- Time Allotted is 10-30 minutes
- When given an abstract topic time allotted is less
- When given a specific topic for in-depth analysis time is given separately for ideation and writing

2. It is better for old people to live in retirement homes away from rush of city. Do advantages of living in retirement homes outweigh the disadvantages

Insights - Interview

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- **Interview time** - 20-30 Minutes. (Sometimes as low as 10 mints)
- **Interview Panel Details** - 2 to 3 people (Professor and Alumni)
- **Interview Type** - Detailed Interviews check your perspective, thought process, interests and knowledge
- **Interview discussion Pointers** – (as per IIMI experiences of last five years)
- Be completely prepared with anything and everything on the form.
- They will go into details of everything you speak about in the interview. (level1- what do you know about Indian Economy level2- what do you think about GST, level3- how has GST affected the sector you work in).
- They can ask about your hobbies and interests.
- It is absolutely fine to ask for time before you answer (they often expect you to think about a solution when they ask you about a problem at hand).
- It is fine if you are anxious and you need not portray a brave face being real with your emotions is better.
- Be prepared to answer everything about your work experience or about your favorite subjects if you are a fresher.



S: Dividing this into two parts:

Women speaking up: There have been a few examples where speaking up has had a negative impact on the cause, mainly due to differences in ideologies, race, cultures, incomes, etc. Thus, speaking up has, sometimes, backfired due to intersectionality and diversity.

For e.g., in 2017, around the time when Donald Trump had his inauguration, women around the country decided to do a "Women's March". However, the overall impact of the movement was diminished due to an internecine disagreement between White women and the minority women, wherein white women were advised to support but leave the raising of important issues to the marginalised sections of women as they have a much more vivid idea of the oppressions and biases towards the community. This didn't go down well with the majority of white women who felt they were being side-lined.

Benefits of Technology: The most recent example of technology giving an impetus to the cause of Women Empowerment is the "#metoo movement". The MeToo movement was started in 2006 by Tarana Burke. However, with there not being enough technological prowess at the time, the movement couldn't reach many people. Fast forward to 2017, the Harvey Weinstein misconducts brought the movement back into the limelight and it picked up throughout the world with women coming up with their stories of misconduct and harassment. The reason for this global reach was the internet connectivity which brought stories from around the world to people and gave them the strength to speak up themselves.

(Note: I personally don't agree with the topic because it diminishes the contribution of the amazing womxn and allies who have championed the cause by their sheer bravery and courage to speak up. But, as my panelist put it, I had to behave like a lawyer and agree even when I didn't.)

Interview Experience – 31

Interview Date: 17 February 2022. (IIM Indore)

It was an online interview. I haven't read many IIM interview experiences for someone from a research background. So, might be useful 😊

P1: Old, P2: Relatively young

P1: Which IISER campus are you from?

AT: Pune

P1: It is very surprising that someone from such an elite research institute wants to do an MBA, why?

AT: Answered a well-prepared answer while acknowledging that it is a prestigious position to be in.

P1: Let us talk about Physics. Suppose you drop a paperweight and feather on the moon, what will happen?

AT: Assuming there is no atmosphere on the moon, both objects will reach simultaneously.

P1: Is there an atmosphere on the moon?

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AT: No

P1: So, why assume anything?

AT: Sure Sir, both will reach simultaneously.

P1: What happens on earth?

AT: On earth, there is friction due to the atmosphere and so, objects will experience friction and feather will reach late.

P1: Is there no gravity on the moon?

AT: It is there, it is one-sixth of that on the earth.

P1: Okay, suppose I measure the height of a person lying on the floor and standing, what should I keep in mind?

AT: (I had no idea) I blabbered about trying to relate it to gravity, but also said that it will have a negligible impact.

P1: Yeah, that is fine. But, what should you take care of other than the number while measuring height?

AT: (After thinking a bit) Units?

P1: What else? (He was trying to help me here)

AT: (Finally, I got the right thing) The least count/errors are what he wanted to hear.

P1: Tell me the difference between the validity and reliability of a device.

AT: (I had no idea) I was confused by the terminology. But, still told a few things. (He intervened and again helped a bit). Finally, I got the sense that validity is what we called accuracy in our labs and reliability is precision (he was not happy with the word precision) and I explained it nicely. But, it was a good discussion.

P2: When I was a kid, whenever I used to put something in the water, it used to come up. Why? Will it always happen?

Explained relative density. Mentioned Buoyancy.

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P2: What is Bouyancy?

Told.

P2: So, what will be buoyancy at different heights?

More if we are deeper (Wrong answer, it is constant throughout. I don't know if he noticed it.)

P2: Where are you originally from?

Jamnagar.

P2: Do you know which is the largest port in India?

I don't know about India, but Mundra port is the largest in Gujarat. (It is even that of India).

P2: Largest coastline in India?

Gujarat.

P2: Suppose there are four rooms and two of them have gifts. We both open two doors, what is the probability of you getting a gift and I not getting it?

Calculated and told it correctly.

P2: What formula did you use?

I just found the relevant event and divided it by the total number of possible events.

P2: Have you heard of conditional probability?

Yes sir, got it, sir.

P2: Tell me any three current news.

Russia-Ukraine Problem, Hijab issue and IAS deputation issue between centre and state?

P2: What is Kremlin?

Told

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P2: Extempore: Should the student in India be not allowed to do more than one master's?

Spoke against it. After three lines, he cut me and said we are done, you can leave.

Verdict: Converted in the first round.

Interview Experience – 32

Profile :- X - 10 CGPA(CBSE), XII - 95.6%(CBSE), B.Tech (CSE) - Govt Engineering College Thrissur - 7.74 CGPA(KTU), 20 months work-ex at TCS, CAT percentile - 98.6, General Engineer Male.

Indore was the only call I got from BLACKI, and it was also my first interview. Due to COVID, it was online. Now one thing that most of these review posts fail to mention is how different an online interview is.

You will be staring at a black screen titled waiting room for hours on end, and suddenly you will be admitted in the interview room. It is a bit disconcerting because at least in offline interviews, you get time to compose yourself when you enter the interview room. But in an online setting, it goes from zero to a hundred in a second. In the Indore interview, they were kind enough to let me know 5 minutes prior that I would be admitted into the Zoom room. It helped a lot.

Panelists : Two professors, both male. Let's call them P1 and P2. Both of them looked like they had reasonable experience.

P1 : Asked me to introduce myself. Picked up on my official designation in TCS and asked me to describe about that. I spoke on this for about 2–3 minutes, describing my work.

Then, he asked me if I was comfortable in mathematics. Of course, I replied that I was. He asked me to prove that the sum of angles of a triangle are 180 degrees. Honestly, I was flummoxed here. I had no clue. I drew a triangle on a paper, and tried to do something using the external angle property of a triangle. He gave me hints and all, but I do not think I was even close to the answer. After 3–4 minutes, P2 said it was okay and started asking questions.

P2 : Most of his questions were G.K. based. First, he asked me if I had ever been to North India. Then he gave the names of a few places and asked me if I knew the connection between them. I knew that they were all pilgrimage sites in North India, and I replied as much. I still suspect there was more to it than that.

He then asked me to name two Congress ruled states, as well as all the seven sisters. He also asked me why CAA-NRC was such an issue in the North-East. Then, he asked me to estimate the amount of money it would take to build the Ram temple. I stated an amount that I had read in the newspaper. But I think he wanted me to do a guesstimate on it (If you are not sure what a guesstimate is, do Google it. Knowing that you can do even a basic guesstimate exercise will be a huge advantage in an interview. I suspect most people learn it only after coming to a B-school).

P1 : He rounded up the interview asking me to give an extempore on the topic - 'The Importance of Freedom of Speech'. I spoke on it for about 2 minutes.

All in all, I thought the interview went well. Apart from the maths question, and the Ram Mandir question, I felt that I answered all questions well. The interviewers very rarely grill you. It honestly felt like they wanted to get to know me, unlike a few other interviews. So my suggestion would be to stay calm during the entire interview process. Also, read extensively on all the current topics in the news. You should be able to articulate these very well.

Result : Waitlisted, and converted in the second movement. The movement of the waitlists in Indore will be comparatively big because of the high intake. I think there were two or three waitlist movements even after I converted.

P.S. : I had forgotten to wear the collar button during the interview, whilst I had worn the tie (it was my first time wearing a tie). P2 pointed it out to me at the end of the interview. He was just smiling when he did so. This just shows that you don't need to pay too much attention to what you wear. How you perform is much more important.

I was kind of surprised to even get a call from Indore after not getting shortlisted by Lucknow. This was my 9th interview this season and also the smoothest one. :D

2 panelists: **Both male (M and N). And me (P)**

After checking my govt id, **M asked me to tell them something about myself very quickly.**

Told.

M: So Prachi, you have done BA in Sociology. Why MBA now? Don't you think you will be able to contribute to the society better by going for UPSC?

P: Sir, Sociology as a subject gave me an insight into how the society functions, its cultures, values and practices. However, one perspective that it did not cover was business. The knowledge I gained through my UG course felt somewhat incomplete without learning about the business side to it. Also, my family has a business background, hence, I always had the leaning towards it.

M asked me what my family business was and that was about it.

M: Okay I am going to give you a few puzzles and I need you to solve them for me.

1. ***There are 2 containers, one of 5kg and another of 3kg, both without any markings on them. You also have a bag of salt. How will you measure out 7kgs for me?***
2. ***(x-a)(x-b)(x-c)....(x-z): What will be the first two terms of the expansion?***
3. ***There is a river which can only be crossed on foot. You have been given certain data about its depth, namely the mean, median, mode, standard deviation and variance. Which parameter would you go for?***

I was able to answer the first two correctly and pretty quickly too. For the 3rd one, I said I'd go for mode as that would tell me which level of depth is occurring most number of times.

M: Why not go for standard deviation?

P: Sir, I cannot recall its formula, hence, I did not go for it.

M: That's not required. Just explain SD in layman's terms.

P: Sir, I am unable to recall that also. Really sorry.

(Realized that mode was the wrong answer after the interview. I used the wrong logic there :/)

I cannot recall what M asked me after this but either way, he seemed satisfied with my answers and I was feeling good about the direction the interview was going in.

N enters the scene and now begins the rapid fire.

Here are the series of **questions he asked about Sociology**:

1. **Your favourite sociological theory** (Said Emile Durkheim's functionalist perspective)
2. **How is it different from Talcott Parson's Functionalism?** (Gave the example of their almost similar but differing views on religion)
3. **What is the difference between Parson's and Robert K Merton's view on Structural functionalism?** (Told him that I was unable to recall the precise difference but tried to cover it up by giving an overall generalized view)
4. **What is Karl Marx's contributions to sociology?** (Mentioned the labour value theory, False consciousness)
5. **What was his conflict theory about?** (Answered satisfactorily. Bourgeoisie and Proletariat)
6. **What was the assumption he had made before writing about this conflict theory?** (This one I got wrong. Talked about the false consciousness and how the Proletariat will eventually overthrow the Bourgeoisie. It was actually how every individual is a profit-seeker)
7. **What is the difference between class and caste?** (Gave a satisfactory answer)
8. **What is symbolic interactionism?** (Explained with help of examples)

After sociology rapid fire, there were questions on Kolkata that eventually moved on to current affairs

1. **What is the other name of Howrah Bridge? (Are you kidding me?!)**
2. **What is the other bridge that runs parallel to it?**
3. **Who is the CM of West Bengal?**
4. **Which party does she belong to?**

5. **What do you know about the State elections that happened in 5 states recently?**

(Explained everything to the T :D)

N: Okay Prachi. Since you are from the sociology background, the extempore topic for you is: **Caste System in India. You have 30 secs to think and you can speak for 2 mins.**

I started with BR Ambedkar's Annihilation of Caste, moved on to the reservation that was introduced for Scheduled castes post independence. Talked about how reservation is a temporary solution to the problem and has been kind of reinstating the difference between different castes in India. Ended on a hopeful note about how as the youth of 21st Century India, there is scope for a lot of progress and hope for a casteless society.

Said Thank you to both the panelists and left the meeting.

I said it was the smoothest interview so far not only because I was able to answer almost all the questions but also because it was challenging and fun in its own way and I tried to remain as calm as possible.

M1: (after I showed them my PAN) Tell me Aakruti, what do the letters in your PAN denote?

AF: Sir, I am unsure of the first four letters but the fifth one denotes the name of the assessed. That is why in my case, it is F.

M1: Very well. Introduce yourself.

AF: (did the spiel, he seemed very interested and was reacting to stuff – 'ooh nice', 'impressive')

M1: That is a very versatile profile you have Aakruti.

AF: (unsure what to say, because compliments in an interview do sometimes lead into difficult questions)

Thanks sir.

M1: So, you are a CA, when did you qualify? (Answered, 2019) And you're from Poddar college in Mumbai, that is a very good institution. What year was that? (Answered, 2017)

Who are you working with right now? (Answered, Xtreme Media. Had already spoken about my profile and a couple projects I had handled there.)

M1: That is quite a leap, from being a CA to doing work that is not traditionally that of a CA.

AF: Yes sir, it was a conscious decision on my part. My parents are entrepreneurs and they have always been a big influence on me. After article ship, I decided I needed to have a more holistic experience and do a deeper dive into business ops.

M1: Wow, impressive that you see entrepreneurship as a goal. Why do this course at all? You should start up and then come to IIM Indore to recruit people, not the other way around. (Everyone laughed)

AF: But sir, while these two years have been invaluable in shaping my goals, they have also made me realize that there exist quite a few work points, both for me as an individual and as a potential leader. Looking at the journeys of the businesses I have been exposed to, my parents' and my current employer, I do see areas where a management education would enhance my abilities to tackle those situations better. Hence the decision for this course.

M1: Alright. You seem quite focused. Can I ask you some commerce related questions?

AF: Sure sir.

M1: Rapid fire: (could answer all of these, someone up there likes me.)

- (1) Tell me what PE Ratio is (MPS/EPS – uses, what it denotes)
- (2) What is the Modigliani-Miller Theory (capital gearing has no effect on earnings)

AF: Sir I haven't heard about this term but, what I can infer is that it refers to the overstating of profits to show better than actual performance, a sort of window-dressing.

M2: Have you heard about Toshiba?

AF: Yes.

M2: Toshiba had been involved in pumping of their profits a while ago.

AF: I'll read up on this sir.

1) P1: Tell us why MBA and how did your interest develop? (Told)

2) P1: Give an example where a bio innovation did not reach the market? (Said I know 2 but would give you the Indian example - Florida Tilton's biofilm inhibitor and how it gestated for about 5 years before her company got a grant to productize the innovation.

3) P1: So you are saying that these ideas gestate for some years but eventually make it to the market right? (Said that it is not true with all novel innovations and gave example of what R.T.Krishnan, IIM B director had said in 2004 conference and also how IIM B had helped such bio innovations to scale up their businesses in 2020).

4) P2: So what is biofilm? (Told)

5) P2: If I ask you to sell it to Apollo hospital, how will you do it? (Said that Apollo won't be new to this problem as it is faced by every healthcare facility so I won't need to convince much as it is a novel product)

6) P2: But still, how will you do it? (Said that as I am a microbiologist, I would show them through an experiment wherein I will take a used catheter, swab, and plate the microorganisms from it and analyze how many pathogenic and virulent organisms are present on it as well as other instruments. The data will speak for itself).

7) What problems are you likely to face if you have to sell the biofilm? (Told about the price and if there is the competition who has used cheaper ingredients and has a better product then I will have to improve my product)

8) P1: What is CAGR? (Told full form)

9) P1: How is it different from the growth rate? (Told the layman meaning first with their permission and then gave the textbook definition).

10) P2: How do you calculate it? (Told how to derive the formula through rearrangement of the terms in Compound Interest)

11) P2: Gave me a sum and said if you know then okay, else leave it. (Said I don't know Sir)

12) P2: You have mentioned Kiran Mazumdar Shaw and Kalpana Saroj. So are they both on the board? (Told how Kiran Shaw was before but now Dr.Shetty is there in her place and Kalpana Saroj continues to be on the governing board).

13) P2: Why did you mention Kalpana Saroj, she is not a bio entrepreneur? (Told how her background inspired me as she went through a lot of hardships in her life and helped Kamani tubes reach success).

14) P2: What is synthetic biology? (Told)

15) Why is it called 'Synthetic' biology? (Gave a generic answer)

16) No...why do you think it is called 'synthetic'? (Told how we are engineering something which isn't natural but man-made through biological means)

17) Good. So that means it makes humans God? (Said No....it is a popular debate surrounding stem cell research but we are far from it and it does not make us God as we are not even close to success).

18) P2: So you have stated Zymergen. Any other genetic engineering-related discovery you know? (Said no).

19) P2: I will give you a hint - Insulin. (Yes Sir. Explained the full process of how DNA from the pig is used and E.coli plasmid is used as E.coli replicates faster and we can mass-produce insulin in a short span of time).

20) P2: Have you heard about homulin? (No Sir).

21) P1: Tell me about the stages of vaccine production. (Explained 3 stages and even stage 0 and why do we perform them).

P2 joked about how I am talking about vaccines only and asked me to say insulin in place of vaccines as insulin was his favorite).

22) P1: Tell me in detail. Science answers should be precise. (Told which people do we select for the phases and how are they divided. Also talked about the double-blind study).

23) P2: Asked me about some specific terms. (I said I don't know) P1: You have studied pharmacology right? (Said no Sir, I haven't I know all this due to my interest but I haven't studied as a part of the syllabus).

24) P1: So what do you do apart from your study? (Told about Bharatnatyam, teaching and cultural committee).

25) P2: So you must have joined the NGO a few months back so you can have something to talk about in the interview right? (No Sir, I have been volunteering for a year now and my mother used to work for that NGO and they were in need of a teacher so I joined them as well).

26) P2: How did you get admission to your college? (Asked if he wanted to know how my interest developed or what was the process ?)

27) P2: No, on what basis do you get admission? (Told 12th HSC marks) P2: You have 92%, so you must not have faced a problem getting admission anyways. (I said yes Sir 91.54 % and I smiled)

28) I don't know where your college is? Why this college? (Answered both)

29) P2: What after PGP? (Told)

30) P2 : You have mentioned a hangover cure so what do you think can be the difficulties if I want to sell it? (Told about how the higher price would make it affordable to the upper-middle class and high-income groups only but as the demand rises, the cost can be brought down. Also mentioned how some people would harbor some misconceptions or fear about probiotics).

31) P2: Have you heard of Thermon company? (No Sir)

31) P3: Tell me about how major countries handled corona. How they could have done better? (Talked about America, India, China, and while I was explaining how China should have informed the world beforehand....P3 cut me and said this is from the news)

32) Tell us from a biology perspective. (Said that honestly, the big countries did not do that well as compared to smaller countries like New Zealand, Cambodia, Vietnam, and even some African countries - I explained their methods and what they did better. I also said that as African countries have had an experience of handling Ebola, they fared better than expected. I even added that as they are poorer, the population has been exposed to much more pathogenic organisms and has a better immune response).

33) P3 - Is there a scientific basis for that claim? (Told about the ASTREC study FROM TATA Memorial Hospital and how they proved the same about Dharavi slum).

34) P3 - What is the mRNA vaccine and how is it different. Why is there so much buzz around it calling it a novel method? (Started explaining how it differs from traditional vaccines and mentioned how difficult it is to find and study the exact sequence responsible for the spike protein formation and how storing mRNA is another major hurdle. I also mentioned how HGP was a relatively recent event and we are yet to learn a lot more).

Candidate: *Again tried, though not very successfully*

PANELIST2: The definition of work and heat forms the basis of which law of thermodynamics?

Candidate: *Answered*

C1: How will you differentiate between petrol and diesel in terms of their chemical properties?

Candidate: *Answered, though they wanted more distinguishing parameters*

Candidate: Sir there are various parameters- change in area of cross-section, velocity change or a vertical height drop.

A number of governments in the past have proposed various schemes and measures to improve the condition of farmers. However, 70 years after Independence the plight of farmers is the same. Suggest a few measures to alleviate the suffering of farmers in India.

Personal Interview:

The panel had 3 male members (PANELIST1, PANELIST2 and PANELIST3)

PANELIST1: Tell me something about yourself.

CANDIDATE: Answered. Was interrupted within 15 seconds.

PANELIST1: So you're a chemical engineer. Tell me about your favourite subject.

CANDIDATE: Talked about the subject of Plant Design and Economics. Described how the design is done, how the costing is done, profitability analysis as well as about the techniques like HAZOP, SIS etc. Talked about how we got an opportunity to explore industrial disasters such as Chernobyl, Bhopal Gas Tragedy, Three Mile Island etc from a chemical engineering perspective.

PANELIST1: Okay. Tell me about the Bhopal Gas Tragedy from the economic point of view.

CANDIDATE: Tried to explain the financial scenario which was a reason for cost-cutting and indirectly the reason for the tragedy.

PANELIST2: No no this is the finance of it. Tell us about economics.

CANDIDATE: Sir, isn't finance a subset of economics?

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PANELIST1: Not exactly, but okay let's move on.

PANELIST3: So are you good at mathematics.

CANDIDATE: Sir I would say I am decent.

PANELIST3: Okay do you remember 12th standard calculus.

CANDIDATE: Sir it is a bit rusty but I can try.

PANELIST3: *wrote two questions on a piece of paper*

$\int 3-2|x-1| \cdot dx$ and $\int -23|x-1| \cdot dx$ and $\lim_{x \rightarrow 3} x - 3x^2 - 9$

CANDIDATE: Solved both.

PANELIST2: Okay since you are a chemical engineer, you must be familiar with Reynold's Number.

CANDIDATE: Yes sir, I know it

PANELIST2: Okay, explain it to me as if I am a layperson.

CANDIDATE: Tried to give the definition. Explained its relation with turbulence and laminar flow. Tried to explain the laminar flow and turbulent flow. Explained viscosity and density. However, they were not convinced.

PANELIST1: This is still not something a layperson will understand. Tell me the main reason for using it.

PANELIST2: Okay leave that. Let's move on to the non-technical questions.

Where are you from?

CANDIDATE: Sir I was born and brought up in Nagpur, the geographical centre of India.

PANELIST2: Okay. Who is the MP from Nagpur?

CANDIDATE: Nitin Gadkari

PANELIST2: What is his portfolio?

CANDIDATE: Answered.

PANELIST2: Suppose you are walking down the street. You see Nitin Gadkari. You talk to him for 1 minute. You can tell/ask him anything you want. We don't care if you ask for his daughter's hand in marriage **smiles at PANELIST3* You have 30 seconds to think and 1 minute to talk. Your time starts now. CANDIDATE: *jotted down all the points in the given 30 seconds and started*

Before beginning, I must say that asking Mr Gadkari for his daughter's hand would be rude as she is already married... Afterwards, I talked about the Metro in Nagpur and his views on it as Transport Minister. I asked about the situation of the Vidarbha issue which has now lost steam. Talked about the farmers' suicides in Vidarbha and a few questions about the General Elections 2019.

*All three panelists looked satisfied. *

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PANELIST2: If you say all this to Gadkari Ji he will say you're the youth. You should give me answers, not questions.

PANELIST1: Okay tell me about the heritage of the Mughal dynasty.

CANDIDATE: It begins with Babur who came to India from Fergana in 1450. He was succeeded by his son Humayun who briefly lost his throne to Sher Shah Suri but regained it and then the throne went to Akbar. After that it went to Jehangir, followed by Shah Jahan in whose reign the Taj Mahal was built. Shah Jahan was followed by Aurangzeb who was the main adversary of Shivaji Maharaj. I do not remember the emperors in between but the dynasty ended with Bahadur Shah Jafar who was a revolutionary in the 1857 Sepoy Mutiny.

I could see that all three panelists were really impressed as even I did not expect that I would remember all of this in detail. I was kind a sure that I was in the moment I answered this question

PANELIST3: What is the population of Nagpur.

CANDIDATE: Told the figure according to the 2011 census.

PANELIST3: So less? What is the population of Maharashtra then?

CANDIDATE: Sir I don't know that.

PANELIST3: Okay try to guess. What is the population of Mumbai?

CANDIDATE: I don't know sir.

PANELIST3: Guess toh karo

CANDIDATE: Guessed (way less)

PANELIST3: Okay so how many districts are there in Maharashtra?

CANDIDATE: Sir I think it is somewhere around 40.

PANELIST3: So many? Do you think one state can have so many districts?

How many districts do you think are in India?

CANDIDATE: Guessed 300

PANELIST3: So what fraction of India's districts is in Maharashtra?

CANDIDATE: around 1/7th

PANELIST1: Any other subject?

Candidate: Strength of Materials (though I was not good in it but had to say it).

PANELIST1: What is a phase change material?

Candidate: Thought for few seconds and replied "Sorry sir, I don't remember this term".

PANELIST1: What is Young's modulus and it's significance?

Candidate: Answered correctly.

PANELIST1: Which material is more elastic, rubber or steel?

Candidate: Answered correctly (steel)

PANELIST1: Are you really sure about your answer?

Candidate: Yes sir! I'm sure

PANELIST1: Draw FBD diagram of a simply supported beam.

Candidate: Answered but did some mistake.

PANELIST1: What is momentum and moment of inertia?

Candidate: Defined momentum and was going to define MOI but interviewer Y interrupted.

PANELIST2: How long can a bridge survive without any maintenance?

Candidate: Answered

PANELIST2: Which equipment do Civil engineers use in the footing for Metro Construction to protect it from earthquake?

Candidate: Sir, I don't know the exact name of that equipment but the function of that equipment must be to absorb shock from the earth and not let it get transferred to the structure. There is a whole subject called "Seismic designing" which discuss about such type of equipments and engineering.

PANELIST2: Why do we use steel in concrete structures and not just cement and aggregates?

Candidate: Answered correctly (concrete has good compressive strength but lacks in tensile strength which steel provides in it).

PANELIST2: What is the ratio of mixture of cement and other aggregates in a concrete structure?

Candidate: Answered correctly

PANELIST3: Who is our current Highway and transport minister?

Candidate: Nitin Gadkari (Z was surprised by my answer as if he had assumed that I won't be able to answer it).

PANELIST3: How do you know about him?

I started speaking without even thinking for a single second.

PANELIST3: Have you read his auto-biography?

Candidate: Yes, sir.

PANELIST3: What are some of the superstitions that he follows?

Candidate: Spoke a lot about this.

PANELIST3: What do you like the most about him?

Candidate: Spoke about his attitude of never giving up, no matter what the circumstances are.

(All this time, PANELIST2 was going through my application form)

PANELIST2: Your parents stay in Jabalpur, right?

Candidate: Yes, sir.

PANELIST2: What is the most famous thing about Jabalpur?

Candidate: Spoke about the Vehicle Factory, Jabalpur which manufactures and assembles military vehicles.

PANELIST2: Do you know any other famous thing about Jabalpur?

Candidate: Told him about the Bhedaghat falls.

PANELIST2: Yes, the Bhedaghat falls. Have you been there?

Candidate: No, sir. But have heard a lot about it from my Mom.

PANELIST2: Your dad is in Defence, right?

Candidate: Yes, sir.

PANELIST2: What do you think about the Make In India initiative? How will it impact our defence forces?

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Candidate: Had read a lot about this, both positives and negatives. But concentrated mainly on the positive sides while speaking and said that, it won't be fair to judge the Make in India initiative within 2-3 years. Probably 10 years down the line, we'll see its real impact.

PANELIST2: Tell us one thing in which our Armed forces are self-reliant and one in which they are not.

Candidate: For the not self-reliant part, I mentioned the fighter aircraft, submarine, missiles, etc. acquisition from foreign countries. (I could not think of anything in which our armed forces are completely self-reliant)

PANELIST2: What about the self-reliant part?

Candidate: Sir, I am not able to think of any aspect where our armed forces are completely self-reliant.

PANELIST2: Then, how have we won so many wars?

Candidate: Sir, we have won wars because of our soldiers. Kargil war is a great example of the perseverance of the Indian Army. We were able to move a lot of soldiers in a very short time and from a position of surprise we were able to win the war because of the valiant effort of our soldiers.

PANELIST2: Why do you think Pakistan attacked Kargil? They could have attacked some other place where it was tougher for the Indian Army to deploy soldiers in a short time.

Candidate: Spoke about Operation Meghdoot where we had captured the Siachen Glacier by fooling Pakistan and to take revenge for that, they had captured the heights of Kargil in a similar fashion. Also mentioned that by capturing the heights of Kargil, it was easy to cut the National Highway which connects Srinagar and Leh. This would have given strategic advantage to the Pakistanis.

Before I start, I want to state that my interview was scheduled on 4th April, 2020 in Delhi. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, it was postponed and then taken online.

I waited nearly an hour past the scheduled time for the panelists to let me enter the virtual meeting room. There were two male professors, P1 (probably in his 40s) and P2 (probably in his mid 30s). P1 started the interview. We exchanged pleasantries and then P1 commenced. I'll denote myself by M.

M - Good Evening, Sir.

P1 & P2 (both together) - Good Evening, Jayant.

P1- We are audible to you, right?

M - Yes, Sir.

P1 - Okay so Jayant, please introduce yourself.

M - (responded with a well rehearsed answer, talking about my hobbies, startup experience, PORs, internships, competitions etcetera)

Economics & technical questions:

P1 - So, you are an economics graduate. What is the difference between monopoly and monopsony?

M - Spoke about how Monopoly is a single seller and many buyer case while Monopsony is the polar opposite case with a single buyer and many sellers.

P1 - Can you think of an example for Monopsony?

M - Explained how labour market could be an example where people belonging to a particular skill set supplying labour (are sellers) and a single company bidding for them (is a buyer).

P1 - Can you think of a practical life example also? Related to day-to-day life?

M - (after thinking for a few secs) explained how e-rick market in North Campus Delhi works as an example when an individual has to board a rickshaw

(Both professors seemed quite happy after my answer)

P1 - What is IS-LM model?

M - (the most expected one) Explained how the same is a Keynesian technique and talked about their derivations when goods and money markets are in equilibrium.

P1 - What is Fisher's effect? Could you explain the equation also?

M - Explained how the relationship among real interest rate, nominal interest rate and inflation rate gives rise to Fisher effect. Then explained the equation further refining the expected inflation rate.

P1- What is the difference between nominal and real interest rate?

M - Nominal reflects monetary terms while real reflects the quantum in terms of goods and services

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P1 - You might have heard of MRS being diminishing in nature as a general principle, right? Prove it mathematically.

M - Answered assuming a Cobb-Douglas preference structure and then applying partial derivatives

P1 - Tell me how Solow model was an improvement over Harrod-Domar Model?

M - Talked about Harrod-Domar being a knife-edge cutting model wherein a change in savings rate produces a permanent effect on the growth of GDP, told how Solow improved the situation by bringing in other factors such as labour population growth

P1 - What is normal distribution?

M - the continuous random variable and probability distribution concentrated on mean, then draw the bell shaped curve and explained its properties a bit

P1 - What is a natural monopoly?

M - Explained about how such monopolies have very high establishment costs and then witness the large economies of scale

P1- What are the two major causes for market failure?

M - Concentration of Power (Monopoly) and Externalities

Entrepreneurship and Indian economy:

(P1 then gave a signal to P2 to take over.)

P2 - I can see that you have good command over your graduation subjects. Well, let's shift the topics a bit now. In your introduction, you mentioned that you have had an opportunity of working with a startup from scratch. Tell me what is bootstrap funding?

M - (nervous chuckle) an entrepreneur risking his own bootstraps (money) as an initial source for venture capital

P2 - What is a unicorn? Give some names for Indian unicorns.

M - Startups with valuations over one dollar billion. Gave examples of Ola, Paytm, Flipkart, OYO, Byju's

P2 - Who was Victor Lustig?

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M - (sorry, who!?) Sir, I am not sure. I am hearing this name for the first time in my life.

Fun fact: He was a con artist who is believed to have sold Eiffel tower.

(Googled it after my interview)

P2 - You sure are, anyways, who is Elon Musk?

M - Talked about him being a technology and industrial entrepreneur, also spoke about SpaceX and Tesla

P2 - Explain a bit about Tesla cars.

M - Talked about Tesla electric cars providing world's transition to sustainable & clean energy solutions

(Then he named a few US start-ups, I wasn't aware about any of those, so, I requested him that global entrepreneurship wasn't really my side.)

P2 - (Maybe, realising that I have a knack for Economics) What is Economic survey? Who publishes it?

M - Told

P2 - Who is our finance minister and Chief Economic advisor?

M - Nirmala Sitharaman and Krishnamurthy Subramanian

P2 - Explain the theme of recent economy survey.

M - (Feeling relieved that I have had read about it a few days back) Explained how the same focussed on wealth creation alongside the support from government

P2 - Okay Jayant. We will now have an extempore.

You will have 30 secs to think and 1.5 mins to speak.

You topic is - "COVID-19 has disrupted our lives."

M - (woahh, the topic was so simple that on the top of my mind, I felt that I needed no time to think, but still I structured my approach before speaking) Spoken how the same has affected Indian economy, global economy, core economic sectors, personal lives and professional lives. Ended the extempore on a positive note highlighting how it has knitted the whole world in a single thread of unity to fight against the same.

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P1 - Any Questions for us, Jayant?

M - Yes Sir. Was wondering how classes and regular activities at IIM Indore shall be proceeding amidst the pandemic crisis, if you could chart out a bit of details, that would be too great.

P1 - Explaining me how online modules are also being tested upon and a part of Term-1 will definitely be going online. Social distancing and other norms shall also be introduced whilst conducting regular classes even in the offline scenario. Rest information shall flow via official communication streams and the same will be adhered as per the government guidelines.

M - Sure, Sir. That was really helpful.

(Then P1 nodded and asked me to exit the meeting room.)

Verdict: Converted

Candidate- The most commonly used antennas are microstrip antennas and helical antennas.

PANELIST1- When you observe a mobile tower closely, what all components it has?

Candidate- Sir, I do not know

Candidate- We send the information via modulation. We can use frequency modulation, amplitude modulation, phase modulation, etc.
