Insights - Writing Ability Test

- **Time Allotted:** 10-30 minutes
- When given an abstract topic time allotted is less
- When given a specific topic for in-depth analysis time is given separately for ideation and writing

1. Unethical practices by doctors are increasing. Provide some solutions to improve the current scenario.
2. It is better for old people to live in retirement homes away from rush of city. Do advantages of living in retirement homes outweigh the disadvantages

Insights - Interview

- **Interview time** - 20-30 Minutes. (Sometimes as low as 10 mins)
- **Interview Panel Details** - 2 to 3 people (Professor and Alumni)
- **Interview Type** - Detailed Interviews check your perspective, thought process, interests and knowledge
- **Interview discussion Pointers** – (as per IIM-I experiences of last five years)
- Be completely prepared with anything and everything on the form.
- They will go into details of everything you speak about in the interview. (level1- what do you know about Indian Economy level2- what do you think about GST, level3- how has GST affected the sector you work in).
- They can ask about your hobbies and interests.
- It is absolutely fine to ask for time before you answer (they often expect you to think about a solution when they ask you about a problem at hand).
- It is fine if you are anxious and you need not portray a brave face being real with your emotions is better.
- Be prepared to answer everything about your work experience or about your favourite subjects if you are a fresher.

M1: Ok I will give u the definition, they are languages which are 1500 yrs old.

Me: In that case, Tamil and Sanskrit will be there. Telugu also should be there. It's derived from Tamil and definitely has a history of more than 1500 yrs. But regarding north Indian languages, I don't have much idea.

M1: why do you think north Indian languages are not classical languages?

Me: I know that there is a language called Prakriti which evolved from Sanskrit. All other languages evolved from that. But I don't really know whether this happened 1500 yrs ago.

Me: 200 billion dollars.

M1: Do you know how many classical languages are there in India?

Me: I know that there are 16 languages on currency but I don't know about classical languages.

M1: Ok I will give u the definition, they are languages which are 1500 yrs old.

Me: In that case, Tamil and Sanskrit will be there. Telugu also should be there. It's derived from Tamil and definitely has a history of more than 1500 yrs. But regarding north Indian languages, I don't have much idea.

M1: why do you think north Indian languages are not classical languages?

Me: I know that there is a language called Prakriti which evolved from Sanskrit. All other languages evolved from that. But I don't really know whether this happened 1500 yrs ago.

(*Looks like the guess mostly worked, there are 6 classical languages they are Telugu, Tamil, Malayalam, Kannada, Sanskrit, Odia*)

M1: Ok do u know about the city which is the reference for IST — Indian standard time

Me: I don't know but I can take a guess

F: Gender and society, okay. What do you think about the MeToo movement?

P: (I was kind of disappointed at and also amused by this question. I mean MeToo, seriously?!) The MeToo movement gave the scope to women to come forward with their stories. It encouraged and empowered them to raise their voices against the injustices, however, we hardly hear about it today. Hence we can say that the movement has died down somewhat.

F: Okay. Which community or sector of women face the most atrocities?

P: Rural household sector, ma'am.

F: So was the movement successful in empowering them?

P: No ma'am. Like I said, before the movement could reach the grassroot levels, it had already died down. This is usual trend of social media as well. It harps on something for a while before another big thing pops up and the attention is diverted towards that.

F: Okay. So you also had religion and Society. Do you think religion is politicized in our nation?

P: Religion is indeed used as a major tool in politics, especially in driving vote banks for a party. (Here, I introduced the example of the Hijab controversy that was unrolling at that time. It hadn't reached a legal aspect and was limited to the Udupi district back then. Gave few pointers on it)

M interrupts here and asks me when the word "Secular" was added to our Constitution.

M: No. You are wrong. Anyway continue.

F asked me a few more questions on religion itself. Kept a very neutral expression throughout.

M comes in now and tells me the history of when the word secular was added.

M: There was another word added to the Constitution along with Secular. What was it?

P: Sir it was Socialist. (I had read about it just before the interview, thank my luck!)

M: So about the hijab issue. Don't you think by having uniforms we are killing the diversity?

P: Sir, what's imperative to note here is the level at which we are while donning uniforms. For school children, I think it is very important for it subtracts all the differentiating factors that might come into play. Having two different school bags, one of a better quality than the other would eventually lead to discrimination among students of the same age and same class level.

M: Okay. So why do the Army personnel wear uniforms?

P: Sir, the army uniform forms a part of the identity of an army officer. It commands a certain level of prestige and respect in the society.

M: So, without the uniform, an army officer has no respect right?

Here he was cross-questioning me at EVERY point, so much that I had to ask him to repeat what he said at least 10 times. I tried to maintain my calm and confidence and was smiling throughout.

Interview: I was the last person to be interviewed in my panel

Interviewers: 2 males (M1 & M2) (both appeared under 40)

M1: How will you rate the students in the GD today – from best to worst?

N: I feel that every one contributed to the discussion and I would not pick anyone as best or worst

M2: We don't want a political answer. You'll have to make decisions after doing MBA. Make a decision now.

N: again iterated that it is not my task to judge students in the GD.

M2: We will end this interview here itself if you don't make a decision.

N: Naturally, I did not want to incur their wrath anymore, so said that my criteria for evaluating would be whoever spoke the most and by that criteria, 2 candidates were the best

M1: So you think that whoever speaks most is the best? By that standard Arnab Goswami is the best. Where did they teach you this? In your coaching?

N: (I'm thinking this is going to be another long and hard day) Sir, the GD process was for 10 min and it is difficult to have a proper discussion in such a short period of time. So, anyone who made 3-4 valid points has done good. (Added that even I made a couple of valid points.)

M2: I think 2-3 people were utter trash. I would not give anyone in this GD more than a 'D' grade. What do you think?

N: Sir, I think that it is a harsh assessment and I would give 'B' instead

M1: Do you follow politics? Which side are you on? Left, Right or Centre?

N: (very reluctantly) Sir, I lean a bit towards the right.

M1: So, you are centre-right. Do you understand what left and right is?

N: sir, left follows socialist ideology which argues for equal distribution of resources...M2 cuts me short

M2: Left ideology is taking away from the wealthy and giving it to the poor.

N: sir, the ideology is that no one is left wanting for basic requirements, but communist ideology is the problem.

M2: You said socialist and now you are saying communist? Do you even know what the difference is?

N: sir, communism is an extreme form of socialism.

M1: Do you know about Ramkrishna Mission? Is it leftist?

N: Sir, I am only aware that Ramkrishna Mission is related to Swami Vivekanand and I don't know much about the mission to make a comment on its ideology.

M1: Ok. What is the relationship b/w Rahul Gandhi and Mahatama Gandhi?

N: sir, they are not blood related.

M1: But they share the same surname. Why?

N: Sir, Rahul gets the surname from Indira Gandhi, and Nehru named Indira as Indira Gandhi. (I was not aware of the history of Indira's husband Feroz Khan, and so felt very foolish after I researched it after the interview)

N: sir, they are sisters-in-law

M2: Ok. Leave all this. Tell us about something which interests you the most?

After 15 minutes , the sheets were collected by the official and we were asked to discuss on the same topic for another 15 minutes.

For those of us whose document verification was still not over were asked to go back and finish it up and for the rest of us , we were asked to wait outside the panel room. Now I had skipped breakfast that morning for the fear of not reaching the center on time and had been feeling hungry af for quite some time. I realized I have enough time before my turn arrives for PI and decided to go out and have some food. As I was having my snacks at a nearby shop, a middle-aged guy entered the shop and asked for a cigarette. I had seen him sitting among the candidates during document verification and decided to start a conversation.

Me: So, is your interview over? How was it?

Him: I’m sorry. I’m here to take the interviews. Good Luck for your interview BTW.

(Bang! My interview day begins)

I came back to my panel wishing not to face that guy again in the interview.

*waited outside the panel room for 30 minutes. I was called in. There were two guys in the panel.

Me: Good Morning

P1: Good Morning Swagato. Please take your seat.

P2: What other calls do you have?

Me: Sir, apart from IIM K, I have got calls from IIM Indore , Shillong and the new IIMs.

P2: No calls from FMS?

Me: No sir. I was not too hopeful about my performance in CAT and hence did not apply for any other B. school exclusively. I applied only for the IIMs. After the results were declared , the deadline for applying was already over by then.

P2: So why Kozhikode?

Me: Sir, I’ve done my schooling from RKM Purulia and Narendrapur. They are among the best schools in Bengal. I graduated from IEST Shibpur, the 2nd oldest engineering college in India and among the best universities in the country. Me: No sir. I can not do that.

P2: Why? If you write it, I shall keep it with me and will guarantee you a seat in IIM K. I shall communicate with the relevant ministry if required and I promise to get you in. Are you willing to give up on IIM K for the club you admire?

Me: Sir, If I write it then I'll be lying to myself. And I don't want to do that.
