Interview discussion Pointers – (as per SJMSOM experiences of last five years)

- Be completely prepared with anything and everything on the form.
- They will go into details of everything you speak about in the interview. (level1- what do you know about Indian Economy, level2- what do you think about GST, level3- how has GST affected the sector you work in).
- They can ask about your hobbies and interests.
- It is absolutely fine to ask for time before you answer (they often expect you to think about a solution when they ask you about a problem at hand).
- It is fine if you are anxious and you need not portray a brave face being real with your emotions is better.
- Be prepared to answer everything about you work experience or about your favourite subjects if you are a fresher.

Interview Experience – 14

Profile: GEM Electrical Engineering, Jadavpur University & 4 months' work-ex

At first there was this introduction about SJMSOM by the first year students of SJMSOM.

This was followed by WAT (200 - 250 words max) and Summarising of a given passage(max 3 sentences and 50 words) each carrying 5 marks and total time given for both being 30 minutes.

This followed document verification. Take xerox copies of all the documents self-attested. Also, take a xerox copy of your identity proof.

PI: 2 profs, 1 was SJMSOM prof. who teaches Management of Technology and another was some prof. from another department. They made me very comfortable. Asked me to introduce myself and then my strengths and it's real life example, why SJMSOM?, some questions related to industrial training I did like how much grid connected power is there in India, capacity of a generator, efficiency of power plant, what is the problem which power sector in India, what steps can be taken to improve. And then some questions related to final year project I did. That's it! It was very decent interview.

Suggestions: Know everything that is related to your project, industrial training and any other certificates you will be giving in the file. They were just looking one certificate after the other and asking questions. Nothing that was not related to the file.

Interview Experience – 15

Ma'am: What is it that you do...you have written something about analysing issues and all....explained

Sir: What is your domain of work?...told

Ma'am: What is your approach to solving these issues?...told

Ma'am: Gave a question on probability?...Solved

Ma'am: What is the difference between mutually exclusive and independent? Got a bit confused here with my explanation but tried giving an example...

Ma'am: Drew a leaf and asked to find out the approx. area of the figure?...Solved

Ma'am: What are your hobbies?...told

Ma'am: Last book that you read?...told

Ma'am: What do you think about AAP?...gave them my opinion.

Ma'am: Asked sir if he has any question.

It took around 10 minutes.

They were smiling and all and were very calm but they didn't ask much.

I don't know what to make out of it.

Interview Experience – 16

There were 2 professors in the interview.

Prof 2: So, you come from the Shipping industry. But let's start with you. Tell us about yourself

I've talked about my schooling, college, job (2.5 years of work ex) and why I want to do an MBA now.

Prof 1: Hmm. So, what do you want to do after you finish your MBA?

I've told him honestly that I am not set in stone and open for options, but probably more into operations since I've been working in that field.

Prof 2: Okay. You've come from Andhra Pradesh. Tell me about the demographics of Telangana and Seem Andhra.

Explained the population density of parts of Seem Andhra, Hyderabad, Telangana in general. Talked about the area size comparing with the state of Tamil Nadu.

Prof 1: What are the no. of Lok Sabha seats in undivided AP? Told.

Prof 1: So how many seats are they going to be in Telangana and Seem Andhra? Explained how the no. of constituencies stress more on population than area, and derived a rough figure. (They seem to be satisfied)

Prof 2: Tell me about your job profile. Told. (Prof 1 left.)

Prof 2: Tell be about your company and why it is in shipping.

Explained the group's founding years, it's assets value. Also told why it is in the shipping business. (Prof 1 came back)

Prof 1: Tell me about Shipping industry. How is Pipavav yard doing?

Told. Explained the Chinese strength and how Indian yards in general is doing. Threw some numbers.

Prof 2: Let's say you are the finance minister of this country, and you want to increase the GDP. What would you do? Take your time, jot down points and explain how they would impact on the GDP..

Talked about opening up the economy – FDI/FII investments – increase in the GDP.

Discussed the misplaced subsidies. Stressed that subsidies are good, but they shouldn't be bleeding. Will ask the respective ministries to come up with decent methods to prevent the pilferage – Less fiscal deficit – sign of good economy.

Empower the institutions. Like the courts, ECI, CBI, RBI to be more independent and implement the rule of the land. Prof 1 pitched in and said, 'what about CAG, Lokpal'. Told them they should also be part of it. This will increase the faith for the investors that the country is safe and reliable.

Prof 2: I want to see immediate growth. What would you say to the RBI being a Fin Min?

Told about how Rajan refused to decrease the interest rates despite the Chidambaram's insistence. Probably will ask the RBI to lower the interest rates to increase the liquidity and will boost growth.

Both of them were smiling and said the interview was over! 10 minutes max! It was very casual. One of the prof is the HoD.

Panel: Therefore, our interview panel had 4 panellists: (P1 to P4)

P1: Alumni

P2: IIT-Bombay Civil engineering professor

P3: Alumni

P4: Finance professor at SJMSOM

Interview

P1: Tell me about yourself?

Me: Told

P2: Tell me about your final year project?

Me: Sir, I don't remember much, but it was around the structural modelling of a Dam.

P2: Ok, so tell me about the various forces dam has to resist?

Me: (thought for a while) sir stress, and tensions, bending moment (don't know what I was saying), Sir force exerted by the water

P2: You mean hydrostatic force?

Me: Yes Sir

P2: What is the force profile

Me: Sir, it will increase proportionally with the height

Why?

Me: Sir force profile is in the shape of a triangle, so the centre of the area is at that height.

P2: Dam modelling based on the stress model or the strain model?

Me: (no clue) sir, stress-based

P2: No it is strain-based, no problem

P3: Your biggest failure and learning from it?

Me: Sir, we call it spreads

P2: Basis?

Me: Sir spot vs future is the basis, but the difference b/w two future prices are spread

P2: OK

P4: Tell me 2 differences b/w futures and options

Me: told

P4: Do you know the valuation for futures?

Me: told

P4: Different types of derivatives trading in Indian markets

Me: Commodities derivatives on MCX and stock derivatives on NSE/BSE, both futures and options
