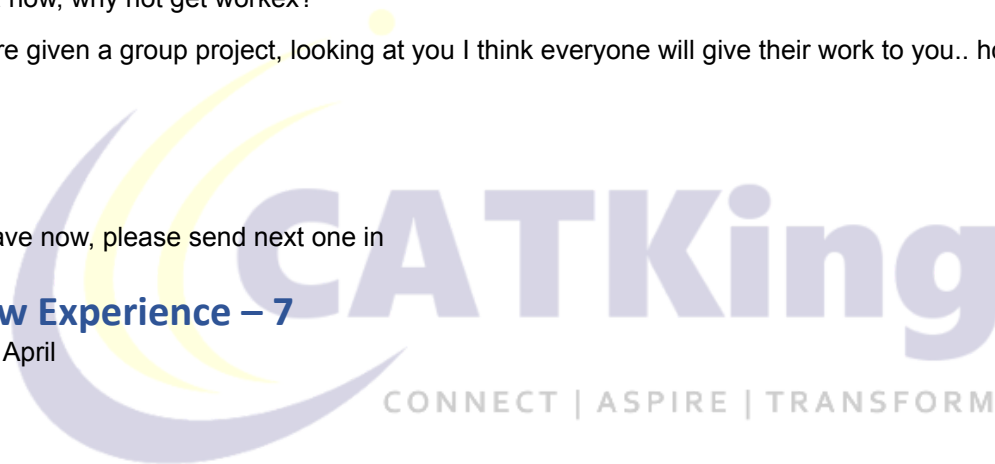

f: so, xx, there are many people who spell or write your name as "xx" rather than "xx". why do you think it happens and reasons on that?

(I was struck for a moment. this is the first time I have been asked such kind of question)
tried to put up some random statements and answered it

f : what do you do in your free time

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mentioned my hobbies

f: you are interested in magic, or you can perform it?

told I can perform

f: can you do it now? can you show us any trick?

performed a card magic trick and they were impressed

f: in which field do you want to pursue your MBA?

told that currently I have no specific idea on that, and I will consider it later

f : but you seems good in marketing, why don't you pursue it

gave some reasons on marketing

f&m: it was good talking to you. you may leave now

exchanged pleasantries and left the meeting

After brief document verification, the process started.

GD/WAT Topic: Privatization leads to lesser corruption

Topic was not that difficult keeping in mind that the Nirav Modi scandal had just been exposed.

WHAT went average considering everyone almost had related the topic to the Nirav Modi scandal.

Pitched in 4–5 times (though wanted to but could not start the GD) with relevant points concerning privatization in Aviation, Telecom and banking sector and how private banks were having lesser corruption (Chanda kochchar ICICI probe started later). At some places where I could not find relevant points, I tried to moderate the GD by switching the sectors and finally bringing everyone to conclusion since all 11 candidates were in the favor of motion.

Out of 11 candidates in my panel, I was the last one to be interviewed.

The panel consisted of one male professor (later came out to be the Chairperson of FPM programme, let's call him **M**) and one female professor (let's call her **F**). Both seemed quite experienced and senior in designation. After some time the interview started.

Me (after entering): Good Morning Sir/Ma'am

M: Good Afternoon...!!! (Poker Face since it was 12:40pm)

Me: Sorry Sir, Good Afternoon...!!

M: Oh! Actually you came early in the morning and had to wait quite a long time..Don't worry..So Prashant Tell us something about yourself.

Me: Narrated the cliched sentences which I had repeated in the previous interviews.

M: So you work in Mahindra R&D! That's pretty worth it! So, you don't love your job?

Me: I do, in fact, a lot but would like to have a jump in my career and....blah blah blah!!

M: So tell me something about your specific role in your organization and your package.

Me: Explained.

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P1: What is the problem in remaining silent? It's better to keep quiet rather than say something that doesn't make sense right?

Me: No sir, I mean I noticed that he had something to say, but he didn't try hard enough.

P1: Alright, so you have been working in XXXX now..what did you do for 2 years after college?

Me: Yes sir, I am working for my family business right now. For 2 years previously, I worked with Evalueserve in Gurgaon.

P1: So what is your role in your current organization?

Group Discussion and Writing Ability Testing Topic:

We were asked to write the essay first. The ask was for a 200 word essay and the time given was 15 mins. It passed in a jiffy.

Immediately after the essay was done, they asked us to start the GD process. It was a batch of 10. From all my experiences in GD, this was one of the best GD that was ever conducted. Almost everybody had valid points. I knew slightly less about the topic so took on a more generic approach and used personal anecdotes from my hometown to my advantage. Others had a lot more data to back their points up. Overall a very good GD with every member contributing.

Personal Interview:

I was the first in the batch. Two female panelists. One was a marketing professor and the other was a professor in Organizational Behavior. I searched for their profiles post the interview process. Let's call them **F1** and **F2** respectively.

Me: *“Good Morning Mom. Happy Women's Day.”*

F2: *“Happy Women's Day to you too. It is important to wish men a happy Women's Day too.”*

Me: *“Absolutely mam.”*

F1: *“So Samrat. We know something about you. Tell us something else.”*

Me: *“Mam. We could talk about my work experience. Started with the well rehearsed bit of my work experience.”*

F1: *“So as you said, in two three years time you will be a manager. Why do you want to be part of an MBA institute?”*

Me: *“Mam it won't happen so quickly.”*

F1: *“Oh!. Is that why you want to join?”*

Me: *“No mam. The reason I want to join is that on-the-job learning has gaps in between. For example I was in a meeting with one of the Brand Managers of the company I worked in and she used a term called CRM. Now in the entirety of the meeting I had no idea what CRM meant. It was only after the meeting was over that I knew what CRM was.”*

F1: *“Perhaps if you knew what CRM meant you could have told them that we have moved on from CRM and developed far better strategies.”*

Me: *“Perhaps. But I think given the product that she was talking about, CRM was important. Because of the IMS Act, companies are not allowed to communicate with mothers when their child is in the age bracket 0–2. Thus, it becomes important to acquire the customer at a much earlier stage. Hence CRM.”* (Something related to my profile)

F1: *“So what subjects did you have in UG?”*

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Me: "Oh man so many of them. Thermodynamics, Strength of Materials, Heat and Mass transfer, Reliability Engineering, Operations Research etc."

F1: "And which was your favorite subject?"

Me: "Mam there was a subject called Foundation skills in Integrated Product Development. In that subject, they taught us about various topics that were handy in my job. Topics like PESTEL analysis, SWOT analysis, Rapid prototyping, Laminar object Modelling etc were taught in that subject."

F1: "What is PESTEL Analysis?"

Me: "Mam. Pestel stands for Political, Social, Economical.."

F1: "Okay Okay!"

F2: "So Samrat, you were a Mechanical engineer. Then you joined Infosys and then Digital Marketing? Why this unusual path? This is not a natural career progression."

Me: "Yes Mam. Initially I was not interested in IT. But given the dearth of options after graduation, I thought of joining. I gave it a whole-hearted effort but just couldn't get myself to feel good about the work I was doing. Thought what is closest to where I think I would want to be and so I joined advertising....."(thinking of starting with my prepared answers on this)

F2: "No but in a single line. Why do you join advertising?"

Me: "Mam because I believe modern day managers need to be analytical and creative both... (cuts me)"

F2: "But is it really required? Your manager will be standing on your head saying where are the numbers? Where are the sales?"

Me: "Yes mam. I know that is true, but I think in the long run in positions of authority, you will be required to also decide the communication that you decide for your brand. Having worked closely with brand managers in an FMCG major, I know how important the brand managers inputs are and those require creative abilities."

F2: "Okay! So Samrat you are interested in FMCG is it?"

Me: "Yes mam."

F2: "What do you think about the ethics being followed by the FMCG companies?"

Me: "Mam, I think none of the companies do anything illegal and they are always compliant with the law of the land."

F2: "But Ethics and legal are different right?"

Me: "Mam, I have thought of this issue and it is difficult for me to have an exact answer to this. But for example if we talk about cigarettes, I would not blame the people working in the organisations for it. Some part of the blame or rather most part goes to the consumers who create the demand."

F2: "But let's not talk about cigarettes, let's talk about shower gels and the beads they contain. These beads are harmful for the environment. How do you feel about this?"

Me: (Very Uncomfortable) "Mam. It is a very difficult choice for me to make but if given a chance I would not like to work for an organisation or a product like this. I have thought about this a lot but haven't been able to get a clear answer."

F2: "At least you are thinking about it. Sometimes decisions like these are a lot to handle for young boys like you. But good that you are actually thinking about it. Okay. Thank you Samrat!"

Me: "Thank you Mom."

Felt it was a strong interview and an average GDPI. Was quite happy with the overall process. It started at 9 and I was back home before 10: 30.(Perks of staying 10 minutes away from the campus). Turned out to be my best interview in the entire season.

(Took a different stand and talked about how finding ways to tackle the root cause of corruption such as lack of incentives at the workplace, meritocracy being awarded might be a good spin on legalising extra pay, which would not be corruption in its essence and may help in demolishing it in the longer run. Also talked about the role of greed in facilitating such practices and took the example of Indian railways implementing high price tickets for last minute bookings and providing lucrative incentives to ticket checkers to not indulge in illegal practices.)

Group Discussion: I started the GD and kept speaking for about 45 seconds (internally screaming for someone to stop me). Finally stopped on my own, decided to put forth an order to address our points and give the discussion a chance to be fruitful. I admit to having questioned various individuals during the discussion on extremist views, borderline dismissing their views (which is very very WRONG) but I felt they were swaying the table with politicians like promises so I had to do it.

I tried to keep the table focussed and on track, gave everyone a chance to speak if they hadn't already and concluded the GD too (because no one did)

I knew this would come back to bite me in the ass, but my experience of working with much-experienced professionals gave me the implicit responsibility to ensure the table was going in the right direction.

I managed to write about both the sides, the pros and cons, and later justified them.

Next was PI. I was the 3rd in my panel. There were two panelists, one male (M) and the other female (F).

M : Tell me about yourself.

Me : Narrated my well prepared answer.

M : So, you are a computer science engineer. Tell me something about DNS ?

Me : Answered.

M : Tell me the difference between (DoH) and (DoT)

Me : I do not know, Sir. (M told about DNS over HTTPS and DNS over TLS). Told that I will definitely read about them.

M : Okay, your hobby is photography. What kind of photography do you prefer ?

Me : Nature and portraits, Sir.

M : Okay, so where do you click these photographs ? Tell me something about them.

Me : Told.

M : Okay, what is Mamata doing to bring more members of her party to the parliament ?

Me : (A bit confused). Told about a few specific things Mamata was doing in our state.

M : (Realizing I was beating around the bush), Okay, tell me what is Mamata doing, in general ?

The process started with document verification and then we were allotted our panels.

WAT : Are digital payments secure enough for the Indian economy to go completely cashless?

GD : Everyone got a chance to speak and it played a big role in everyone's interview.

Few points before I share my PI experience:

The issue of policy making was raised and I mentioned Basel norms to indicate that policies exist (Yes we deviated a bit from the topic for a brief period of time)

I also mentioned the problem of Double Spending in the online transactions (The rise of crypto currencies as well)

Towards the end of the GD all of us were asked to summarise the discussion by the panelists and I concluded that after the discussion I have reconsidered my views and I feel there are still a few challenges which needs to be addressed before we can go completely cashless (I had concluded completely opposite in my WAY).

PI:

P1 - Briefly tell us about yourself.

Ans - Gave the prepared answer.

L1 - What made you change your opinion after the discussion?

Ans - (I was 3rd to be called in for the interview so I was prepared for explaining my stand in the GD) My answer revolved around the points which other's put forward and how that made me re-consider some aspects to that Indian economy to reach this conclusion.

P1 - (While nodding to my previous answer) You mentioned Basel Norms during the discussion, What do you know about it?

Ans - (This was like a dream come true) I was prepared with the answer. Explained the history, idea behind it and India's compliance goal.

P1 - What do you mean by CAR?

Ans - Told them about Capital Adequacy Ratio and its relation to the Basel Norms.

P1 - Ok, suppose you are the decision maker of a company and you have to make a decision based on the current macroeconomic trends, what will you do ?

Ans - (This was an open ended question where I was allowed to choose my own variables, exactly the kind of question i like) Although it's very difficult to answer as I am not very well versed with macro economics but I can take a small example of RBI increasing the Repo rate (in vacuum). If that happens, I will put a hold on the recruitment process.

P1 - Explain.

Ans - Increased repo rate indicates that the government wants to take the money away from the economy which means that the cost of lending will increase. This will result in less development initiatives taken up by firms and may result in less business than the company projected for this year. As the recruitment is done based on the projection, I will probably put a hold on that process.

P1 and L1 nodded.

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L1 - So, you must be planning to take up financial jobs post MBA?

Ans - No ma'am, I am interested in Strategy and will probably look for a job in that area (In the hindsight, I should have gone with the finance story as my whole interview was based on it)

Actual me: started talking got interrupted in between. (Good for me because I didn't know a bit about it)

Me- Yes sir, it is possible to convert one element to another but it is restricted only to a few elements.

M1: Tell me is it possible to convert elements to gold? Hypothetically tell me is it possible?

Me: Yes sir, hypothetically, it is possible.

Then he completed the statement practically it is not possible practically because it would require hell lot of energy which is impractical right now.

I believe this is a wrong answer. There would be inflation but it would be very less almost negligible.

Here, he asked about e-commerce. Like, can an industry be completed online? I really messed this part.

Over to M2 now
