2. Easy availability of loans has increased the consumerism of materialistic society. This is affecting the morale of the youth, in longer terms. What are your views on this?

Insights - Interview

Interview time - 20-30 Minutes. (Sometimes as low as 10 mints)

Interview Panel Details - 2 to 3 people (Two Professor and One Alumni, earlier it used to be 3-4 Panellists)

Interview Type - Stress Interview (like Bangalore) (Detailed Interviews check your thorough knowledge of subjects and also on Current Affairs.)

Interview discussion Pointers – (as per IITD experiences of last five years)

- Be completely prepared with anything and everything on the form and in your SOP

- They will go into details of everything you speak about in the interview. (level1- what do you know about Indian Economy level2- what do you think about GST, level3- how has GST affected the sector you work in).
- They ask about current affairs and also about your domain of knowledge.
- It is absolutely fine to ask for time before you answer (they often expect you to think about a solution when they ask you about a problem at hand).
- It is fine if you are anxious and you need not portray a brave face being real with your emotions is better.
- Be prepared to answer everything about your work experience or about your favorite subjects if you are a fresher

Profile: 9/9/8/9 Chemistry, Research, F

Panel 19, 2M, 1 F, Probably just one of them was a Prof (not sure)

Total duration: 20 mins approximately

Personal Interview

Very well spoken, jolly and interested panel

M (somewhat aged): Started with TMAY and follow up questions on North East India (I am from Assam), Assam -Manipur dispute and current scenario, proceeded to Chemistry - acads heavy rapid fire from all across Inorganic, Organic and Physical Chemistry... Luckily could answer all of them...

Next, the generic Why MBA? why in India and not continued in the USA? And consequently many follow-ups on this

They hardly ever interrupted or straightaway dismissed, but rather decently put their differing opinions and sought my opinions in defence

Next, they asked about IIT Kanpur history a bit, and how the education in USA is different that made me choose MBA in India... Questions on those lines...They also asked my JEE rank which I didn't remember, coz I had written several entrances back then and so it was hard to recall and they had a healthy laugh 😊

F: What is the current biggest business news? (told biggest not sure, but most recent one from Economic Times), follow ups on this. The panelist was very supportive and had a smile on her face throughout. Next, she asked about other popular business developments and came to Paytm, Who's the CEO, will changing the leader be enough, etc. Several follow ups and a good discussion. She also asked about my future vision in business and how my big career transition supports that. Ended with some geopolitical and societal impact questions.

Third panelist (M): Started with the chemistry of Cough syrups that I had previously talked about in my motivation for compelling healthcare cases that need business attention. Asked me about a cough syrup critical incident that happened in Africa and my views on it. Went ahead and quizzed me more on Chemistry and luckily I answered all of those again.

Now comes the scary part. He suddenly went like " Iss ladki ko reject karo...Ise kaafi Chemistry aur Research aati hai.. She'll do great there..." And other panelists join in laughing and justifying that I'd be better off there...They noticed the worry and my face and then said chill, we're just kidding, and indirectly appreciated my knowledge of the subject

They then pivoted to the social cause that I was targeting on a large scale through my career transition and shared how Management is different from Activism and it requires a certain position of credibility to make an impact, which still may not be positive. Indirectly telling me that my motivation might not just come to fruition through an MBA. We had an at length discussion on this for the next few minutes about how I acknowledge this and still believe taking a step in the right direction is necessary foremost. Also, I got the idea of why I'd wanna do General Management instead of a specialization, although I am passionate about healthcare in the very long term. They seemed very convinced...

Next, they asked about my extracurriculars. Asked me why no sports involvement, explained. Asked me about my debating stints at state level and seemed quite impressed.

Finally, they asked if I had any questions for them. I asked about any such unconventional transitions that they have already seen and could share. They mentioned a few cases and also gave me some hope 😊

No document verification. Overall, a very supportive and decent experience. Much better than the grilling, uncomfortable ambience in a few other IIM interviews that were hard to defend.

Fingers crossed, let's see. All the best for your interviews!

Interview Experience – 7

March 1, 2020, Morning slot

Venue: - IIT Delhi

Profile: - 95/81/71

CAT-96.95

Economics fresher (still in college).

WAT followed by Documents verification followed by ECA document verification followed by PI. (Well organized process however I was last to be interviewed so it took around 4–5 hrs.)

WAT - Something related to Outsourcing (don't remember precisely).

Wrote well in given 30 minutes. talking about theory of comparative advantage, globalization and also negative aspects like dumping and need to protect domestic industries related it with the colonization.

ECA document verification was pretty interesting as the Prof (who I later found to be an Economics Prof) was an extremely interesting person. Besides checking it, we talked about why Economics, demonetization & then some personal philosophy stuff. It was like a mini-interview of around 15 minutes.

They assign panel immediately, so I had no idea of interviewers. While waiting I had a good chat with a 1st year girl from DMS who was presiding the process to PI. It helped me getting re-energized.

The panel consisted of two females (One prof., One alumnus probably). Let's say F and A. I got inside & greeted both of them. A asks me to sit and has my profile form.

A- so XX, tell me about yourself.

(Finally, in none of my earlier interviews I was asked this question)

Me- I start with my name (about to give well-rehearsed answer)

She interrupts.

A- something that is not in this form.

Me- I talked about my involvement in sports, some achievements and interest in writing on Quora.

A-what is Quora ?

Me- told

A-what do you write?

Told that mostly my experiences, some cross questions like do u write according to audience demand or just whatever you feel like and what's last answer you wrote. I told it depends on the question but mostly what I feel like and told her about my last answer based on a video depicting relationship between human and wild animal & how fear is a controlling factor.

A- Ok so in sports you play hockey. How has hockey shifted through times & what would you like to suggest current Indian hockey team?

Me- talked about era of dhyanchand to shift from grass to turf and then again emerging times of current Indian team with best ranking at current.

A- what changes would you bring to current team?

Me- told that no such change they are doing great and talked about how recently they defeated Australian team.

A- ok who is your hockey role model?

Me- Indian captain Manpreet Singh

Then some questions who. Told about how I can personally relate to him about handling captaincy so well at such young age. Then some comparison between sunilchetri and Manpreet Singh. Then she asked to name some from history...told her about Sardar Singh and Major Dhyanchand...then some discussion on how hard it is to play hockey in contrast to other sports...told her about need of strength in back and knee also how hard it is to run on turf.

A- so why didn't you make a career in hockey?

Me- told her that I wasn't even so good player & also told about game being limited to some stated. She asked me to rate myself as a player..gave a diplomatic answer that it depends on who I am competing with...then asked why hockey is not so popular...told about need of kits that require money & also requirement of rarely available good grounds & also role of media in popularity of a game.

A- Ok Did you take this game because of it being national game?

A very tricky question. thank God, I knew it.

Me- no mam, it's just that I found it interesting & mam hockey isn't even India's national game.

I see the smile on her face.

Then some cross questions on it..how can you say...told that how I had read it on Quora & I further researched to cure my myth about hockey being India's national game.

A- Tell me about your school

Me- being from a Sainik School...told her about the life, aim of the school...then further some questions on its contribution in life...told about unavailability of good schools in Bihar & chance to explore my interests that school provided and personality changes due to boarding school life and some typical stuff.

P(who was politely listening till now)-How old are you XX?

Me-mam around 20.

A looks over my profile and tells a little more than that.

Me-yes mam.

A(laughs and say)- you have a very interesting DOB.

It's 14 Feb.

Me - yes mam, in fact you are the first one to notice in first go.

Both laughed & A said you see we are very observant people.

P- xx have you worked somewhere?

Me- no mam, I am still in college.

P- any internships?

Me- no mam(didn't explain the reason though)

P- ok so since you are Economics student..what is elasticity?

Me- told

P- draw graph.

drew of perfect and imperfect conditions...some cross questions on that...tried to confuse me..but I think I handled.. though you never know.

P- (point to a water bottle kept) what would happen to its demand if I increase the price?

Me- told about no effect water being essential good and also talked the condition if only a particular company shifts the price...then further asked to show in graph...& some really pressure attempts to confuse. Though I held on with my original answer.

A- ok XX at last give me your weakness.

Me- told about my average English communication skill & how I was working upon that...she told it's a made-up weakness...I told her about really fluent speakers of my class.

A- no give me one more weakness.

I thought a little.

Me: - mam probably unable to express my emotions.

A- so what are you overemotional or underemotional?

Me- told about depends on situation sometimes over sometimes under..also talked about an awkward such incident.

A- Ok XX, we are done. Do you have any questions for us?

Me- no mam, Thank you mam.

I left.

Overall, the PI was chill especially Alumnus was very lively and witty. Both were always smiling throughout the process.

Edit 1: - Due to COVID-19 situation they scrapped the weightage of WAT & PI altogether...so this answer hardly makes sense in terms of selection.

Interview Experience – 8

28 Feb 2020

Venue - Vishvakarma Bhawan, IIT Delhi

Shortlisted for IIT Delhi MBA Telecom, IIT Roorkee MBA, ISM Dhanbad

WAT Topic (30 min) - Automation and AI will lead to more job losses or more job creation. Support with examples.

I gave arguments like every new technology face a lot of criticism, only certain type of jobs would be lost and lot of new jobs would be generated like workforce required for maintaining the new automated processes etc. Gave example of Facebook chatbots, who developed a new language to talk to among themselves and FB had to shut it down.

3 panellists - P1 (in 40s), P2 (in 40s), P3 (female, in 40s)

Me - Greeted everyone.

P2 - Looked at me from head to toe and at the way I sat. (*Oh my gosh!*)

P1 (had my application form) - Read aloud to other panellists the details I had filled in. So, you are from NIT. (*Started nodding his head, don't know why!*)

P1 - Which other IIT calls are you having? (*This should be the last question, I was like ki ho gaya kya interview!!*)

ME - IIT Delhi, IIT Roorkee and ISM Dhanbad

P1 - So you received calls from all institutes.

P3 (*stepped in like babu bhaiya suna karo*) - He did not get from IIT madras.

Me - Yes (*I nodded*).

P1 - Tell me something which is not there in the application form.

Me - Sir, apart from my full-time work, I volunteer with numerous startups and help them in their ventures. I work with them to improve my own skills and gain experience of how small companies are making a profit and growing rapidly. (*I named the companies and told them that I am helping them in building an online presence.*)

P3 - You mentioned Fintech. What challenges do you think it faces today?

Me - (*I spoke for like 2 min on this like blah blah blah*) - in short - First is, experienced developers. This technology is slowly gaining recognition and we face a huge shortage of the developers who want to contribute to this field. Second, awareness. People aren't aware that these days they can open a bank account in seconds without visiting bank branches.

P3 - (*Reiterated my points - giving me some time to breathe*) What do you think about the regulation part?

Me - (*mereko feel hua ye apni team mai hai - points btaarahi*). Yeah, regulation is also a big hurdle. Government and big corporates must look into that, the technology they are developing should be for the general good and hack free. Because it is a technology and there would be certainly some people ready to misuse it. So we are in need of highly experienced cybersecurity experts. This again points to my first point of experienced developers.

P3 - Last question and then I will hand over to others. How many times we need to go for KYC? Do you know what KYC is?

Me - Yes, it is Know Your Customer. I think it is required only one time during account opening.

P2 - Haan, bas ek baarskebaad mai account se jo marzikaru!

P2 (*got excited*) - Ok. It is ethically wrong to be involved with multiple organizations. You must be in a written contract that you would not share the company's privacy and resources with anyone. Isn't it wrong?

Me - Sir, I am not in a written contract with these startups. So if my current employer wanted to take a step. He should have some proof that is in writing. But I just do it for the purpose of experience and enhancing my skills. And as far as it is helping me in my objective, I find nothing wrong with it.

P1 - Do they pay you? How much time do you give them?

Me - No sir. I don't charge anything it is just that I want to do something of my own at a later stage in life. I only need that exposure of how things work in the starting small companies and how managers are able to sustain the business for so long. I work for them on weekends for 3–4 hours.

P2 - (*again asked about me being ethically wrong*)

Me - (*answered that legal contract sh*t again*)

P2 - HAHA! That still doesn't answer my question.

P1 - What is your long-term goal?

Me - I want to start something of my own.

P2 - Like what?

Me - I haven't pinpointed things yet.

P2 - When are you going to do it then?
Me - Sir, so far, I had thought it would be in IT.

P2 - You want to remove I from IIT! (jokes)
Everyone laughs! I smiled big
P2 - IT is so big (*using his hand to show how big IT is*). What exactly?
Me - It would be something in FinTech.

Rapid fire round

P2 - Do you know what OTP scam is?
Me - Sorry what OTB?
P2 - OTP? Do you know what OTP is?
Me - One Time Password.
P2 - Do you know what OTP Scam is?
Me - No
P2 - *shocked*

P1 - Blockchain is a technique or technology?
Me - It is a technology.

P2 - Are you sure?
Me - Ummmm. Yes maybe.

P2 - Oh! So you are taking a guess. What is blockchain?
Me - Blockchain has multiple parts. Basically, it is a chain that everyone can see it but nobody can manipulate it.

P2 - Is it a technique or technology? (again)
Me - I'm not sure sir.

P2 - What is your hobby?
Me - *thinking*

P2 - You are thinking now and you will manipulate your answer.
Me - No sir. I do not have one hobby. Actually, I saw this video of TEDx talk - "Passion is a feeling and it keeps on changing". Like earlier I used to write and listen to poetry, then I was also into making Puns and these days I am exploring about mystical sciences.

P3 - *looked amazed*
P1 - So you have multiple hobbies.
P3 - Ok Hitesh, we are done.
Me - Thank you. It was nice talking to you. I wish you have a great day.

P3 - You too dear. (She was such a pleasing personality)

Verdict - awaited (at the time of writing) but finally converted

Interview Experience – 9

14 March, 2020

Location- IIT Madras

Interviewing for- IIT Madras and IIT Delhi

Profile:

10/12/grad- 92/98/80

Commerce student, fresher

Cat - 96.71

The reporting time was 12:30 but the process started only around 1:30. They made us sign the attendance sheet and briefed us about the process. We were given our panel numbers. I was on the last panel, panel 12, and I was the first candidate in my panel. We first went for WAT.

WAT topic- *In this era of incubation and start-ups how will you evaluate the potential of a business idea prior to investment?*

300 words in 30 minutes. The WAT I was used to was usually around 15 minutes so here I had plenty of time to structure my thoughts roughly before writing the actual essay. Topic is fairly okay too. Wrote about the importance of longevity, it should not become redundant in the face of changing technology etc. I veered off topic a little but I think I brought it back in the end.

After the WAT , we had a 10 minute tea break. The first few people in each panel were called for the interviews and the others were called for document verification. Since I was first in my panel I was called after 3 pm and the whole interview lasted probably 15–20 minutes.

There were two interviewers, M1 and M2. M2 is a finance professor. I'm not sure who M1 is; I couldn't find him on the faculty page.

M1– how are you feeling?

I feel good.

M2-You're in your final year of college, what's the hurry? Why do you want to do an MBA right away?
Told.

M2-But don't you think you'll be at a disadvantage against those with work experience?

Said something about how I've been wanting to do this since the 11th grade, unlike a lot of engineers who do it cos they can't find a job.

M1-Why are there so many engineers trying to pursue an MBA? Are they better managers?

Said it depends on the person and the educational background is not indicative of their managerial skills.

M2- you have really high marks in 12th . Did you get a state rank?

No, actually the state rank was much higher.

M1-What are some of the subjects you've learnt in college?

Mentioned a few, including financial management.

M1-Have you heard of IRR, NPV and payback period?

Yes. Would you like me to explain each of them?

M1-Compare them.

Compared.

M1-So which do you think is more widely used?

Said NPV cos it gives the amount. Payback period is not very useful.

M1-But I've heard that payback period is more widely used?

Maybe it is, but it can't be used alone as it is merely a time period and gives no indication of profit.

M1-What could be the benefit of using payback period?

Helpful to promoters to estimate when they can see returns, same for investors.

M2-Do you read the newspaper?

Yes (lie. Dreading what's to come)

M2-Which part do you focus on?

Umm, business probably. (Actually I focus on Instagram when I'm supposed to be reading the paper, hehe)

M2-What is the monetary policy?

Told

M2-How often is it drafted?

I'm not sure

M2-What is the economic survey?

Told

M2-Who publishes it?

Idk

M2- who is the commerce minister?

Can't recall

M2-Name any female minister other than the finance minister.

Thought for a long time and said Maneka Gandhi.

M2- Really? What is she in charge of?

Women and child welfare

M2-Are you sure?

Actually, I think I might be confusing it with the 2014 government. I'm not sure.

M2-Name the finance minister of Tamilnadu

Idk

M2-Name a female minister in Tamilnadu.

Idk

At this point, M2 gave me a piece of paper and a pencil and asked me to draw a square of 25 square units. I drew it and he asked me to mark the length of each side. He then asked me to draw a figure of the same area with a larger perimeter. I drew a circle and did some random calculations. I really had no idea what to do and he told me that I was taking too long. After a few seconds he asked me to stop and said it's okay.

M1-What are some other subjects you learnt in college?

Mentioned marketing.

M1-Oh really? What did you learn?

Mentioned the 4 P's.

M1-What are they?

Answered. Mentioned there are actually 7 but we learnt only 4.

M1-why do you think they had to incorporate 3 more P's?

Mentioned how business is changing blah blah, so probably for that.

M1-What is the difference between manufacturing and service industry?

Told

M1-Give example.

Any car company is a manufacturer but ola, uber etc provide a service.

M1-What will happen if the automobile industry stops providing after sales service?

Said I'm sure someone will surely use the opportunity to start a business for the same. They laughed.

Said thank you and left.
