there is no difference in terms of the culture. Both cities have people with heart of gold.

P2: That I will agree with.

P1 (*Jumps in suddenly*): You are a Gujarati.

Me: Yes sir!

P1: What are you doing in Hyderabad? When did you shift there?

Me: Sir, I am born and brought up in Hyderabad. My grandparents shifted to Hyderabad.

P1: You must be having a business? I mean your grandfather must have started a business?

Me: No sir. My grandfather was a farmer. He had expertise in producing special variety of high quality grapes.

P1: Is your father a farmer too?

Me: No sir.

P2: What does your father do?

Me: *I told them what my father does.*

P2: Why didn't your father continue to be a farmer like your grandfather?

Me: Sir, the land on which my grandfather grew grapes was owned by some other person. By the time my father grew up, the zamindar had decided to sell the land. So, my father couldn't become a farmer. My father also did not have the expertise that my grandfather had.

P1 (Excitedly): But you are a Shah? Everything right from the application form to the profession of your family is weird!

Me: You could say that sir!

P1: Shahs are generally traders or businessmen, right?

Me (*Seizing the moment*): Yes sir. I hope to run a business in the future as a leader so I will change that about my family hopefully!

P2 and P1 both smile and they continue to the next round of questioning.

P1: You mentioned that you love participating in debates? Where do you participate and how often do you participate in them?

Me: I am a member of a club in my college. I participate in most of the debates conducted by them. I have also won a few debates. (*I spoke about the wins*)

P1: When was your last debate?

Me: Sir, my last debate was very recent. I was selected to represent my college at a debate conducted by the Britain Embassy. They conduct debates once a year across the country.

P1: What was the topic given?

Me (*thinking*): I did not speak for some time and then I apologized saying that I can't remember.

P1: That's all right if you can't remember. Did you win the debate?

Me: No sir! Unfortunately I couldn't win the debate.

P1: Why so?

Me: Sir, they had called up many teams but they selected only few teams.

P1: How many teams were called? How many were selected?

Me: They called 80 teams for the first round but selected only 4 teams for the semi-final round. They divided the 80 teams into 4 pools and selected 2 teams from each pool. They did not declare winners for each debate but they selected 2 teams even when they debated with each other.

P1: So, you didn't win? (*Looks towards P2*)

Me: Yes, sir!

P1: You mentioned that you worked as a Marketing Head of an NGO. What was your role and what did you do there?

Me (*Explained what I did*): Explained how I rose through the ranks as a volunteer and became the Marketing Head after a really good performance. Explained how I was responsible for engaging with companies and fund raising.

P1: Oh! How much money did you raise?

Me: I along with my team raised Rs 2 Lakh.

P1: So, how do you utilize this money?

Me: Every year, the team decides to take up a cause and we implement it for all the government schools around our college. I told them about the past projects that we had undertaken and then I spoke about the projects undertaken using the money that my team raised. I also told them about other activities being undertaken by the team like Science Fair for the students.

P1: When did the NGO start? Who started it? Why did you specifically become the Marketing Head?

Me: I told them the date when it started and the seniors who started it. I told them that those seniors handpicked me for the role as the Marketing Head after observing my performance.

P1: Who keeps track of money?

Me: The volunteers who are students. This is voluntary work so interested students take part.

P1: What are the other activities that you do?

Me: I am the NSS team Lead in my college. I lead a team there and we do a lot of activities. My team has done the highest number of activities. Some of the best voluntary work in my college was undertaken by my team.

P1 (*Smiles*): says something inaudible

Me (*Assuming it was a question about NSS*): I start speaking about the activities that my team completed but I am interrupted before I can say something more.

P1 (*A little Sternly*): I asked if you read books?

Me: Yes, Sir!

P1: How often do you read them?

Me: Not as often as I would like to read them sir.

P1 (*Smiles*): When do you read them? Not as often meaning?

Me: I read them when I am travelling in the bus to college or before sleeping (I wanted to say even in my useless classes but somehow I maintained my composure). I meant that I am an enthusiastic reader but I don't get enough time to read.

P1 (With raised eyebrows): What are you reading currently?

Me: I started reading And the Mountains Echoed by Khaled Hosseini recently. I told him the essence of what I had read until then.

P1: Have you read other books written by him? How many books has he written till now?

Me: I have read some of the other books written by him. I am aware of three books written by him.

P1: Tell me the names of the other books he has written?

Me: I told him about The Kite Runner. I couldn't remember the other book that I read, which was written by him. So, I told him the summary of The Kite Runner.

P1: Who is your favorite author?

Me: My favorite authors are Dan Brown and Jeffery Archer.

P1: Tell me the names of the books written by Dan Brown in the order in which you read them?

Me (Thinking that he is an avid reader): I took the names of The Digital Fortress, Angels and Demons and DaVinci Code. (*My mind was recollecting the kiss in the movie Angels and Demons. I kind of had a crush on the actress so I was smiling while answering this*)

P1: Tell me the summary of The Da Vinci Code?

Me (Looking at him with wide eyes because for some reason I had forgotten the story that too just now and also because I was snapped back to reality from my day dream): I told him a vague answer about saving the lives of people by breaking the Da Vinci code.

P1 sensed my discomfort I think and decided to spare my life. He did not press me on this answer.

P1: Did you develop this habit of reading just a few months ago or have been reading from before? Who helped you develop this habit?

Me (Thinking whether I should tell them about the person who helped me develop this wonderful habit of reading. But in the end my mind won the battle against the heart and I decided not to tell them about the person): No sir! I have this habit of reading from earlier. (*Both P1 and P2 were expecting a detailed answer I think*)

P1: What newspaper do you read?

Me: I read The Hindu.

P1: Do you read the online version or the hard copy?

Me: The hard copy.

P1: How often do you read it?

Me: Sir, I read it every day.

P1: Do you read the editorial page?

Me: Yes sir.

P1: Did you read yesterday's editorial?

Me: No sir! I did not have access to yesterday's newspaper.

P1: Tell me about day before yesterday's editorial?

Me (*Did not remember things perfectly*): I started speaking about an article I read about the upcoming presidential elections in Iran. *I got interrupted here by P1.*

P1: You know what the editorial means right? It's not an article. It's the opinion of the editor.

Me: yes sir! The article had the opinion about the election in Iran and how many candidates have registered for that. The previous presidents have also registered again for the elections.

P1: Ok! Do you read the business news?

Me: Yes sir!

P1: Tell me something about recent business articles?

Me: I spoke about the Flipkart investment round and the impending merger of Snapdeal with Flipkart.

P1 (*Not looking satisfied*): Tell me something about government policy which might affect the business world?

Me (*Couldn't recollect any particular policy*): I told them that the most recent policy change that's going to change the way business is done is GST.

P1: What is GST?

Me: Told them about GST. I ended by telling that it will create a single market across India.

P1: What do you mean by that single market? India is one only right?

Me: Sir by single market, I mean it will create a uniform tax structure across India. The taxes currently vary from state to state. GST will simplify this by ensuring uniform tax regime across India.

P1: How will it be administered?

Me: GST council has been appointed to look after the functioning. The GST council consists of members from the Central Finance Minister and ministers of finance from each state.

P1 looks satisfied and turns towards P2 who has been the silent knight all along. P1 asks P2 to continue.

P2: All my life I have met people from Electronics or Instrumentation but never from Electronics and Computer Engineering!

Me (*Elated that I the first at something at least*): I politely smile and tell him how this branch is present in only few colleges in India. It's a really good branch having the best of faculties from both electronics and Computers (*My brain is ironically laughing at my statement.*). I also tell them how this branch gives an opportunity for confused students to get the experience of the best of both world of electronics and computers (*My mind is seriously laughing again*).

P2: So even you were confused when you took this course?

Me (*Thinking of how he can manipulate my answer if I say yes*): No sir! I wanted to experience the world of hardware as well as software so I took up this branch.

P2 looks satisfied and opens my folder again to look at my engineering score cards. I am praying to god and chanting "Please no electronics. Please no transistors or circuits". God listens to me and luckily P2 asked me questions only from CS.

P2: Since you studied DWDM recently, tell me the three schemas from Data Warehousing and Data Mining?

Me: I told the names of the schemas named Star and Snowflakes. Couldn't remember the third ones name and was also confused about the technical concepts related to the schemas so I took a minute and told him that I was unable to recollect it at the moment despite studying it recently.

P2: Tell me the object oriented programming concepts?

Me: Told about Encapsulation, Abstraction, Polymorphism, Inheritance.

P2 interrupts me and asks me to explain Polymorphism in detail. I explain about the basic definition of polymorphism. Then I speak about runtime polymorphism and compile time. I speak about each case and explain the concepts of Overloading and Overriding.

P2: Asks me the use of Kernel? (*After looking into my marks sheet and finding that I scored less in SPSL aka shell programming and scripting languages*)

Me: I explain about kernel and how it is program that runs always. Then I speak about the resource management and hardware management by the OS and how OS passes instructions to Kernel which is responsible for final usage by the hardware.

P2: Tell me something about TCP/IP ?

Me: Told the full forms and how they form the basis for safe communication using the Internet.

P2: Tell me about the layers in TCP and how many are there?

Me: I could remember that there were 4 layers and the names of only two initially.

P2 (Sternly): Tell me the names in the correct order?

Me: I told him that I will first tell the order using the OSI model. Then, I go on to TCP/IP model and I explained the difference between the OSI and TCP/IP model. I finally told him the order of the layers and their functionality. (*In my mind I was thanking my friend Siddharth who had told all boys a really nice way to remember all the protocol layers. I was laughing at that joke*)

P2 (*Looks deeply into my mark sheets*): What subject is Product Service and Design and why did you study that?

Me: Sir, it's an elective that I took up because I feel that as an Engineer I have the ability to have incremental innovation. But I can't personally design or even think of making a new product. I wanted to get some perspective on that so I took up that subject.

P2: Do you know what disruptive innovation is?

Me: Yes sir! I gave the example of how startups come up with new ideas or differentiate themselves in terms of the business process and that is considered disruptive by the market generally.

P2: How was your academic performance in college?

Me: I told him how I performed to the best of my ability despite juggling so many things. I also told him that I have always been in the top 5-10% of my batch of 130 students. I ended by telling him that I had also topped the first year of my college.

P2 (*Looks into my marks sheet again*): What did you study in Project Management and Structured Finance?

Me: *I start off by telling him that it was an elective that I chose. Before I could respond he interrupts me and asks me to tell the difference between PERT and CPM.*

Me: I explain the concept of PERT and CPM and tell him how CPM helps determine the worst case scenario in terms of the path or the worst possible time frame in which the project will be completed.

P2: Which one among PERT and CPM is probabilistic?

Me: *I answer PERT with a confused facial expression.*

P2 (*coyly*): Are you sure? You seem to be confused! It's Ok, I am done!

P2 looks to P1 and they decide that they are done with my interview and they ask me to leave.

Me: Thank you so much for your time and the opportunity!

They look at me like an alien with a puzzled expression. I felt that they wanted to tell me something but they didn't. I gave them a no holds barred 20000 watt smile and left the room. While we were waiting in the waiting hall sipping the tea served to us, there was a sir who explained the whole process to us and gave us our panel number and serial numbers. He seemed to be a native of Shillong because he passionately spoke about various things in Shillong and Meghalaya. He spoke about the language, culture, interesting social customs, politics and local tourist attractions of Shillong. It calmed our nerves and made us feel comfortable. Then our interview panelists arrived in the hall and took us upstairs to our respective interview rooms.

They conducted a GD and then asked us to wait outside for our turn to be called in for the interview.

My panelists:

P1: Professor Subhadip Mukherjee

P2: Professor Sanjita Jaipuria

Group Discussion

Topic: You are incharge of an earthquake relief camp. You have to send 20 Medical consignments to Place A immediately to save lives of people there. You don't have any medicines with you right now. You phoned some private doctors and they agreed to send 80% of medicines tomorrow.

Meanwhile 11 consignments were sent by govt but when they were being sent to place A, Dinesh, the nephew of local MP stopped the vehicle midway and took the consignments away to his village which is place B which is also affected by the earthquake.

How will you handle this situation?

It was a 250-300 worded case. 3 minutes were given to read and understand the problem and write down the points. 10 minutes were given to discuss. We were 9 people in the group, we worked collectively and arrived at a common solution. The time was not enough to understand the case completely. When asked to start, none of us started speaking as we were still reading the case. However, one guy initiated the discussion. I did not start the discussion but spoke 4-5 times in between. I noted down all the points and at the end, I was concluding the discussion by repeating all the points, when P1 sir cut me off and said that the time is up. Overall, it was decent GD.

Due to the prevailing COVID-19 situation **IIM Shillong** interview was held online. Case based GD which also was part of admission process was scrapped this year. **So in final selection, 70 percent weightage was given to Personal Interview and remaining 30 percent to CAT score.**

There were two professors, one male (M) and one female (F). Interview commenced with initial greetings.

F - Tell us about yourself including your hobbies.

Me - Told well prepared answer.

F - **Vijay hazare trophy is awarded in which sport?(Even though I didn't mention sports as my hobby)**

Me - Ma'am its for Cricket.

F - **Okay! then Duleep trophy?**

Me - Ma'am this also is for cricket only.

F - **Tell me one trophy which used to be there but now it's not being held?**

Me - Thought for sometime, but couldn't answer. Said sorry.

F - **Tell me about history of Chhattisgarh (my home state).**

Me - Covered from very ancient time. Lord Sri Ram's mother was born here that's why it was known as Dakshin kausala in ancient times. Then talked about Kalachuri dynasty that ruled for decades, Maratha empire then colonial British. Ended the answer with its demarcation out of MP in 2001.

F - **Tell me about history of cricket.**

Me- Told from colonial British time to now.

F - **Famous Tabla players? (I am prolific Tabla player in case you want to know from where this question came from)**

Me- Told briefly about Ustaad Zakhir Hussain, Ustaad Alla Rakha and Pandit Anindo Chatterjee.

M - **So you are civil engineer?**

Me - Yes ma'am

M- **What are fascinating civil engineering structures being built in India or already built?**

Me - Talked about highest Bridge in world being built in Jammu and Kashmir (Chenab bridge), it's features (blast proof, wind sensors, earthquake resistant), then talked about Ram mandir (it's structural features, difficulties being faced, how they are proceeding), Statue of unity.

Now M takes the charge

M - **Are you comfortable with concrete technology?**

Me - Yes sir!

P2- **Why concrete is weak in tension?**

Me - Answered.

M - **How compressive strength of concrete is found? Unit? What does M indicates? How much strength concrete gains in 28 days? In 14 days?**

Me - Answered all.

M - *If concrete is weak in tension, how we used it?*

Me - Told about RCC and PSC and explained him deeply.

M - *Do you know speciality about Howrah bridge?*

Me- Talked about it not having any piers, it being doubly balanced cantilever beam and explained him about how it resists bending moment and it is made up of 25600 tonnes of high tensile alloy steel from Tiscrom (TATA).

M - *Define Surface tension and viscosity?*

Me - Defined

M - *What you know about IIM Shillong?*

Verdict - Converted

My two cents about IIM interview processes - If you are a fresher, be ready to deal with graduation questions. So, please revise your graduation subjects before interview. You should be well versed with concepts of at least common subjects of your graduation stream. You should also know about current happenings in the country in your graduation field. Interviewers will expect you to know about history and current happenings of your home state. Do a thorough research about the institute whose interview you are appearing. I read articles about IIM Shillong on InsideIIM and also skimmed through their website to know about their clubs. Also have a command on current affairs. There will be few questions that would be thrown at you just to unsettle you. So, don't lose your calm and patience over those questions. Don't judge your interview based on number of questions answered. Just give your best and you are good to go!

It was my first interview for the season and for preparation, I majorly went through basics of statistics, and other subjects of graduation and tried to keep myself updated about Budget and other major current affairs.

So, I reached the venue at 8:00 am since it was first offline interview for me. Not only was I very excited but also not at all nervous, the reason being, I felt that there are still 8–10 interviews left and this will just be a practice interview for me if nothing else, so I talked to people, click pictures and finally went for verification of documents.

So, the process was that documents will be verified by the panelists during your interview itself, so before GD and interview, we just had to sign attendance sheet.

When we were waiting in the waiting room for our panel and serial number to be announced, sir (who was monitoring everything in the waiting room) told us about IIM Shillong culture and how they have women leaders in east and how they use their mothers' name as middle name etc and I was literally so fascinated by how calmly he was explaining.

We went for GD first, My panel number was 5, we were 9 people and one was absent.

GD Topic (It was case rather than topic): Something on a company who was well established and were looking for launching a new product and they had their USP so what should be pricing strategy?

Surprisingly, I initiated and said that they should go for Value based pricing or competitive pricing and all others who spoke after me said that they should go for price skimming, I was kind of little worried about that but I think it didn't matter much as people have their own opinions and its ok but there were three people who either didn't speak or didn't get chance to speak even if they wanted so I strongly advise all of you to be not in that category.

Now, I was third one to be interviewed and two candidates before me said that more or less the interview was chill but they definitely covered everything from current affairs to core grad subjects, but it somehow just didn't make me worried, I was just happy to meet people and about the fact that I was finally attending an IIM interview.

Here's my interview experience

P1 and P2, both male, maybe in mid 30s

P1 opened door and called out my name

I went inside

I greeted and P2 greeted back, P1 was looking at my shillong form

P2 asked me to hand over the documents

He started verifying it

P1 started with interview,

So bansi you are from?

- Gujarat

In which part of Gujarat

- sir porbandar western Gujarat

Ok tell me about Rann of Kutch

- talked about desert, northern part of Gujarat, their cultural significance etc

P1: from security perspective

- sir it is also on border of India and Pakistan and there is high security there, there is something or other going on however I don't remember anything reading about it recently

P1: okay do you know about smart city

Tried to explain about digitization and literacy and suddenly realized that accessibility of electricity is what defines smart city so said about it

P1 plans of your cm for Gujarat

Told that current cm is elected overnight because of political reasons and will focus on infrastructural and educational development, started by previous cm

P1 asked about solar energy

Told

DATE - 15/03/2022

1. VERIFICATION OF DOCUMENTS(8.10 am - 9.20 am)

All the students were asked to report by 8 am. Soon after that registrations started. We had to present the following documents as asked in the interview call letter.

1) Cat scorecard /cat admit card

- 2) interview call letter
- 3) pre-interview form
- 4) original photo id

Then we were briefed about the entire process as the number of panelists and students in each of them. 9- 10 students were grouped in one and each panel consisted of 2 professors for the personal interview. This process took approximately an hour. At 9.15 panelists came in and called out the names of each student so that students can join their respective groups one by one.

2. GROUP DISCUSSION(9.45am - 10.10 am)

At 9.30 I was in a room along with 8 other students for Group discussion. We were asked to sit tag wise(each one was assigned a tag from 1 to 9). We had a case study before us which had to be done in 13 minutes(3+10). So each of us was given a sheet of paper with a case printed. We had 3 minutes to read and analyze and next 10 minutes to discuss it at length.

The case before us: -

A driver with 15-year work experience and good behavior was promoted as a personal driver of Managing director of a large public sector company. On a day, after a long tiring trip, he took the vehicle to his own house rather than parking it at the office, which was against office norms. On that very day, he killed an 8-year-old girl who was crossing road hastily. The driver tried to save that girl but it all happened so quickly, that he could not save her. He was taken to custody but was later released from the law of land due to lack of enough evidence. Now you are managing director of the company. Decide what course of action you would take keeping that fact that taking office vehicle to home was against companies rules and regulations?

After the group discussion, all of us were asked to wait while the personal interview would take place one by one.

3. PERSONAL INTERVIEW(11.45am - 12.10 pm)

At 11.45 after waiting for a good one and a half hour, I was called in for an interview.

There was 2 panelist as mentioned before. A professor aged around 35 (Y1)and other around 55 (O2). As I went inside I was asked to sit in.

Y1: How are you Praveen?

Me: I am good sir.

Y1: You are from Banaras Hindu University. What its called in Hindi?

Me: Sir, In Hindi, it's Kashi Hindu Viswavidyalaya

Y1: what is the difference between Kashi and Banaras?

Me: Sir, Kashi is an old name that means "city of light" and this word is mentioned in Rig Veda. While Banaras is also an old name. The new name is Varanasi. As Britishers found it difficult to pronounce Varanasi, they used Banaras.

Y1: Do you follow recent news? What sort of news do you keep an eye on?

Me: Yes Sir, I do follow national and international news and I am well aware of current affairs. I also sometimes follow regional news.

Y1: Tell me something that happened recently.

Me: Talked about India withdrawing MFN (Most favoured nation) from Pakistan. Talked about government steps on this issue.

Y1: During the last terror attack, there were talks about India withdrawing MFN status from Pakistan but didn't take it. What's your say in it?

Me: India believes in negotiations and not against direct attack. We believe that terror attacks happen because of a few terrorist organization and we should take action against them rather than taking action against Pakistan. India thus giving one more chance to Pakistan did not take this step although our leaders did discuss this option.

O2 was listening all this very carefully without any questions. It was difficult to analyze what he was thinking and how he was rating my performance.

Y1: Heard anything about the indigo issue that's currently in the news

Me: No Sir, I am not aware of this issue. (Indigo is currently facing a shortage of pilots and thus have to cancel many flights).

Y1: Karnataka is in news recently. Why?

Me: Could not tell (horse trading of MLA's by BJP while INC and JDU(secular) tries to form the government.

Y1: Major poltical parties in karnataka?

Me: Karnataka is represented by three major political parties, the Indian National Congress, the Janata Dal (Secular) and the Bharatiya Janata Party.

Y1: Major political parties in TN?

Me: Major parties are AIADMK and DMK.

Y1: what is AIADMK?

Me: could partially answer (All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam)

Y1: Name politicians that died in the last 2 years in TN and difference between them.

Me: M. Karunanidhi and Jayalalithaa

Y1: Difference between regional and national parties and follow up questions of whether this party is national or regional. (BSP, Trinamool Congress, AIIDMK)

Me: Partially answer (Correct answer [Praveen Kumar \(प्रवीण कुमार\)](#)'s answer to [What are the major differences between a national and a regional political party?](#))

Y1: what is the difference between NDA and UPA?

Me: The **National Democratic Alliance** (NDA) is a center-right coalition of political parties in India. At the time of its formation in 1998, it was led by the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and had thirteen constituent parties like Samata Party, the Shiromani Akali Dal, the Shiv Sena in addition to the All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam and the Biju Janata Dal.

The **United Progressive Alliance** (UPA) is a coalition of center-left political parties in India formed after the 2004 general election. few parties are Rashtriya Janata Dal and DMK.

Y1: what it consists of?

Me: mentioned a few (correct answer is given above)

Y1: why Shillong is famous apart from being a hill station?

Me: Shillong is famous for bamboo handicrafts. it is known as Scotland of east and is also famous for football clubs. (I knew a lot more about this place but was point blank at that time. *This is an important question and I would advise preparing well for this question*).

Y1: Why the name Meghalaya?

Me: It is a combination of two words: Megham meaning clouds and alayam meaning abode. Hence, in its entirety, Meghalaya signifies abode of the clouds.

Y1: Famous tribes in that region?

Me: Could not answer (Meghalaya tribes can mainly be classified into three groups - Garos, Khasis, and Pnars or Jaintias.)

Now O2 starts asking the question...

O2: You took political science in 4th semester? What did you study over there?

Me: Told him that it was about gender discrimination and inequality. (He did not seem satisfies with the answer.)

O2: What you studied in probability?

Me: Told that I studied about probability distribution. (*Should have elaborated more on the same*). (Univariate probability distributions include the binomial distribution, the hypergeometric distribution, and the normal distribution while normal distribution is a commonly encountered multivariate distribution.).

O2: what are the type of distribution?

Me:- Told in detail (explained answer given above)

O2: Explain Bernoulli trial?

Me: explained in detail starting with definition and assumptions of Bernoulli trial. (*Bernoulli trial (or binomial trial) is a random experiment with exactly two possible outcomes, "success" and "failure", in*

which the probability of success is the same every time the experiment is conducted. Example: rolling of dice)

O2: How can we say that trials are independent?

Me: Tried to explain but he seemed not satisfied and asked twice to explain. When tried to explain using an example, O2 asked to explain the definition and in terms of exact statistical term. could not answer exactly what he wanted as an answer. (An event is independent of itself if and only if

O2: Find probability (Gave a question based on dice.) Easy one

Me: Answered correctly

O2: what did you study in operation research.

Me: Linear programming, Transport problem, Inventory problem etc...

O2: What is linear programming?

Me: answered (Linear programming (LP, also called linear optimization) is a method to achieve the best outcome (such as maximum profit or lowest cost) in a mathematical model whose requirements are represented by linear relationships.)

O2: what is a transport problem?

Me: Answered partially. could not use the right words to describe this problem. O2 did not seem satisfied and his face showed that I was heading toward *Danger zone*. (The transportation problem is a special type of linear programming problem where the objective is to minimize the cost of distributing a product from a number of sources or origins to a number of destinations. Because of its special structure, the usual simplex method is not suitable for solving transportation problems.

O2: Is transport problem a type of linear programming?

Me: Explained correctly as mentioned above but O2 was adamant not to accept my answer as correct.

O2: Pen down the structure of Linear programming model?

Me: wrote correctly on the sheet of paper. Did miss to complete optimum solution Z. (It is something like this- A linear programming problem is mathematically formulated as follows:

- **A linear function to be maximized or minimized**

e.g.

maximize $c_1 x_1 + c_2 x_2$

- **Problem constraints** of the following form

e.g.

$a_{11} x_1 + a_{12} x_2 \leq b_1$

$a_{21} x_1 + a_{22} x_2 \leq b_2$

$a_{31} x_1 + a_{32} x_2 \leq b_3$

- **Default lower bounds of zero** on all variables.

The problem is usually expressed in matrix form, and then becomes:

1. maximize $C^T x$ subject to $A x \leq B$ $x \geq 0$

O2: what is a feasible solution?

Me: Defined correctly (It satisfies the entire constraints provided in the optimization problem. The feasible region of the optimization problem is defined by all the set of the feasible solutions.)

O2: what is the basic feasible solution?

Me: Could not answer satisfactorily (A constraint is active for a particular solution if it is satisfied at equality for that solution. A basic solution that satisfies all the constraints defining or in other words, one that lies within is called a basic feasible solution.)

O2: What is the optimum solution?

Me: Answered (An optimal solution is a feasible solution where the objective function reaches its maximum (or minimum) value – for example, the most profit or the least cost. A globally optimal solution is one where there are no other feasible solutions with better objective function values.)

Y1 and O2 discuss for a second and ends it.

Soon after they Offered me a candy. I picked one.

S: Explained.

In the meantime M was silent and was either going through my certificates or was searching for something really fishy to ask questions on.

M: Coming to why you are switching, don't you think if you are bored of consulting you will leave it as you have left core?

S: Told him that I was not bored of core particularly. I was inclined more towards this domain than core. Repeated the point that I did multiple internships to figure this out.

Then came the academic questions which revolved mainly around my undergrad. Questions were fairly straightforward. I guess none of the panelists were remotely close to my undergrads and hence there was no roasting business here.

F: Suggestions on how work will continue in the new world.

S: Explained that businesses would be affected. Service businesses can continue online for now, but would be difficult to maintain in future. Manufacturing would take massive hit as demands would reduce drastically. Pharma would get a boost as demands for both medicines and vaccines would be higher and more and more investors would like to pump their money in these to get maximum benefits.

Work Ex: I taught UG & Masters level courses as a part of my doctorate and also had an opportunity to run a Randomized Control Trial(RCT) in Nairobi in 2015. Duration of my work ex was 45 months (Sep 2015-June 2019)

Panel: 2 Male (Duration ~30 mins)

Q1. Introduce yourself?

A. Told about my educational journey from undergrad in IITK to M.Phil. and then research work in Tilburg University. Mentioned my hobbies and places I have stayed/visited.

Q2. Why didn't you finish your Ph.D.?

A> Explained that my research work was not going so well in the last leg. Although, I had finished two papers the second paper still needed more refinement and I had not started on the third paper. Additionally, my teaching experience gave me an insight that this was not something I enjoyed doing so much and would like to stop. All this motivated me not to further extend my contract beyond June 2019, and thus I came back home.

Q3. What were your research areas?

A> Microfinance and International Trade. Also explained the Randomized Control Trial I helped run on the field in Nairobi.

Q4. What did you do in Microfinance?

A> I worked on setting up lending contracts which are self-enforcing and don't require a collateral, a feature prevalent in micro-finance. The Model assumes homogeneous agents where the group member chooses to work diligently and monitor his partner(costly peer monitoring) to ensure compliance. I extend the multi-agent principal-agent model with costly peer monitoring developed in Carli & Uras (2017) by relaxing the assumption of perfect monitoring. The core result of one of the agents receiving a higher expected return to compensate for higher volatility is preserved, albeit under more stringent conditions. Finally, I evaluate a threshold level of imperfect monitoring beyond which a sustainable joint-liability contract is no longer feasible.

Q5. Did you do any experimental work in your microfinance paper?

A. Told that it was a theoretical paper. I worked as Research Assistant for a project implemented Randomized Control Trial(RCT) in Nairobi, Kenya. The RCT focused on measuring the impact of adopting mobile money technology on small and medium business owners. The project targeted over 1500 business owners who were interviewed regularly over a period of 6 months. My primary responsibility was to train the personnel for undertaking the survey.

Q5. You have also done research in Game Theory in your undergrad, what was your master's thesis?

A> I worked on Ad Avoidance technologies (AAT), its effect on Media Content and reason for their increasing presence. Studied an equilibrium existence issue: AAT penetration may lead to more advertising, causing further increase in AAT and determined a unique equilibrium outcome for the equilibrium existence issue and evaluated optimum advertising level. I also examined content providers' responses to increased AAT penetration and effect of ad-avoidance on total social welfare (i.e. we considered the net effect of ad-avoidance on the sum total of producer & consumer surplus). Finally, concluded that higher AAT penetration causes increased user fees and lower advertising levels.

Q6. Can you set up a two player zero-sum game using linear programming?

A. Told that we can simulate a Prisoner's Dilemma game where the constraints will be such that the payoff from co-operating was higher for both, but unilateral deviation to noncooperation increased

that payoff for the player who deviated. This way we can pick every strategy set and run it against unilateral deviation and as such we will converge to the two possible Nash Equilibrium in the game.

Q7. Since, you have experienced the COVID-19 period how will rate the government's response towards it?

A. Started with the stimulus package of 20L crore INR and how bank reform and digital India along with it are paving the growth for faster economic growth. But, this crisis has pushed over 30% of the middle class back into poverty and government should come up with methods to put money in the hands of the populace like what US is doing. Farm laws are a step in the right direction, but the implementation could have been better.

Q8. Do you think China is still an economic center of gravity, and what can India do now to ensure it can also become one?

A. Told that China's recent actions like the COVID-19 pandemic and its actions against Uighurs and Hong Kong democracy protests have dented its public image. On the other hand, India with its vaccine diplomacy and pharma sector growth during the pandemic is well set to become a crucial player in the global value chains. Additionally, we have also started to export defense goods which are made in India which opens up another export area. Thus, we have the momentum now, and we can use this also to attract some labor force from agriculture to manufacturing sector as agriculture employs almost 66% of labor force while contributing a measly 15% to GDP which is not sustainable in the long run.

Q9. How will you handle change from academic research to MBA & corporate life?

A. I have been switching towards corporate since I came back in June 2019, and it won't be an issue. Additionally, I have gone through enough academic rigor to handle the MBA course load and my quantitative achievements show that I am capable enough to handle the workload. Age is a factor, but I have studied with & taught students from different age groups during my PhD, so it won't be an issue.

Q10. You mentioned you like reading, what are you reading nowadays?

A. Told that I am fan of historical/mythological fiction and have read Suheldev & the Shiva Trilogy by Amish. I also like Frederick Forsyth and am currently reading the Cobra which talks about an American operative trying to bring down a global cocaine cartel.

Q11. How do you get time to read multiple books?

A. Told I had a Kindle and a Kindle app on my phone which enables me to read multiple books parallelly, and I normally read when I am taking short breaks from work. Also, reading multiple books parallelly makes the experience richer and much more fun for me

Overall it was a good experience, and although I got asked questions from various domains the panel always gave me enough time and asked many follow-up questions which showed that they had a genuine interest in my profile. One of my better interview experiences in this MBA cycle

I wrote about self-awareness, more focus on healthy lifestyle, passive income, etc and linked the same to the business opportunities it has created in the given fields like cultfit, groww, etc.

Just after the WAT serial number 1,2,3 were called to wait for their interview and others including me went for snacks.

I approached the first candidate interviewed by my panel he was not happy with his interview. He was badly grilled on his academics (he had 2 years of experience). (This was the only thing I was afraid of, I was not prepared for questions on my grad, though I knew how to convince them not to ask questions from the same)

Interview (Duration- 20 minutes) -

I was 5th one to be interviewed in my Panel. There were 3 panellists - 3 Male

P1 - Male (~ 40 years)

P2 - Male (~ 40 years - Prof of Operations management)

P3 - Male (~ 35 years - Prof of Human Resource Management) (checked institute website after the interview to check their credentials)

P1 invited me in. I greeted him at the door and the remaining panellists before sitting. (They were having a look at my biodata form. I handed over my file containing all my certificates to P2)

P1 - Tell us about yourself.

Me - Told them about my home town, medals in athletics, my role in UDGHOSH (Inter college sports fest of IITK) as Head Events, my work-ex in Ninjacart and SBI

P3 - Tell me what Ratlam (my home town) is famous for?

Me - Sir, It's famous for the 3 S's (Sev, Saree and Sona (gold)). Also said I am working hard to be the 4th S's (S - Shubham). All the panellists had a good laugh including me. (icebreaker for me)

P1 - So, why are you willing to leave govt. job?

Me - Told them about slow growth and monotonicity in my current job.

P3 - But it's a dream job for many. Don't you think you are making a big mistake?

Me - Yes Sir, It's a dream for many but it is all part of the plan. It's starting point for me in the finance world. I joined SBI so as to learn about how the finance sector works and I have learnt a lot in the last 2 years and I am ready to skill myself up with MBA in Finance and move ahead in my career.

P2 was the most silent and serious one and was pointing out my marks to other panellists (It felt like they were noticing my consistency in maths)

P1 - So Shubham, Why have you joined a non-tech job after Aerospace Eng. from IITK?

Me - Sir to be frank I was not at all interested in the field that I was studying. This was because of my rank that I had to settle for this branch. But since IITK is a good brand in itself I preferred to take it for better exposure.

They all were quite surprised by my boldness in accepting this.

P3 - Means all your 4 years of Grad are a waste?

Me - I explained how I participated in sports, took various management roles in different clubs and fests, and how all this has upskilled me to grow as a manager.

Everyone seems satisfied with my response.

P2 - Since you said Aerospace was not your preference it makes no sense for us to ask you questions on it.

Me - (in my mind - This was all that I wanted)

P1 - Tell me 3 things that you like and 3 that you hate about your Job at Ninjacart?

Me - told them about

1)how I was given a free hand to innovate and try new strategies to achieve my sales target and eventually be awarded the Best Area Sales Manager, Mumbai.

2)how we were allowed to hire/interview to build our own team and train them.

3)how every single second things were changing (rigorous environment) and someone was achieving something new.

told them I didn't like only one thing which was their HR policy in which we used to fire employees frequently with a notice period of only a few days (5-6 days).

The panellist seems satisfied.

P1 - Since you want to be an investment banker (referred to my form), which firm do you want to join after your MBA?

Me - Morgan Stanley or J P Morgan.

P1 - So you might have heard recently that one of these firm (don't remember which one) has recently laid off over 10,000 employees. Don't you think you are joining a company with the same HR policy which you don't like? (Clean Bowled - That was such a good question. I was never ready for this one)

Me - I told them how this could be a business strategy/cost-cutting. (I was not confident enough)

P3 - It's not a business strategy. This is done to please investors as the stock price boosts just after the lay-off. You might be aware of this.

Me - Yes sir I am.

P1 - Tell me what will you do as a manager if the CEO of your dream company calls you and asks you to fire your 1000 executives?

Me - I told them that, I'll not fire them as this decision conflicts with my core values.

P3 - But then they'll fire you... (they all smiled)

Me - That I'll accept, it's better to lose my job instead of firing my 1000 executives, I can survive the lay-off but my executives can't.

P3 - In that case they'll first fire you and then eventually fire your 1000 executives also.

I smiled and then P3 explained that that's why we encourage students to join some good small companies.

Me - I agreed

P2 took charge (he was serious of the three)

P2 - Do you know anything about statistics?

Me - I said I know normal /Gaussian distribution

P2 - That everyone knows what else?

Me - I told Possion distribution, Binomial distribution, CLT

P2 - What does 'k' represents in the formula of Poisson distribution?

Me - Told

P2 - What is lamda in the formula (poisson distribution)?

Me - Told but was confused

P2 then explained me the difference

P1 - We are done Shubham thank you

I thanked them and left the interview room with confidence.

Took a break and then headed again for snacks (LOL).

Verdict - CONVERTED!

P1: (Taking my files and asking me to sit)

So you've mentioned in your form that one of your weaknesses is that you over contemplate on things. Tell me more about it.

Sir I am constantly trying to work upon that but a number of times I do end up losing my energy and time in thinking about the possibilities rather than just taking a step back and let things take their natural course. I think I have gotten a lot better in the recent times.

Hmm. Tell me something about yourself, your family, your interests.

I started very smartly, cutting short all crap about schooling, college, came straight to my hobbies. Told them about poetry and painting. Meanwhile P2 was going through my poems.

They didn't give a cue to stop so I went on to describe about the professional freelancing that I've done. The platforms I've written for and how it connected my dots towards pursuing an MBA.

P1: So where do you see yourself after 10 years from now?

Sir honestly I haven't even decided what specialisation I'll be choosing in my MBA so the only things that I can say about myself in 10 years is that I want to see me staying loyal to my work and waking up every day with the confidence that I'm doing what my heart desires.

P1: So what according to you are the challenges that women face in getting to mid level management positions?

(This was a rather personal question for me, so I answered it purely from my personal perspective)

First of all I think the biggest challenge women face is being accepted into those kind of roles. We are not very used to seeing women in top-managerial positions but thankfully it's changing and we have top management figures like Mrs. Indira Nooyi, Merissa Mayor and many more women in the arena. Still the field has to be levelled more.

Next challenge is that women are expected to deliver a lot in terms of societal and family issues. Due to the pandemic, the case study round was cancelled and PI was conducted online through ZOOM. There were two panelists, one male and one female. I will address them as M and F respectively in subsequent description. Would address myself as S.

Interview starts with greetings from both sides. I was asked to display my Aadhar in the beginning itself for verification.

F : Introduce yourself.

S: Gave a well rehearsed answer.

F: Why management?

S : Told my side of story that I explored core engineering jobs through internships and wanted to switch to management because I did a consulting internship in 4th year and liked it more than the core internships. Hence I decided to join a consulting firm and switch to consulting.

F: Which consulting firms I would like to work for in future?

Profile: I did my undergrad from IIT Kanpur in Economics (M.Sc. Intg. 5 year course) graduating in 2013. I then proceeded to pursue M. Phil. & Ph.D. from Tilburg University (2013–19)

Q1. Introduce yourself?

A. Told about my educational journey from undergrad in IITK to M.Phil. and then research work in Tilburg University. Mentioned my hobbies and places I have stayed/visited.

Q2. Why didn't you finish your Ph.D.?

A> Explained that my research work was not going so well in the last leg. Although, I had finished two papers the second paper still needed more refinement and I had not started on the third paper. Additionally, my teaching experience gave me an insight that this was not something I enjoyed doing so much and would like to stop. All this motivated me not to further extend my contract beyond June 2019, and thus I came back home.

Q3. What were your research areas?

A> Microfinance and International Trade. Also explained the Randomized Control Trial I helped run on the field in Nairobi.

Q4. What did you do in Microfinance?

A> I worked on setting up lending contracts which are self-enforcing and don't require a collateral, a feature prevalent in micro-finance. The Model assumes homogeneous agents where the group member chooses to work diligently and monitor his partner(costly peer monitoring) to ensure compliance. I extend the multi-agent principal-agent model with costly peer monitoring developed in Carli & Uras (2017) by relaxing the assumption of perfect monitoring. The core result of one of the agents receiving a higher expected return to compensate for higher volatility is preserved, albeit under more stringent conditions. Finally, I evaluate a threshold level of imperfect monitoring beyond which a sustainable joint-liability contract is no longer feasible.

Q5. Did you do any experimental work in your microfinance paper?

A. Told that it was a theoretical paper. I worked as Research Assistant for a project implemented Randomized Control Trial(RCT) in Nairobi, Kenya. The RCT focused on measuring the impact of

adopting mobile money technology on small and medium business owners. The project targeted over 1500 business owners who were interviewed regularly over a period of 6 months. My primary responsibility was to train the personnel for undertaking the survey.

Q5. You have also done research in Game Theory in your undergrad, what was your master's thesis?

A> I worked on Ad Avoidance technologies (AAT), its effect on Media Content and reason for their increasing presence. Studied an equilibrium existence issue: AAT penetration may lead to more advertising, causing further increase in AAT and determined a unique equilibrium outcome for the equilibrium existence issue and evaluated optimum advertising level. I also examined content providers' responses to increased AAT penetration and effect of ad-avoidance on total social welfare (i.e. we considered the net effect of ad-avoidance on the sum total of producer & consumer surplus). Finally, concluded that higher AAT penetration causes increased user fees and lower advertising levels.

Q6. Can you set up a two player zero-sum game using linear programming?

A. Told that we can simulate a Prisoner's Dilemma game where the constraints will be such that the payoff from co-operating was higher for both, but unilateral deviation to noncooperation increased that payoff for the player who deviated. This way we can pick every strategy set and run it against unilateral deviation and as such we will converge to the two possible Nash Equilibrium in the game.

Q7. Since, you have experienced the COVID-19 period how will rate the government's response towards it?

A. Started with the stimulus package of 20L crore INR and how bank reform and digital India along with it are paving the growth for faster economic growth. But, this crisis has pushed over 30% of the middle class back into poverty and government should come up with methods to put money in the hands of the populace like what US is doing. Farm laws are a step in the right direction, but the implementation could have been better.

Q8. Do you think China is still an economic center of gravity, and what can India do now to ensure it can also become one?

A. Told that China's recent actions like the COVID-19 pandemic and its actions against Uighurs and Hong Kong democracy protests have dented its public image. On the other hand, India with its vaccine diplomacy and pharma sector growth during the pandemic is well set to become a crucial player in the global value chains. Additionally, we have also started to export defense goods which are made in India which opens up another export area. Thus, we have the momentum now, and we can use this also to attract some labor force from agriculture to manufacturing sector as agriculture employs almost 66% of labor force while contributing a measly 15% to GDP which is not sustainable in the long run.

Q9. How will you handle change from academic research to MBA & corporate life?

A. I have been switching towards corporate since I came back in June 2019, and it won't be an issue. Additionally, I have gone through enough academic rigor to handle the MBA course load and my quantitative achievements show that I am capable enough to handle the workload. Age is a factor, but I have studied with & taught students from different age groups during my PhD, so it won't be an issue.

Q10. You mentioned you like reading, what are you reading nowadays?

A. Told that I am fan of historical/mythological fiction and have read Suheldev & the Shiva Trilogy by Amish. I also like Frederick Forsyth and am currently reading the Cobra which talks about an American operative trying to bring down a global cocaine cartel.

Q11. How do you get time to read multiple books?

A. Told I had a Kindle and a Kindle app on my phone which enables me to read multiple books parallelly, and I normally read when I am taking short breaks from work. Also, reading multiple books parallelly makes the experience richer and much more fun for me

Overall it was a good experience, and although I got asked questions from various domains the panel always gave me enough time and asked many follow-up questions which showed that they had a genuine interest in my profile. One of my better interview experiences in this MBA cycle

Date: 07 March, 2021

Venue: VCNow, Madhapur, Hyderabad

I reached at around 7:30am. IIM Ahmedabad was the only IIM to conduct in-centre interviews this year. We were supposed to go to the centre, give our AWT and then attend our interview via video conference.

Post my Aadhaar verification, I was asked to sit in a room with 10 odd other aspirants. The AWT was supposed to begin at 8:00 am. Other students from my panel were yet to come. Meanwhile I had memorized some names of the students in my panel from the Aadhaar verification process. So I spent the next 20 minutes analyzing their profiles on LinkedIn (DO. NOT. DO. THIS. STUPIDITY.) I realized I was the only fresher there and got extremely intimidated.

Fun fact: 4 aspirants from my very panel got into IIMA. We just connected. 🎉

Now, it's about 7:55am when a 45-ish professor enters the room and says something on the lines of, "Your AWT will begin in 5 mins. I will let you know when you'll have to put your phones aside. Put your phones on silent. Any sound will lead to your instant disqualification." Now, I thought I still have 5 minutes, let's fiddle around with some news. 😊 All the other students from my panel had put their phone aside by now. That's when the professor comes inside, sees me with my phone and shouts, "WHAT DID I JUSSSTTT SAY..!!!! WHAT DID I JUST SAYY..!!!!" I immediately apologised and put my phone away. I was on the verge of crying but had to give my AWT. How could I mess my mindset up on the most important day of my life. I had worked hard for this day since the last 6 months relentlessly. How could I be so damn stupid. But once the AWT started, I got into the flow of it and came up with what I thought was a pretty beautiful answer. I was very satisfied with what I had written.

I was the 3rd in my panel. So, I spent the next 25 odd minutes, timing the students who went prior to me, judging their reactions with no conclusions whatsoever 😢.

And finally, my turn did come. I went in pretty calm. The setup was a conference room, where the student would be sitting at one end of a big round table and there will be two GIANT screens put up side-to-side on the other end, the left one had the interviewee and the right one had the interviewers.

My panel had 2 professors. P1 was a 50-ish male and P2 was a 35-ish female. Both were extremely welcoming and friendly. We exchanged usual pleasantries and began the interview.

P1: (I hadn't yet removed my mask, I had just taken my seat) It's absolutely your choice to keep or remove your mask. (I removed my mask).

P1: So, Bhavani or Susmitha?

Me: Anything will do, Sir.

P1: Ok, we'll call you Sushmita. So, Bhavani, Susmitha, what's the connection?

Me: (I gave the elaborate backstory behind my name which turned out to be a 1 minute monologue 😊. They heard it patiently. It ended on how Susmitha broken down is, Su-good and Smitha-smile.)

P2: Yes, you indeed have a good smile.

Me: Thank you, Mam.

P1: So, Sushmita, Why MBA?

Me: (I gave my well prepared answer. It included some personal reasons involving my father.)

P1: (countered my answers for a good 5 minutes.)

Me: (answered all of them pretty confidently. He seemed convinced at the end.)

P1: Sushmita, are you good in Maths?

Me: (didn't want to be grilled on the topic, so answered in the negative) I wouldn't say it's my strongest point, Sir. I used to be very good in Maths. In fact, it was Maths that I had scored the highest during my JEE. But, Engineering Maths has proved it otherwise.

P1: But you are an engineer, that too an IITian. How can you not be good in Maths..!!? You know that MBA does have a lot of Maths in it?

Me: (answered on the grounds that the Maths in MBA doesn't go beyond calculus and statistics. And how I knew of what I was signing up for.)

P1: (asks me few questions on Continuity, Differentiation, Limits and Quadratic Equations)

Me: (answered all of them)

P1: Do you follow politics?

Me: Not really, Sir.

P1: Can you make an educated guess and tell me which all states will be having their elections in the coming 2 months?

Me: (Luckily, I knew the answer to this question as I was well versed with the politics of all the states with an IIM because of preparing for their respective interviews.)

P1: Tell me the political parties prevalent in West Bengal.

Me: (answered with TMC, BJP and INC)

P1: Do you know the full form of TMC?

Me: (absolutely knew the answer, but my stupid brain blacked out for some inexplicable reason. I literally said, "Yes, Sir." and went silent. 😱 😱 😱)

I asked for a moment, suddenly remembered and yelled, "Trinamool, YES, TRINAMOOL CONGRESS," like I was Archimedes from his Eureka moment.)

P1: (laughing at this point. THANKFULLY.) Can you tell us about the political scenario in West Bengal?

Me: (answered what I remembered from the preparation for IIM Calcutta interview (11 February, 2021) in a structural format.)

(P1 asked me some cross questions. I tried answering all of them. We were having a healthy conversation at this point. But I realised I couldn't afford to let my interview run in this direction since I didn't have a good knowledge in it and was running out of content from the interview I had prepared for, almost a month ago. Had it been Gujarat's politics, I could have answered so much better. So, I ultimately decided to be honest and resorted to the good old, "I am sorry, Sir. I do not have a good idea of this. I need to look into it.")

P1: Okay, no problem. Do you know the richest person today?

Me: Yes, Sir, last I checked it was Elon Musk.

P1: Are you sure? Is he the richest person today?

Me: I didn't check it today, Sir. I'm sorry I don't know.

P1: Make an educated guess.

Me: It must be Jeff Bezos, Sir. (It was. But I wanted to flaunt my knowledge of the top 10 richest people. So, I went ahead and named 5–6 other top richest people. 🤪)

P2: Yes, it is Jeff Bezos. Do you know Elon Musk?

Me: Yes, Mam.

P2: What's he in news for these days?

Me: (answered with the Bitcoin fiasco that was trending those days. Also with how his single tweet had caused Signal to boom.)

P2: So, he is not an MBA. And yet a CEO. He's recently said, "MBAs do nothing but work on spreadsheets." Do you agree with his statement?

Me: I absolutely do not. MBAs have so much more to do than that. Some of the world's leading CEOs today have an MBA degree. And even if they don't, they have a team of MBAs from reputed institutes. (Gave an example of how the successor of Amazon is an MBA. Told how Satya Nadella and Sundar Pichai are MBA too. And gave a list of about 5–7 other CEOs who were MBAs)

P1: Sundar Pichai is an IITian, no?

Me: Yes, Sir. But Satya Nadella and Sundar Pichai also have MBA degrees from Chicago Booth and Wharton respectively.

P1: (sounds surprised) So, tell me about your final year Project.

Me: (answers in detail)

P1: (asks for how it is relevant)

Me: (answers)

(P1 asks for few more technicalities. I answered all of them.)

P1: So, Sushmita, I can see an exponential growth in your undergraduate academics. We usually see most engineers, especially IITians, go through a decreasing curve. Can you tell me about it? (I had started with a 7.0 in first semester and ended at 9.6)

Me: (tells them about my journey.)

P1: good, good. We need academically oriented students here. So, are you placed currently?



Interview Experience – 54

Profile: General Engineer Male (GEM) with 5+ years of experience in Sales domain.

Academics: 10th: 92% | 12th: 78.4% | BE Chemical: 8.56 CGPA | CAT'21: 95.13 %ile.

Date: 03.03.2021 Time: 3:40 pm.

Interview process was conducted online. I was supposed to log in 15 minutes in advance and wait. They let me in at around 3:42 pm

There were 2 panelists. Both male. Both seemed in their 40s. Let's name them M1 and M2.

M1: Sandip, can you hear us?

Me: Yes. Sir, Good afternoon. Am I audible?

M1: Yes.

M2: So, the format of this will be that we will give you an extempore topic to speak about. You will be given 1 minute to think and 1 minute to talk about it and then we will take the session further.

Extempore topic: **Pro-development – Democratic or Authoritative?**

Spoke on the topic for 30 seconds and I was interrupted by them with a question.

M1: Was the inclusion of Junagadh (since I am from Junagadh) in India during the Partition of India-Pakistan democratic or authoritative?

I answered Democratic as it was with the help of people and the majority of Hindu people in Junagadh. (I was partially wrong). He corrected me that it was due to Sardar Patel's initiatives that Junagadh became a part of India.

M1: Why MBA at this point? Why not an executive MBA?

(I was already expecting this question in all my interviews due to my 5 years of work-ex)

Me: It will be hectic to complete the same curriculum in 1 year and I would not be able to change the field if I want. If I want to move to Finance, then 1 year MBA will have fewer opportunities than the regular flagship program.

M1: Are you unhappy with your current Job in the sales domain?

Me: I don't like the sales and marketing domain in India because of people's money-oriented approach while conducting procurement activities. People are less Technology oriented.

M1: Struggle is everywhere. Even if you move to finance, you will struggle, and 2-year MBA is also very hectic here. Do you think we are happy in our job, taking interviews from 8 in the morning throughout the day?

Me: (All of us laughing) I can totally understand, Sir. I am not pinpointing the fact that I will choose finance, I would like to come there and explore my interests and then decide.

M1: What are you not happy with? Your engineering, the industry you are working in right now, or your job role?

Me: I am currently facing a struggle in the job role due to the current practices followed as I said before about people being more money-oriented.

M2: Why not change the job? Why do MBA? Because if you do MBA and then you go for a job interview at a BFSI sector company, they will also put you in marketing because of your 5 years of experience, and ultimately banks also operate by selling.

Me: As you said that it's hectic at IIMs, then I believe I will have a lot to learn in the upcoming 2 years, which will open the path for me in the BFSI sector. (I don't know where this was going.)

M1: Still, you might have learned things in your work experience also, right?

Me: Yes, I was weak in communicating with the customers when I started my career and I could not extract project information from the customer and could not hold the communication with them for a longer time but I learned to do so by getting out all the project info where we can pitch our products and get a timeline for the upcoming orders which would help in our sales forecast as well.

M1: Ok, what do you do in your current job role?

Me: I am a sales executive at my current company. Our company is very well known in the field of Mass transfer internals, so my role doesn't involve hardcore marketing. I review the incoming inquiries, roll out techno-commercial quotations to the customers and arrange technical and commercial meetings with the customers to come to a contractual agreement with them.

M1: What does your company manufacture?

Me: Mass transfer equipment which is used in Distillation columns and other types of columns in refineries and petrochemical industries.

M1: Can I ask you some chemical engineering questions?

Me: Yes, you can shoot the question. I will try my best to answer.

M1: What are the laws of thermodynamics?

Me: There are 3 laws of thermodynamics. 1st is about the conservation of energy. 2nd has something to do with the enthalpy of the system, but I can't recollect right now. and the 3rd one is about the entropy of the system (I didn't remember the full statement of the law for the 2nd and 3rd laws; luckily, they didn't emphasize much on it).

M1: What is reverse osmosis?

Me: Osmosis is generally a mass transfer operation happening due to foul particles in the wastewater. It happens due to the concentration gradient. Mass transfer happens from higher to lower concentration fluid but when it is done in a reverse manner it is called reverse osmosis (I forgot to add that it happens due to pressure).

M2: What do you do in your free time?

Me: I listen to music. I like singing also. I started learning classical vocals and joined classes but couldn't continue due to COVID-19, but I still try to learn it on YouTube and online platforms. Other than this, I usually watch web series on OTTs.

M2: Ok Sandip, what kind of news do you follow?

Me: I generally do not follow much political news, however, the Russia-Ukraine crisis is in the talks right now, which I am following. Apart from that, I follow typically sports and technology-related news. (I was like... finally, they will ask something about current affairs and I had prepared for it but it didn't happen).

M2: Ok, let's say you are a consultant to the Government and you have to recommend steps to take for financial inclusion of Rural areas, what will be those measures?

Me: I misunderstood the question and thought of rural development and started talking about that government shouldn't have reduced the budget for MGNREGA.

M2: How will it ensure financial inclusion?

Me: If the budget was increased or even kept the same the employment would have increased. Also through Infrastructural development like schools, and hospitals in rural parts of the country.

M2: Still, how will it affect financial inclusion?

Me: I can't connect the dots or maybe I am not following you. What do you mean by financial inclusion, as in overall India?

M2: As in how can rural areas are financially connected or included in India?

Me: (I was so idiot to not understand the literal meaning of what they asked me) Then I started explaining that more jobs will mean more bank accounts in rural areas. Government should also impart education and training related to financial markets and investments so that the money from rural parts can be circulated in the system.

M2: Ok Sandip, that's all from our side. Thank you. You may leave.

Me: Thank you, Sir. Have a great day ahead.

The total interview ran for around 16-17 minutes. Overall, it was a nice experience. They looked friendly but they also maintained an environment where you can't get away with your answers easily. In terms of grilling, only the "why MBA at this stage?" question was the one on which they were putting more pressure, which put me in doubt of my selection.
